Our illustrious Chief Guest, Member of Parliament and Industrialist Mr.Naveen Jindal, our eminent Guest of Honour, Professor Deepak Pental, Vice Chancellor of University of Delhi, our esteemed Chairperson of the college Governing Body, Professor Nargis Panchapakesan, proud parents of prize winners, our dearly loved alumni and other respected guests:

On behalf of the Gargi family – its principal, distinguished faculty, dear students and the non-academic staff – I extend a warm welcome to you on this august occasion of the 40th Gargi College Day.

We are indeed honoured to have as our Chief Guest, Mr. Naveen Jindal, Member of Parliament from Kurukshetra Constituency. He is also Vice Chairman & Managing Director of Jindal Steel & Power Company and is credited with having transformed a moderately performing company in the steel sector into a star performer, so much so that Business Today ranked it among the top twenty investor friendly companies of the year 2004. He is also the Chairman of Jindal Power Limited. So we may call him a man of steel and power in more ways than one.

I am happy to say that Mr. Jindal is an alumnus of our own university having graduated in B.Com (Hons) from Hans Raj College. He then went on to obtain an MBA at the University of Texas, Dallas, USA, where he was also student president and received the prestigious 'Student of the Year Award' in 1992. He is also a sportsman of considerable merit. He is a record holder in skeet shooting and won several national and international championships. Under his captaincy, the Indian team won Silver Medal in SAF Games in April 2004 in Pakistan. He is also a polo player and has won several trophies for his company at national championships.

He is an active member of several subcommittees of Parliament. His championship of the cause of the right to fly the National Flag by every citizen resulted in a historic judgement of this being accorded a "fundamental right" status in January 2005. Similarly the ban on smoking

in Parliament was largely due to his effort. Sir, you are a rising star in the political horizon and we know India holds great promise for the future under able leaderships such as yours. We in Gargi College wish you a very successful career both in industry and in the country's governance.

We are extremely proud of our new Vice Chancellor, **Professor Deepak Pental**. A professor of genetics and eminent scientist, he has already'
during the few months he has been in office, inspired us all with his
vision and dedication towards further heightening of the academic
standards of this university. He has initiated the preparation of elearning material and extended support for the upgradation of
laboratories.

Professor Pental obtained his doctorate degree from Rutgers University, U.S.A. in 1978 and completed a post-doctoral project on plant genetic manipulation group at the University of Nottingham, U.K. in 1984. He was awarded a biotechnology Career Fellowship in 1986 by the Rockefeller Foundation to work at the Max-Planck Institute of Koln. Joining the University of Delhi, South Campus as Professor of Genetics in 1993, he became Dean, Faculty of Interdisciplinary and Applied Sciences in 1994, Director of Centre for Genetic Manipulation of Crop Plants in 1995 and Director, South Campus in 2000 and Vice Chancellor of Delhi University in 2005. He is also a Member of distinguished bodies such as, Tata Energy Research Institute, National Academy of Agricultural Sciences, Indian National Science Academy, the editorial board of Journal of Biosciences and Current Science, to name a few. He has coordinated two major National Network Programmes in plant genetic technologies and published over sixty papers of research. Interestingly he was awarded a Punjab University medal for first position in diploma in Gandhian Philosophy, which gives us the right to claim him for Humanities as much as for the Sciences.

Sir, the University of Delhi is indeed fortunate to have you at the helm of affairs and all of us at Gargi College pledge our cooperation to your entire endeavour in taking the university to newer heights of glory.

Gargi College is lucky to have as Chairman of its Governing Body Professor Nargis Panchapakesan, a former Dean, Faculty of Education and Head, Department of Education of Delhi University. Interestingly, her first Master's degree obtained from Delhi University was in Physics, which she taught at the undergraduate level here and in the USA. Perhaps a commitment to education, and that too at the grass root level, motivated her to switch focus, for she engaged successfully in doctoral work in Education at the University of Chicago. Thereafter at Delhi University she was associated with the conception and implementation of the graduate programme in Elementary Education. She has been consultant to various governmental and non-governmental organizations, particularly in the area of evaluation and was recently part of the NCERT project to revise the framework of school curriculum. Her principles and clarity of vision have been a source of strength and guidance for me in steering the affairs of this college. Madam we in Gargi College hope and pray for many more years of your presence in our college governing body.

The year 2005-06 was yet another year of big achievements and a wide range of events at Gargi College.

HALL OF FAME

1. Academic:

Gargi College offers 17 academic disciplines in four streams: Sciences, Humanities & Social Studies, Commerce and Elementary Education. 13 of them are also taught at Honours level. More than 2000 students appeared in university examinations of 2005. 27 students were placed among top five positions in Delhi University or its South Campus. 911 students obtained first division, while pass percentage is hundred in almost all disciplines. Special mention must be made of:

Yamini Deb who won the university medal for obtaining the highest marks in the entire university in Botony Honours III year. Earlier, she had stood first in South Delhi Campus for two years. Isha Vohra, B.Com (Pass) also did the college proud by obtaining the first position in Delhi . University and is recipient of the Professor A.B. Ghosh award.

2. Sports

Gargi College strives to achieve excellence in sports and our students receive intense coaching by professionals in volleyball, cricket, basketball, chess, yoga, table tennis and Judo. All students of the college are encouraged to participate in march-past, athletics and other competitions on the annual sports day. The following are some of the highlights of achievements in sports:

The Gargi chess team won the Gargi Inter-College Chess Tournament. They came second in the Delhi University Inter-college Chess Tournament. Nivanthee Jairaj of Applied Psychology (H) III year represented Delhi University in the Inter-University Chess Tournament at Vellore.

The Gargi cricket team won the Harry Inter College Women's Cricket Cup. The team was captained by Sonika Kapoor B.Com (Pass) III year. Ankita Sinha B.Com (Pass) III year represented Delhi University in the All India Inter-varsity Cricket Tournament.

At the Delhi State Athletics Championship, Saraswati BA (pass) III year, our athletics captain, bagged the 3rd position in the 400m and 800m race. At the Delhi University Inter-College Tournament, Saraswati won the 3rd position in the 800m race, 400m race and shotput. She also played for the Delhi Team which won the Rugby Nationals in Delhi. Puneeta Kapur BA (Pass) III year, won the 2nd position in shot put and 3rd in discuss throw at the Delhi State Women's Festival Athletics Championship.

In basketball, Anjali Mishra History (H) I year represented Delhi University in North-East Zone Inter-University Basketball Tournament where the team won third position. Anupam B.A. (Pass) I year was selected to represent Delhi University at the All India Inter-Varsity Basketball Championship at Bhopal.

The Jodo Team, captained by Renu Sharma BA (Pass) III year, won the Delhi University Inter-College Judo Tournament. At the same event, a number of Gargi girls won individual gold medals as well. At the Delhi State Judo Championship, the Judo team were runners-up. Renu Sharma also represented Delhi University in the Inter-University Judo Tournament in Patiala. Richa Sehgal Political Science (H) I year represented India at the Junior Asian Judo Championship in Taiwan.

In tennis, Jaya Vatwani BA (Pass) II year won the bronze medal at the IATA Inter-state Tennis Tournament. Anu Sharma, B.Com (Pass) III year, captained Delhi University at the All India Inter-varsity Table Tennis Tournament at Ludhiana. The table tennis team were runners up at the IIT and Miranda House tournaments.

Girls from the volleyball team represented Delhi state at national and inter-university tournaments in both the senior and junior categories.

3. Cultural:

 Theatre: Gargi College staged three public shows of Garcia Lorca's play Blood Wedding in dialogue cum musical format at Shri Ram Centre during November 05. Directed by Nicholas Kharkongor with music by Deepak Castelino, the play provided all round training for our students in acting, singing, costume designing & production, makeup and many other aspects of theatre management. Very well attended by the citizens of Delhi the play received rave reviews in all the national dailies.

- Reverie 05: The three-day annual inter-college festival held in December 05 was as usual a gala event with participation from over 25 colleges. The theme of the festival was "Renaissance". Our students excelled in street play, choreography, debates, Indian and western music. It was inaugurated by Dr. Kiran Bedi and culminated in a rock show by the Pakistani band Jal which was attended by 2000 students. The festival was carried through by the students' council under the guidance of the staff advisors with meticulous perfection and provided them great opportunities for developing skills of leadership, organization and financial negotiations. This year, for the first time, the event was out-sourced for sponsorships and infrastructural arrangements, which proved to be highly successful.
- Spicmacay: Mr Mahato, and his colourful troupe of 22 members, performed the Chhau dance portraying Gods as well as animal movements with amazing dexterity under the aegis of Spicmacay in November 2005.
- A youth parliament was enacted by the students, modeled on the exact format and functioning of the Lok Sabha. It was followed by an address by Dr. Kiran Walia, MLA.
- The Debating Society won many accolades for Gargi College.
 The team of Martha Merchant and Ishwinder Saini won the Running Trophy at the debate organised by the Sri Sathya Sai International Centre. Martha also won the Best Debator prize. The society also won the First prize at the Plan India, Miranda House and SRCC debates.

- The Street Play Society has been especially dynamic this year. They won the First Prize at BITS Pilani, National School of Drama, Hindu College and IHE. They won the Second prize at LSR, JIIT, LIC and Gargi College. Alpa Yadav B.El.Ed II year won the Best Actor award at IP College and Miranda House.
- The number of First Prize awards won by the Choreography Society seems endless this year — SRCC, Hansraj college, JMC, Miranda House, Maitreyi, Sri Venkateswara, Gargi, Janaki Devi and at Spinz.
- C. Sita Lakshmi and Aakriti Narain Mathur of B.Sc. Botany (H)
 won the prestigious B. M. Johri Rolling Shield for a paper
 presentation at an all-India competition at the Botany Dept., Delhi
 University.
- The Dramatics Society won the Best Play award at SRCC for their adaptation of Lorca's The House of Bernarda Alba. Ishmit Bedi won the Best Lights award. The society was also invited to perform at the Old World Theatre Festival of IHC.
- The Indian Dance Society won First prize at IHE and Dyal Singh College.

4. Faculty's accomplishments:

Gargi College has in its faculty distinguished scholars and committed academicians. Highlights of some of their achievements of 05-06 are presented below:

- Dr Radha Chakravarty (English) published an English translation of the Bengali novel Kapalkundala by Bankim Chandra Chatterji in The Bankimchandra Omnibus Vol. 1; she was also felicitated by Bengali literary circle Bodh Sandhya, for contribution to the field of Bengali literature in translation.
- Dr. Indu Sidhwani (Chemistry) presented a paper at the 9th Annual Green Chemistry and Engineering Conference at Washington DC.
 She and Dr. Bhaumati presented papers at the jont meeting ofthe 2nd international conference on Green and Sustainable Chemistry.

- Dr. Bharati Bhattacharya presented a paper on "a Threat to Himalayan Glaciers Global Warming" at the 62nd Eastern Snow Conference, Canada.
- Dr. Rekha Navneet (Philosophy) and Dr. Anjana Dev and Dr. Radha Chakravarthy (English) have served actively in the university committees for the implementation of the new interdisciplinary courses.
- Dr. Amrit Pritam (Zoology) published a book on a Practical Manual in Ecology and Environmental Studies.
- Dr Geeta Sidharth (Commerce) was granted a Ph.D for her work on 'Job Satisfaction: A Study of Working Doctors'. She also presented a paper on the same subject at the Sixth International Conference and Second World Congress.
- Dr C.M. Upadhye was awarded a Ph.D for her thesis on 'A Study of External Problems, Inequalities and Zeros of Polynomials'.
- A physics research laboratory established by Dr Vandana Luthra (Physics) has been recognized by the Dept of Physics and Astrophysics, Delhi University.
- Monica Das (Economics) presented a paper at the Annual Conference of the International Association for Feminist Economics held at the American University, USA. She was also felicitated by Naveen Patnaik, the Chief Minister of Orissa for the documentary film Anwesan directed by her.
- Dr Radha Agrawal authored and published two books: Adhunik
 Hindi Saniksha Mai Saddarnikaran Ka Vivachan and Samksha
 Ki Kasauti Par.
- Dr Atreyi Majumdar presented a paper on the 'Likely Impact of Globalisation on India's Unemployment Problem and Migration' at the Universities of Warwick and Newcastle upon Tyne.

More details of faculty achievements figure later in this report.

CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT

Conference on Interdisciplinary Studies

Delhi University has recently introduced interdisciplinary studies in its curriculum. Gargi College took the lead in organizing a symposium on this to examine various issues such as its conceptual frameworks, impact on various disciplines, pedagogical and administrative implications. Inaugurated by our Vice Chancellor, Prof. Pental followed by a keynote address by Prof. Krishna Kumar, Director, NCERT, the panel of speakers at the conference included eminent scholars from the USA, UK and India. Principals and teachers from various colleges of DU attended the conference and participated in the deliberations. The conference was possible because of sponsorships from UGC, ICPR, ICHR, The British Council, Indian Airlines and Air India.

Centre with Potential for Excellence

Gargi College was recognized as a Centre with Potential for Excellence and was awarded a special grant by the UGC last year. A three-year plan of scientific research, additional courses and social welfare programmes spanning 9 departments was initiated. In the second year of its term now, the following are the projects in progress:

- Botany: An advanced Botanical Experimentation Laboratory is being set up to offer a course on experiments through computer.
- Chemistry: the department has developed an alternate method of qualitative inorganic analysis to replace the toxic Hydrogen Sulphide. This was presented by Dr. Indu Sidhwani and Dr. Sushmita Chaudhry and well received at the second International Conference on Green Chemistry organized by the International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry. Trials are on in the area of Laboratory Waste Management.

- Microbiology: a 4-day workshop on 'Recent Trends in Microbiology'
 was organized in July 05; a refrigerated micro centrifuge will soon
 be purchased and used for research.
- Physics: Matlab software has been uploaded for students in two computers and a course in computer applications in physics will be offered shortly.
- Zoology: research through viewing of cells under living conditions is in progress; a digital microscope has just been put under operation.
- Elementary Education: Workshop on use of music in primary education, setting up of a curriculum laboratory and translation of textbooks into Hindi are underway. The first In-service Workshop with primary teachers of government schools was organized in Jan. 2006.
- Commerce: The following special courses are being offered after college hours: banking and financial services, advertising and marketing communications and business communications through computer.
- Psychology: A series of workshops on Well Being especially on emotional well being were conducted for faculty and students by Dr. Nagpal.
- Students are being trained to reach out to society through tests on Well Being.
- Women's Development Centre: A stress management workshop was held in August 05; a special section on gender-issues has been created in the library.

It is hoped that within the year Gargi College will be able to make public some of its achievements through the above projects.

Departmental seminars and workshops - highlights:

All departments in Gargi College hold their own annual seminars and festivals, thus providing opportunities for public speaking and participation to a large number of students.

- Psychology: A seminar on 'Well-being: Life Skills Approach' in collaboration with VIMHANS. The seminar aimed at empowering young students to make responsible choices for healthy living.
- Botany: A seminar on 'Recent Advances in Molecular Biology and Bioinformatics'.
- English: A seminar on 'The Other in Indian Culture, Art and Literature' to explore the gender, caste and communal dimensions of "otherness".
- Elementary Education: A two-day In-service Workshop on Social Science for primary teachers in government schools was organized.
- Philosophy: A panel discussion on 'Culture and the Good Life in Contemporary Society'. Panelists included Prof. Patricia Uberoi, Dr Avijit Pathak, Dr Deepa Nag (chair) and Mr Pranab Mukherjee.
- Commerce Department held a panel discussion on "Corporate Social Responsibility" in which Dr. Abhishek Singhvi, the eminent lawyer was one of the speakers.

Building Social Responsibility

Gargi College maintains a healthy tradition of making its young adults aware of social disparities and environmental hazards. It provides them diverse avenues for making their contributions to society.

1. N.S.S.

This year the NSS has been very active in reaching out with their community service programmes:

- The NSS organized a Blood Donation Camp in Sept. 2005. The chief guest was danseuse Sonal Mansingh.
- An NGO Diwali Mela 'Sparklers' was organized in Oct 2005. More than 20 NGOs participated in it.
- A special function titled 'Blossom' was organized for differentlyabled children from Muskan and Shankara Special School on Children's Day.
- 'Friendship Day' was celebrated with senior citizen friends from Sandhya, an old-age home, and the superannuated teachers from Gargi College.

2. N.C.C.

NCC cadets Seema and Kamlesh were selected for the Republic Day Parade this year. Cadets Khushboo, Jyoti, Shweta, Suman and Baby Shanoo participated in BLC, NIC, army attachment, CM rally and the pre Republic Day camp. The Gargi SUO Poonam performed excellently in many areas. Other cadets did wonders in slithering, BLC, shooting and trekking.

3. Women's Development Centre

Especially this year, the WDC has been a very dynamic centre, organizing a number of activities to create awareness of gender issues. Key activities include:

- A discussion on the issue of women's safety.
- A workshop on stress management through meditation by the Life Eternal Trust.
- A two-day inter-college event titled "Celebrating Women?" to draw attention to women's contribution to social progress.
- A crafts mela to promote the work of self-employed women from disadvantaged sectors.

- Screening the film Matrubhumi, followed by a discussion on genderdiscrimination.
- Expanding the Gender Studies section of the College Library.
- Making the voluntary services of the college counselor available to everyone in the institution.

4. Waste Management Project:

The Solid Waste Management programme in the college has set up machinery for converting the horticultural waste of the college into compost. The manure produced is regularly on sale. Students are working to set up a plastic recycle unit to make useful products with discarded plastic.

5. Beyond Borders: Our students participate regularly in group community work initiated by the British Council in their youth project 'Beyond Borders'.

Communications and Networking

Magazines and Newsletters:

Logos, the annual magazine is the voice of Gargi-ites in all their moods. This year's issue has focused on the theme of "Vision 2020" Eureka, from students of Sceinces, Manthan of History, Oracle of Humanities, Demos of Political Science, Gnosis of Philosophy and Comascent of Commerce are newsletters produced and edited by students for quick mass communication. And there are several wall magazines for anonymous and more candid expressions!

2. Alumni Meet:

The 2nd Gargi College Alumni Reunion was organised on 24 Dec 2005. More than 100 alumni congregated and interacted with teachers and batch-mates. Alumni newsletters and interactive websites are planned for the future.

3. Placements:

The College is progressively trying to upgrade placement facilities for students. The Elementary Education Dept. invited prestigious private schools and NGOs working in education to their placement day and 70% of final year students have been placed before completing graduation. The Air Force, the corporate sector (companies such as e-Valueserve, Innodata) and the hospitality industry (such as the Taj Group) made presentations and conducted interviews and group discussions for jobs in management, editing and abstracting.

Infrastructure Development

2005-06 has been a landmark year for the college in the augmentation of infrastructural facilities for the enhancement of academic and administrative standards.

- A computer laboratory was installed with 21 computers, internet facility, linux, window XP professional and other accessories.
- A research wing with 5 rooms was constructed. These are to house the special projects undertaken in connection with CPE as also to facilitate research of individual teachers and groups of students.
- A new room was built for the Elementary Education department to enable the conduct of special workshops, departmental library and the setting up of a resource centre to enable interactions with teachers from different schools.
- "The Retreat": a place for students to hold meetings, rehearsals and socialize was created in outhouse design.
- Automation: The connectivity with the University Computer Centre was established and twelve free internet stations have been

provided in the college. Two computers have been provided exclusively for students' use in the library and I am happy to see them well used. Two computers have been installed in the staff room in order to facilitate computerization of the internal assessment system.

- The intra-net connection of all aspects of college administration has been launched this year and is making slow but steady progress. Personalised Online Multi-domain Viewing (OMV) cards have been provided to all students and this year's student Council elections were conducted through e-ballotting by these cards that has also enabled demographic analysis of the elections. Students will be able to access their attendance and internal assessment records through these cards.
- A photocopier machine was installed in the reference section of the library and an advanced model of an LCD projector was purchased to enable power point presentations both by staff and students as well as to fortify the film appreciation club.

With cuts in funding for colleges by UGC reaching alarming levels, I am proud to claim that the introduction of the above features is nothing short of a miracle.

- The college is in dire need of an auditorium. I must record here my gratitude to the Honourable Chief Minister of NCT of Delhi, Smt Shiela Dixit for responding to my plea for help by sanctioning partial financial support to the construction of an auditorium in the college. We in college are now engaged in a massive fund raising drive. Simultaneously, proceedings for the construction have begun as designs submitted by architects are under study.
- Residence for students: Gargi College does not have space to build a women's hostel. But we were able to provide on-campus

residence for 5 out-station students this year by converting a vacant staff quarter into a temporary hostel.

- A doctor, nurse and a students' counselor are additional services provided to our students.
- Library: 900 books were added to our library this year which now houses 1,18,972 volumes other than periodicals and after regular weeding out of obsolete material. The college is grateful to International Punjabi Society, which has given us a grant a second year in succession. The first installment of Rs. 25,000 will be used to purchase books of the new interdisciplinary courses, which are currently under preparation.

Vision and Missions for the Future

Last year, in the annual report that I presented for the first time as the new principal of the college, I made some promises and I am happy to report that I have been able to satisfactorily address most of them. As I envision many more milestones in the path ahead, I hope in the coming year, I can accomplish the following:

- promote physical fitness and sports for all
- upgrade placement and career counseling services to more professional levels and organize a career bazaar
- persevere with the University, UGC and AICTE to permit Gargi College to step up its initiatives in offering add-on professional courses
- prepare a blue print for a major ecological project.

I also reinforce my commitment to the vision presented last year, which is to strive to develop Gargi College into a premium brand of total

quality education, whose fresh graduate would be a promise to the society at large of a potential leader, endowed with social responsibility and spiritual strength to cope with the perils of freedom and competition.

I take this opportunity to thank the top management of this university and the governing body of the college for their guidance and my entire staff – teaching and non-academic, as well as my dear students for the cooperation they extended to me during this last year academic year, which was also my first year in office.
