On behalf of the Gargi family – its principal, eminent faculty members, its dear students and the nonacademic staff, I extend a warm welcome to all of you on this august occasion of the 39th Gargi College Day.

We are indeed fortunate to have with us as chief guest, Shri Subir Raha, the highly acclaimed head of a very vital sector, the oil industry. Shri Raha brings to his position a vast experience and brilliant qualifications. He obtained an Engineering degree in Electronics and Telecommunications from Jadavpur University, where he was adjudged the best All Rounder Graduate of the entire university. He then went on to get an MBA degree with distinction from Leeds and is also now an alumnus of the Administrative Staff College at Henley, UK. He joined the Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. and subsequently became a Director on its Board. At about this time he created and managed several alliances and joint ventures of IOCL and the Indian Oil Foundation, to preserve, protect and promote the archaeological heritage of India. While on deputation with the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas as Head of the Oil Coordination Committee, he managed national and gas logistics and worked on deregulation of the Oil and Gas industry. He is now, apart from CMD of ONGC, also Chairman of ONGC Videsh Ltd. He is a recipient of numerous awards, among them being the SCOPE Award for Excellence and Outstanding Contribution to Public Sector Management, Chairman of the Year 2003 by the Business Baron magazine and V. Krishnamurthy Award for

ONGC, with market capitalization of over 21.54 billion US dollars is ranked as the most valuable company in India. Shri Raha has been much in the news lately for arranging new foreign collaborations. Sir, we are looking forward to your address and to your valuable guidance to our students for achieving individual success as well as for contributing to nation-building.

We are proud to have as our Guest of Honour, a great woman achiever, Justice Leila Seth, who has numerous firsts to her credit. She stood first in the Bar Final Examination of Lincoln's Inn in the UK and was awarded the Langdon Medal, the first woman to be so honoured. After an illustrious career as a lawyer in Patna. Calcutta and Delhi High Courts and subsequently in the Supreme Court of India, she became the first woman judge of Delhi High Court and then Chief Justice of Himachal Pradesh, again the first woman to reach the rank of Chief Justice of a High Court in India. She has served in several Commissions and has been involved in issues ranging from medical facilities for prisoners, primary education and crimes against women, to name just a few. She has also served as a Trustee in World Wild Life Fund. As would be expected, she is a recipient of numerous awards such as the Living Legends for Law by the International Bar Association, V.V. Giri National Award for outstanding contribution in the Field of Legal Aid, the 50th Year of India's Independence Woman's Award from the Ph.D. Chamber of Commerce and Industry for outstanding achievement in her profession and Inner Flame Award from Full Circle. Though retired from the bar, she continues to lead an active life, by serving as member/advisor in Boards of several institutions and through participation in international seminars. And of course not surprisingly, she produced Vikram Seth!

Gargi College is lucky to have as Chairman of its Governing Body this year, Professor Nargis Panchapakesan, a former Dean, Faculty of Education and Head, Department of Education of Delhi University. Interestingly, her post-graduate degree obtained from Delhi University was in Physics, which she taught at the undergraduate level here and in the USA. Perhaps a commitment to education, and that too at the grass root level, motivated her to switch focus, for she engaged successfully in doctoral work in Education at the University of Chicago. Thereafter, at Delhi University, she was associated with the conception and implementation of the graduate programme in Elementary Education. She has consulted with various governmental and non-governmental organizations, particularly in the area of evaluation. We at Gargi College look forward to being guided and inspired by this warm, soft-spoken, poised and yet highly principled personality.

And now, before I present the report of Gargi College for March '04 – February '05, I must place on record that the achievements of the year were all under the leadership of my worthy and dynamic predecessor, **Dr. Hema V. Raghavan**, who relinquished her post after a glorious stint of 12 years. I have had the honour of taking over as Principal of this prestigious institution only five weeks ago.

I therefore, stand before you today in a uniquely paradoxical role – an impressed observer listening to another's success story, but at the same time, a presenter of that story with a passionate sense of belonging.

#### **GARGI'S PRIDE**

The year, 2004-05, shows a fine record of performance by Gargi students in all areas of education.

#### Academics

Gargi college offers 17 academic disciplines in four streams: Humanities & Social Studies, Sciences, Commerce and Elementary Education. 13 of them offer Honours programmes. A total of 2,052 students appeared for university examinations in 2004. 39 students procured university positions and 713 were placed in first divisions. Out of these, four students are Delhi University 1st position holders. Many courses had a hundred percent pass result. Coursewise details along with a roll of honour, are presented in the latter part of this report.

#### Sports

Nivanthee Jayaraj Applied Psychology (H) 2nd yr. was declared the Best Woman Player of Delhi in the 3rd International Open Chess Tournament and obtained 17th rank in the World Inter-varsity Chess Championships held at Kuala Lumpur. Our chess team emerged winners in the first Gargi Inter-college Chess tournament.

At the D. U. Athletics Championship Puneeta Kapur B.Sc. G.A. 1st yr. bagged the silver medals in Shotput and Discus throw. She obtained gold medal in Discus throw and silver medal in Shotput at the Northern Railway Sports meet. Saraswati B.A.(P) 2nd yr. represented DU in the Inter-varsity Athletics championship and in the Delhi State Rugby Team, which won in Rugby Nationals at Aurangabad.

Disha Pannu B.A.(P) 3rd yr. represented Haryana state in the prestigious Rani Jhansi Cricket Tournament and in the Senior North Zone Inter state cricket tournament. The Gargi team were finalists in the inter-college cricket championship. The final match is scheduled for 2nd March '05.

Archana Dahiya B.A.(P) 3rd yr. represented Delhi University and Delhi State for the Senior North Zone Inter-State and Senior National Cricket Championships.

Meetu Tanwar B.Sc. 'G' B2 3rd yr. and Laxmi B.A.(P) 3rd yr. also represented Delhi University in Inter-varsity Cricket Championship.

Renu Sharma B.A.(P) 2nd yr. and Swati Monga B.Com.(P) 3rd yr. were gold and bronze medal winners respectively in the D.U. inter college Judo tournament. Renu Sharma also represented D.U. in the Inter varsity Judo championship. Asha Rani B.A.(P) 3rd yr., Nidhi Mathur B.Com.(P) 3rd yr. and Shama Parveen B.A.(P) 2nd yr. represented the Delhi State in the Women National Tennis Championship and the latter two at the National Softball Tennis Championship held at Jammu. The Gargi tennis team was placed third in the D.U. inter-college tennis tournament.

#### **Extra-Curricular Activities**

Varna Sri Raman Philosophy (H) 3rd yr. reached the finals of the Young Visionary Award Debate competition and has been awarded a scholarship with the UN for the same. The English Debating Society were invited to the National Law School Inter-college Debate where 2

speakers Varna Sri Raman and Chitrangada Kapoor from the team were among the top 10 speakers. Huma S. Quereshi was among the chief adjudicators.

The Debating team was also invited to the GIKI Parliamentary Debate in Pakistan for the first time.

The Dramatics society *Upstage* produced an in-house collage play which comprised 9 playlets for which they received awards in the Best Director and Best Production category and Best Actor category for one of the actors in the *Mahindra Old World Theatre Festival* at India Habitat Centre. They were invited to perform at a number of other venues viz: Thespo Theatre Festival in Bangalore, British Council's Beyond Borders Cultural Festival and Kirori Mal College's Theatre Festival.

The other student extra-curricular societies like Choreography Society, Sparx; Indian Music Society, Samaranjini; Indian Folk Dance Society, Street Play Society, Kshitij; Western Music Society, Hindi Debating Society, Quiz Society, Quizzito ergo sum; Fine Arts Society, Hues; have been participating in competitions, winning laurels and functioning vibrantly throughout the year. The details are given in the latter pages of this report.

Some of them engage in independent research or produce scholastic papers and a list of their accomplishments in the year have been listed in this report. For paucity of time, I am obliged to mention only a few here.

I extend my felicitations to all my colleagues for their brilliant achievements and for their dedication not only to teaching, but also towards taking additional responsibilities of academic management.

#### CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT

During the year a number of seminars and workshops were conducted by the different departmental associations, which are listed in the latter pages of this report. I present a few highlights:

- A Seminar on Education: Commodity or Commitment was organized by the Commerce Department
- A Panel Discussion on Expression in Art: Personal or Propagandist, organized by Philosophy Association
- Chemistry (H) students attended a 3-days National Seminar on Recent Trends in Chemistry as well as a National Symposium on Emerging Areas of Forensic Science.
- Physics students participated in a Workshop on Design Production at IIT.
- Political Science department scheduled a number of lectures with topics ranging from Disarmament to Communalism to India's neighbours.
- A bilingual newsletter Demos was commenced this year by the Political Science Department.

These programmes not only reinforce classroom teaching, but they give students the opportunity to engage in research, acquire confidence in public speaking and learn organizational and managerial skills as well.

# **GARGI'S USP: VALUE ADDITIONS**

# Centre with Potential for Excellence

The college was identified as a centre with potential for excellence and was awarded a special grant this year by the University Grants Commission to realise its potential. The proposal for utilization of this grant includes independent researches in science, deployment of advanced technology to upgrade teaching methods and reaching out to the community through programmes in women empowerment, mental well-being and for enhancement of the standard of elementary education. The salient projects are as under:

- Botany: Upgradation of laboratory to enable tissue culture and the determination of regenerative capacity of selected species.
- Chemistry: Training of students on laboratory waste management and innovation in the area of green chemistry by researching in alternate eco-friendly methods of inorganic qualitative analysis.

- Commerce: Distance Education in Management of Financial Services to be offered concurrent to the regular curriculum for students of Gargi and others. Efforts are on to conduct these through V-Sat virtual classrooms, beamed from a recognised university outside Delhi, which will include the provision for student-teacher interaction through technology.
- Elementary Education: Setting up of a curriculum lab and research centre. Efforts are on to create a web portal, which would facilitate interaction with students and trained teachers in this field, and with schools far and wide, to upgrade the standards of elementary education.
- Microbiology: Upgradation of laboratory through the use of software and apparatuses like fluorescent lamps and refrigerated microfuge to facilitate DNA isolation, electrophoresis and viewing of gels.
- Physics: Setting up of a computational biophysics lab to study biological systems, use of RF generator for electronic projects and to study pulse coded and pulse amplitude modulations.
- Psychology: To set up a psychology lab which will harness advanced tests to promote mental well-being in youth, and developing their cognitive skills for application to the community at large.
- Women's Development Centre: To conduct workshops and conferences and establish e-connectivity with activist groups to promote gender studies and women empowerment.
- Zoology: Setting up of a biomedical research centre to study cell culture.

We are considering the possibility of raising a multi-disciplinary research wing to house the projects listed above. A computer laboratory is in the process of being established.

# **Facilitating Career Options and Placement**

A feature that has given Gargi College the hallmark of an institute with a storehouse of opportunities is its Add-on Courses.

Short, introductory courses are offered after college hours, which serve as guided directions for students in further specializations and career options. Courses run successfully this year are:

- A Foundation Course in Chartered Accountancy
- Media Studies and Production
- Travel and Tourism Management
- German Language
- Advertising and Marketing Communications
- Indian Culture through Sanskrit Sources
- Certificate Course in Survey Research
- Heritage Appreciation and Management
- Environment and Development: Towards Sustainability
- Globalization Knowledge programmes conducted by EMPI

These courses are open to students outside Gargi as well. They illustrate the commitment of the management to maximizing the use of building space and other machinery.

Apart from these courses the college engages actively in providing placement for all students and particularly for the final year students of Elementary Education. Various organizations and institutes are invited from time to time to make presentations regarding the opportunities they provide for careers and specializations, as well as to conduct interviews.

# **BUILDING SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY**

The college recognizes the importance of making its young adults aware of the vast diversity and disparities in their social environment. It offers forums for debate and discussions and avenues for social service.

# Gargi Extension Service

This NSS wing of the college undertakes several service projects. Highlights of this year's activities include:

- A blood donation camp, which drew a record number of over 100 donors
- A workshop on child sexual abuse in collaboration with the NGO Rahi

- A pin-wheel campaign for CRY
- Diwali NGO crafts mela
- The last activity on the anvil is Our Friendship Day on 11th March, for which inmates of old age homes and underprivileged children will be invited to the college.

# Women's Development Centre

The center has contributed significantly to increasing awareness on social issues among the students. Key activities organized during the year include:

- A street play on gender issues
- A workshop on sexuality and human rights
- A self-defence workshop
- Workshop on Sexual harassment and related issues
- Campaign for Tsunami relief
- Annual Crafts Mela
- Introduction of a Wall Magazine
- Music Workshop to arouse social awareness

#### **National Cadet Corps**

A fully functional NCC unit in the college trains students in discipline and leadership skills. This unit conducts classes on:

- First aid
- Communication skills
- Target practice
- Use of conventional symbols

2 cadets represented the Delhi State contingent at the Republic Day Parade this year. Jyoti Mishra B.Com(P) 2nd yr. has been selected for a Youth Exchange Programme with selected countries. Neha Bagga B.A.(P) 3rd yr. represented the Indian Contingent during the Republic Day Parade.

## TOWARDS A HEALTHIER GARGI

The College has employed the services of a qualified doctor, on a part-time and a nurse on a full-time basis, housed in a well-equipped medical room. Regular checkups are conducted class-wise. Two students detected of cardiac ailments were reported to their parents and timely surgery/intervention has saved the lives of these girls.

### **GARGI GOES HI-TECH**

Gargi is one of the pioneers in Delhi University in introducing automation of college management. A professional group has been commissioned to provide e-connectivity of all academic and administrative data-systems and procedures. Expected to be operational in a few months, it will facilitate every student and staff member to access, monitor, update and collate necessary data through a personalised card, from different electronic stations within the college. We hope this will contribute towards precision, easy retrieval, quick communication and economy of labour and paper.

Earlier, automation was introduced in the college **Library**, which has speeded up cataloguing, issue procedures and location of volumes. The Gargi library has more than 50,000 volumes apart from journals

and magazines. A collection of rare books in the Oswal-Sena library and special journals' added, thanks to a generous grant from the International Punjabi Society, are some of the additional library facilities offered.

#### VISION FOR THE FUTURE

There is no doubt that the founding fathers of Gargi College can look with satisfaction at its progressive journey from its inception in 1967 as a college with 247 students and just two courses (the pre-medical and B.A.P.) to its present academic diversity and human strength. But I am conscious of the long road yet to be traversed. As I look ahead, I see several milestones, some big, some small, some near, some perhaps not so near, but all of them there, to be crossed. In my short span as principal I have identified the following goals:

- to renovate and expand the library;
- to strive to construct an auditorium and a students' hostel;
- to set in motion a multiplier-process of networking and establish a strong Gargi alumni association;
- to make Gargi a venue for SPIC-MACAY events;
- and above all, to develop Gargi Into a premium brand of total quality education, whose fresh graduate would be a promise to the society at large, of a potential leader endowed with social responsibility and spiritual strength to cope with the perils of freedom and competition.

It will be my endeavour to carry the student body, the teaching faculty and the non-academic staff forward with me, through transparent and democratic functioning, and under the guidance of the Governing Body, towards these and many other milestones as they emerge.
