PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Hon'ble Chief Minister Smt. Shiela Dixit Director, Respected Professor, Abhai Mansingh, Esteemed Chairman, Dr. Ratnakar Pandey, Members of the Governing Council, dear colleagues and friends,

It is my pleasure and privilege to welcome you all to this special Annual Day-the first College Day in the new millennium, though in terms of time span, this is the 34th year since the college was founded in 1967. This day has been made doubly special by the gracious presence of our **Honourable Chief Minister Smt. Shiela Dixit** who herself, is an alumnus of Delhi University. It is customary to indulge in exaggerated praise of the Chief Guest especially when the honoured guest is of the stature of the Chief Minister. I would indulge in no such eloquence and confine myself to just a simple observation. Those of us who have the good fortune to meet her, cannot fail to recognise in her a person who is strong and yet essentially humane, who is a rare mixture of intellectual and moral virtues and who displays a definite unity and purpose of action inspired almost by a missionary zeal.

I thank you, Madam Chief Minister, for giving us this privilege of welcoming you to our college and the pleasure of listening to your address on this special occasion. I will be remiss in my duty if I fail to express our gratitude to the Chief Minister, for her sympathetic understanding of our problems—specially those relating to release of funds and for her swift remedial directives to solve them.

We are also privileged to have our Director, South Campus, **Professor Abhai Mansingh** with us today. Professor Abhai Mansingh needs no introduction. He has been a true mentor for all of us at Gargi. A physicist by training, a specialist in informatics and an able administrator, Professor Abhai Mansingh has been an enthusiastic supporter of all our innovative academic programmes. Under his guidance, encouragement and support, we have emerged as one of the front running colleges of the University of Delhi.

We are thankful to our Chairman, **Dr. Ratnakar Pandey** who is here with us in his customary role as our inspirational force steering us through all our efforts in providing quality education to all our students. Having been himself a Principal of one of the Delhi colleges, his experience, wisdom and vision have been vital to our functioning as a wholesome integrated unit. I take this opportunity to express my thanks to all the members of our gov-

erning body for being a great source of strength and encouragement to the development of the college.

Gargi College in its 34th year has carried forward its tradition of 100% pass results in the final year examinations of 1999. The college flag is once again flying high with 34 positions in the South Campus and 3 Firsts in the entire University-North and South combined. We are very proud of our students who have brought laurels to the college. The performance of the students sums up the quality of education given by the college. Details of the students' impressive achievements are given in the annexure at the end of this report.

I have just mentioned "Quality Education" as our cherished goal. How do we define this? What criteria are relevant to assess Quality Education? If it is in terms of pass percentage, we have fully subscribed to this high standard. Yet another index of the quality of education is the functioning and capability of the teachers of the institution. I am very proud of my faculty and their sustained efforts at combining teaching with research.

The Botany Research laboratory, recognised by the University of Delhi has encouraged our Botany faculty to take up new research projects. Dr. Gita Mathur, who set up the laboratory with a DST sanctioned project was invited by the International Botanical Congress and she presented her paper on Reproductive Biology and Anthecology of Eggplant-Solanum melongena at St. Louis, Missouri, USA. She has also published a paper in an International Technical Journal from Belgium and two more of her research findings have been accepted for presentation at the XVI International Congress on Sexual Plant Reproduction to be held in Canada in April this year.

Dr. Promila Kumar (Mathematics) presented her paper on <u>Vector Invex n-set Functions</u> in the **6th International symposium on Generalised Convexity/Monotonicity at Karlovassi, Greece**.

Dr. Vandana Luthra's (Physics) paper on <u>Thermal and Transport Properties of Polyaniline doped with Sulphuric Polymides and other High Temperature Polymers</u> was accepted for presentation at the **University of Newark, New Jersey**. Two other papers by Dr. Vandana Luthra have been presented at the **National Physical Laboratory, New Delhi**.

Mrs. Sangeeta Bhatia (Applied Psychology) presented her paper on <u>Life Satisfaction and Values in Retired Women</u> at the 107th convention of American Psychology Association in Boston, USA.

We congratulate Dr. Rashmi Bharadwaj and Dr. Pallavi Vaid (Philosophy)

who have been awarded the Doctoral Degree by the Delhi University for their respective theses on John Rawls and Bernard Williams. Dr. Monica Bassi (Physics) has been awarded the Doctoral Degree by the University of Delhi for her thesis on Mean Excitation Energy and its Applications in the Field of Atomic and Molecular Physics. Our appreciation and good wishes go to Mrs. Minoti Chatterjee (Political Science) and Mrs. Pragati Ashdhir (Physics) for completing their doctoral dissertations.

Dr. Vidhu Verma Roy (Political Science) has been awarded the ICSSR Fellowship to work on Free Nation: Unequal Citizens-The Debate on Equality and Distributive Justice in Indian Political Thought. Dr. Vidhu Verma Roy has just brought out a book by Sage Publications on Justice, Equality and Community: An Essay on Marxist Political Theory.

Dr. Nishi Bir Chawla (English) is currently a Visiting Scholar at John Hopkins University, Maryland, USA.

Dr. Vijaya Ramaswamy (History) has received the **UGC Research Award** to work on <u>Tamil Women From the Underside of History in Search of a New Paradigm.</u>

Dr. Deepa Jethwaney (Botany) has been awarded the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Fellowship to work on Endogenous Nitrite Carcinogenesis In Man at M.I.T., Massachusetts, USA.

We are proud to announce the setting up of a new **Departmental Library** for English Studies thanks to the generous gift of books by Mr. Sushil Oswal, currently based in USA. This library, will enable scholars and researchers working on Indian, Canadian and Commonwealth writings in English to access the latest and the best available material published abroad.

We have also been sanctioned M. Sc. in (Chemistry) from the next academic session and have, in advance, readied a new instrumentation laboratory which will serve, in course of time, as a research laboratory. As Principal, Gargi College I have been awarded the 2000 Millennium Award by the Indian Institute of Ecology and Environment and International Association of Educators for World Peace for the 'pioneering' work done on Environmental Awareness and Education in collaboration with the Centre for Environment Education, Ahmedabad. Twenty of our students who are being trained for teaching profession went in Summer of '99 to CEE, Ahmedabad for training. Next month 35 of our faculty members are visiting CEE for a workshop in Environment Education. The objective of this workshop is to enable our faculty to integrate environmental concepts, issues, perspectives and environmental education into the teaching of their regular courses.

We have also arranged with the NIIT to offer a special free course in **Website Writing** to our faculty members. These programmes for teachers are pioneer programmes and we at Gargi, are proud of being the forerunner for Faculty Training schemes.

Yet another measure of assessing Quality Education is in terms of methods and strategies adopted by the College for dissemination of knowledge beyond the classroom teaching. What is it that makes education at Gargi valuable? The academic programmes at Gargi have been energised by inter-active seminars, workshops and extramural lectures to give the students a holistic education. We have been, for the last many years, in the forefront in organising International and National level seminars.

The Department of Botany held a major **National Seminar** on **Emerging Trends in Bio-Technology** which was addressed by Professors from Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, Mumbai; Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore; Centre for Cell and Molecular Biology, Hyderabad; International Centre for Genetic Engineering and Bio-Technology, New Delhi; Tata Energy Research Institute and Professors from the three major universities in Delhi.

The Political Science Department organised a two-day seminar on The Idea of India-From Genesis to the Millennium. The keynote address was given by **Professor Namvar Singh** and the seminar had very many good papers from scholars and professors of Delhi and Jawaharial Nehru Universities.

The Commerce Department organised their annual seminar on **Business Vision in the Next Millennium**, addressed by some of the top executives from the corporate sectors.

The Department of Elementary Education held a stimulating workshop on Green Teacher. It had also organised a Panel Discussion on School Planning And Management: Problems And Challenges which was well attended by leading academics from the C.I.E. of Delhi University and scholars & administrators from SCERT/NCERT and NIEPA besides Principals of leading schools of Delhi.

The Department had also been the first to organise an in-service training programme for teachers of Saraswati Bal Mandir during the summer of '99. This programme has come in for great praise and is much in demand currently from other schools also.

Details of all other departmental activities are given in the annexure.

On the extra-academic side, the college NSS has done a great deal of work: particular mention must be made of the audio-recording of text books for the visually- challeged, special programmes for the elderly and prompt despatch of relief material for the Orissa Cyclone victims.

The NSO has brought laurels to the college and details are given in the annexure. Suffice it to say that Gargi can boast of a very good infrastructure for Sports especially good Tennis courts and a Basketball court besides a very good Cricket ground with both cement and turf pitches, which are easily among Delhi's best.

Our ace shooter Ms. Sonia Rana was selected to represent India at the Shooting Championships in the 8th South Asian games at Kathmandu, Nepal where she bagged a silver for India. She was selected to represent India in the Oceana Championship at Sydney, 3rd Commonwealth Shooting Championship at Auckland and Junior International Championship at Munich. She bagged the Gold in the 42nd and the 43rd National Shooting Championships.

Ms. Chanchal Atal (Judo) has secured the All India Inter-SAI scholarship from the Sports Authority of India under outstanding sportsperson category.

The SARC Club-Social Awareness and Reform Club-started by our young students towards empowerment of youth to build a New India as a major intellectual, moral and spiritual force held panel discussions on major topical social issues with leading public figures.

I wish to record my appreciation of the sustained quality efforts put in by my faculty, students and staff, without whom the above achievements would not have been possible.

Gargi's Vision for 2000 :

We have done reasonably well, and do not wish to sit on our laurels. We are well and truly aware of the crisis in higher education today. The colleges and the universities have to be sensitive to the demands of the society that calls for highly trained specialists in different fields. The colleges are under pressure to be **omnicompetent** and in the West the universities today have come to be known as "**multiversities**". Education at the higher level is getting utilitarian and thereby fragmented. The need for technical specialisation has pushed higher institutions to offer new disciplines which are of no theoretical significance, having only practical utility. But, all these series of parts constitute no whole. There has come a cleft in our perception of education to the extent that a science student has no

need for any kind of humanistic training and a student of humanities is considered to be no less of a student for lack of scientific training.

We are a **three-in-one** college offering all the three major streams-**Humanities**, **Science and Commerce** and therefore, have this fortuitous opportunity to bridge this split in higher education. Like an architect who need not be a carpenter or a bricklayer, but who should have architect who les tructure and know how to fit in the carpenter and the brickayer in it, the faculty also has to have a wholesome vision in the midst of specialisation.

Towards the fulfilment of this objective, we have introduced extramural courses on Art history, Art appreciation, Film appreciation, Translation courses and Environment education to make students of different disciplines develop a taste for things other than what they learn in the classplines develop a taste for things other than what they learn in the classpone. Our endeavour is to give the students not only the feel of growing up, but also to make it a transforming experience. We shall continue in our efforts to provide them with an openness of approach to free inquiry so that when they leave our portals at the end of three years, they can say with pride that they had real thinkers in their teachers who opened up new worlds for them to explore. They should be able to say that they had teachers and friends who had helped them to see much more than they would have, if Gargi had not provided them with just such an opening.

In the recently concluded Indian Science Congress in Pune, five fundamentals were suggested as the cornerstone to make the country march ahead into the new Millennium. They are Child-centred Education, Women-centred Family, Human-centred Development, Knowledge-centred Society and Innovation-centred India. We have begun in a small measure to achieve some of these spelt out in the Panchseel doctrine for a New India. A long journey is ahead of all of us, but we are confident and we have the potential to translate these doctrines into reality.

Our effort shall be to make Gargi College a **Centre of Excellence** and to make it the polar star for the formation of a **complete human being** through encouragement of higher human alternatives.
