15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The National Education Policy (NEP) emphasizes multidisciplinary and holistic education, principles that we have wholeheartedly embraced at Gargi College. With the NEP fully implemented across all academic years, interdisciplinary education has become the foundation of our academic framework. Our Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) reflects this commitment, requiring students to select at least four elective papers from disciplines beyond their core area of study. These Generic Electives develop an interdisciplinary approach, ensuring the integration of diverse knowledge fields. The balance of core subjects, electives, and skill-based learning, ensures that students can build a strong foundation in their chosen fields while exploring other disciplines. Beyond academics, we also encourage interdisciplinary methods in extracurricular activities, understanding that complex societal problems cannot be solved by drawing on just one discipline. For example, the Pathfinder Award allows students to tackle youth-centered issues with mentorship from faculty across various disciplines. Gargi College has a strong tradition of organizing seminars, conferences, and workshops that go beyond specific disciplinary boundaries. The themes of these seminars, webinars, workshops, conferences, and departmental festivals are thoughtfully chosen to encourage community engagement, environmental education, and value-based education among students and expand their knowledge to have a wider perspective towards contemporary issues. For example, conferences like "Revisiting Wellbeing" and "Empowering the Golden Years" highlight our holistic approach by addressing issues related to mental health and elderly well-being respectively, thus sensitizing the youth towards their societal responsibility. Our add-on courses and interdisciplinary programs are designed to cultivate critical thinking and problemsolving skills. These initiatives ensure that students receive an education that extends beyond academics, preparing them for diverse real-world challenges. In alignment with NEP, the current curriculum framework provides multiple entry and exit opportunities to students while maintaining academic rigor. This flexibility empowers students

to either pause their studies and return later or pursue different career paths without disrupting their education. For example, students who opt for an early exit can receive a diploma or certificate, and those continuing through to the final year will graduate with comprehensive interdisciplinary knowledge. Our recent conference on the "National Education Policy 2020: Perspectives, Challenges, and Opportunities" focused on educating our students and academic community about the opportunities and challenges posed by the policy, which also included informing them about flexible entry and exit systems. The Research and Development Cell (RDC) of Gargi College encourages faculty and students to engage in multidisciplinary research. By actively motivating faculty members to collaborate with peers from various departments and institutions, interdisciplinary research is stressed upon. These initiatives reinforce our commitment to a multidisciplinary and holistic education system that spans all genres, including science, humanities, sports, and commerce. Through these efforts, we aim to instill a deep appreciation for the interconnectedness of all fields of knowledge, thus truly embodying the spirit of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary education in practice.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Gargi College adheres to the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system, in accordance with the policies set forth by the University of Delhi and the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. As a constituent college of Delhi University, we do not formulate independent credit policies but rely on the guidance and approval of the university's academic authorities. The ABC system allows students to accumulate and transfer credits across different disciplines, enhancing their academic flexibility and mobility. At Gargi College, a wide range of interdisciplinary courses are offered to the students that enables students to personalize their educational experiences, thus promoting an inclusive learning environment. The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, provides students the flexibility of multiple entry and exit options within their chosen programs. The institution ensures that students can benefit from this system, providing opportunities for them to pause and resume their studies based on their individual needs. Our established collaborations with institutions under the Vidya Vistar Scheme further support creditbased learning, validated by the university. Gargi College has signed several new MoUs during the academic year to strengthen collaboration, knowledge sharing, and educational exchange. These partnerships aim to enhance academic opportunities for our students and faculty, encouraging the exchange of ideas and resources. Faculty members at Gargi College are encouraged to design their own

curricular and pedagogical approaches within the approved framework by participating in various orientation and refresher courses. These professional development programs help them stay updated with current trends and innovations in education, enabling them to enhance and revise their teaching materials. As a result, faculty members can develop creative assignments and assessments that add greater value to the learning experience. This alignment with the ABC system demonstrates our commitment to providing a flexible and comprehensive education, enabling our students to succeed in a diverse and changing world.

17.Skill development:

Gargi College has made significant strides in strengthening vocational education and soft skills among students. In alignment with the National Education Policy 2020, the university has mandated each department/discipline to offer a Skill-Enhancement Course every semester from a pool of courses designed for improving competency, proficiency, and skills. Students across disciplines have the opportunity to choose from a diverse array of skill enhancement courses, the one which they feel will most effectively enhance their industry and corporate preparedness. Various departments of the college, student council, and placement cell regularly organize hands-on workshops, add-on courses, seminars, short-term online/offline courses offering training in areas such as digital literacy, entrepreneurship, communication, and leadership etc. These sessions help upskill students with practical skills that are highly valued across industries. Through innovative and practical teaching methodology, the college aims to enhance both the technical abilities and the personal development of the students. Gargi College is one of the first institutions to realize the significance of "skill development" and started add-on courses over two decades ago, inviting industry experts to train our students to hone both their soft and hard skills thus facilitating a smoother transition to workplaces. Beyond academic skills, the college promotes holistic growth by instilling leadership, teamwork, and civic responsibility through initiatives such as NSS, NCC, sports, Enactus training, fine arts, music, and other cultural and non-cultural societies. The vocational courses are fully embedded within the academic curriculum, with classes and practicals incorporated into the student's regular timetable. This ensures that skill development is an essential part of their holistic education. Industry experts are frequently invited to interact with students, offering insights into current industry trends and expectations. As part of the University of Delhi's approved pool of Value Addition Courses, the college offers value-based education to promote holistic development and

humanistic values among learners. Through active participation in NSS and NCC, students are involved in community service, and Avni, Eco-Club works towards making the students more conscious of their environment. The college has been actively holding mental fitness workshops and sessions through Izhaar and Ananda which focus on promoting mental well-being among students. These programs provide a safe space for students to express themselves, and enhance their overall mental fitness, contributing to a balanced and positive educational environment. Celebration of national and cultural festivals in the cultural societies helps students embrace and appreciate the culture of neighboring states. Thus both within and beyond the curriculum, we at Gargi are diligently focused on initiatives for the skill development of our students.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Gargi College is actively engaged in promoting a deep sense of belief, value, and appreciation for the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) among its students. The college takes immense pride in being named after Vidushi Gargi from the Brihadaranyaka Upanishad of the Vedic Age, who embodied the spirit of inquiry coupled with faith, as demonstrated through her thought-provoking questions to the sage Yajnavalkya. This essence of inquiry forms the foundation of Gargi College, which is deeply rooted in the principles of IKS. In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which acknowledges the rich heritage of ancient Indian knowledge and thought, Gargi College seeks to instill these values in its students, encouraging them to validate and then apply knowledge in practice. To support this mission, the college has established a dedicated Indian Knowledge System Committee. Courses on subjects like Ayurveda, Yoga, Vedic mathematics, Pandulipi, classical and modern Indian literature, philosophy, and history are offered as optional subjects, allowing students to explore these traditional knowledge systems. Additionally, the college offers ability enhancement courses on environmental studies and mother-tongue language Hindi, promoting a deeper understanding of IKS concepts, particularly in literature, history, and the arts through mothertongue. Societies focused on classical music, dance, and drama, as well as the Enactus, developed an appreciation for traditional Indian music, crafts, and practices. The North-East Society of the college plays an active role in creating an inclusive environment for students from the northeastern states, inculcating an appreciation for the region's languages and cultures. Faculty members are encouraged to participate in faculty development programs that focus on traditional Indian pedagogy, bilingual

instruction, and interdisciplinary teaching methods. As a constituent college of a central university, Gargi College is mindful of the linguistic, cultural, and regional diversity among its students and staff and understands its importance in citizenship education. We recognize the historical consequences of colonialism in perpetuating linguistic inequalities and privileging certain knowledge systems over others, thereby endangering knowledge available in Indian languages and hindering the nation's growth. To address this, we advocate for our faculty members to engage with students using both Hindi and English to cater to students from diverse backgrounds. Faculty members are also urged to incorporate examples from students' own languages and cultures, encouraging selfesteem, peer interaction, and mutual respect. Cultural societies like dance, music, drama, and creative writing educate students on the plurality of Indian culture, emphasizing its universal relevance. The campus's 'sacred garden' provides a unique, interdisciplinary space for exploring the Indian Knowledge System, while various programs and courses in Indian and English languages offer students opportunities to engage with scholarship across linguistic boundaries.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

In the NEP framework, each course is carefully designed with a focus on its outcomes and relevance to the overall program. Even before NEP, under the Choice Credit System, the Learning-Outcome-Curriculum-Framework (LOCF) clearly defined the expected outcomes for every course and program of study. To effectively implement these outcomes during curriculum delivery, faculty members regularly undergo training/ FDPs/ Orientation and Refresher Courses organized by UGC Human Resource Development Centres/Universities. These programs help faculty members enhance their skills, ensuring they stay updated with emerging knowledge, research, and technology. They also identify employment opportunities within their fields to better align the curriculum with industry expectations. Our alumni play a key role in bridging the gap between academia and industry by sharing their experiences. Career counseling sessions led by alumni highlight research opportunities in their respective fields. Cocurricular activities, including online quizzes, competitions, webinars, and paper presentations, give students a platform to express their creativity and prepare them for future work environments across various industries. Gargi College's commitment to outcome-based education, reflected in both the NEP system and the previous Choice Based Credit System, ensures that students receive a well-rounded education aligned with industry needs, supported by continuous faculty training, alumni involvement, and a diverse range

of co-curricular activities

20.Distance education/online education:

The apprehensions and hesitations regarding the adoption of technology for teaching and learning through distance education largely faded during the COVID-19 pandemic. Following this period, the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) has placed significant emphasis on distance education and online learning as vital components of the educational landscape. Acknowledging the transformative potential of technology, the NEP promotes the use of digital platforms to ensure equitable access to quality education, particularly in remote areas. At Gargi College, faculty members are actively engaging with the digital space for knowledge-sharing through various online methods, such as PowerPoint presentations, MOOCs, SWAYAM, video presentations, and useful online resources. Our educators are committed to enhancing their digital literacy by familiarizing themselves with online teaching tools, learning management systems (LMS), and other relevant technology platforms. In the post-COVID era, the transition to a blended mode of education has enhanced global interaction and the exchange of ideas, creating a more interconnected world. The advent of webinars and online Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) has further expanded access to a broader audience than ever before. Nonetheless, the challenge remains to balance these opportunities with manageable work schedules while prioritizing the well-being of all stakeholders. Our dedication to fostering an inclusive learning environment remains strong, and we continuously strive to enhance and expand our distance education initiatives to address the evolving needs of our students.

An Internal Assessment Committee has been established to manage issues related to Internal Assessment (IA) and Continuous Assessment (CA), adhering to university guidelines to ensure a transparent, timely, and fair process. Students can address any concerns with their teacher, the Teacher-in-Charge (TIC), or a committee member.

The committee sets clear deadlines for the submission of marks, verification by teachers and students, office submission, and final posting on the University portal and college website. This process ensures smooth and transparent assessments, involving students at each stage.

As per the National Education Policy (NEP), each subject includes various components for IA and CA. At the beginning of the course, teachers explain these components and the assessment process, allowing both teachers and students to discuss and decide on the mode of continuous assessment.

Assessments are conducted throughout the semester, and teachers provide feedback to students. Students can ask questions or seek clarifications, and if a student misses an exam for a valid reason, they are allowed to take a re-test. Evaluated answer sheets and attendance records are shown to students for transparency, and any discrepancies are addressed by the respective teacher. Students wishing to improve their scores can opt for a re-test. Once the assessment sheets are verified and signed, they are submitted to the office.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college has excellent infrastructure spanning across 9.198 acres with multi-storey buildings interconnected by long corridors. Currently construction of a new building that has numerous classrooms, laboratories, and lecture halls is almost done and shall become operational soon. The professional courses B.El.Ed and B.B.E are also offered.

Classrooms are distributed across Arts, Commerce, and Science blocks, including 4 lecture theatres LT-1, LT-2, LT-3, and LT-4, 8 bamboo huts called Porta Cabins, and various classrooms equipped with LCD projectors.

Science facilities encompass 21 labs for Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, and Microbiology, with specialized areas like Bioinformatics and nanotechnology research. Each lab is well-equipped with necessary apparatus, ACs, and safety measures like fire extinguishers and exhaust systems.

There are 3 Computer Labs which maintain a 1:1 student-to-computer ratio and support practical classes. The college emphasizes digital administration with workshops for staff training.

Projectors are available in most of the classrooms, lecture theaters, and laboratories. Comprehensive fire safety measures include 62 fire extinguishers strategically placed throughout campus facilities.

In summary, the college's infrastructure supports a wide array of academic and extracurricular activities, fostering an environment conducive to learning.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

The college has a 750-seat Auditorium and a Seminar Hall seating 100-120, renowned for hosting cultural events, inter-college competitions, and society festivals. During festivals, the spacious foyer and Arts Quad serve additional purposes.

An Open Air Theatre behind the office block offers seating on adjoining steps and lush lawns. The college supports diverse extracurricular activities, including NCC's adventurous pursuits and ANANDA: Well-Being Center's focus on mental and physical health with workshops and community programs. Other amenities include a botanical garden, rainwater harvesting system, and a xerox center.

We use the sports ground and courts for practical sessions in the Physical Education Department as well as in general. The college has outdoor facilities for sports: A 200 m grass Athletic track, a cemented Basketball court - 28 M x 15 M with additional 2 m. all around the court, for cricket -15 turf pitches, 2 cement pitches and 3 AstroTurf pitches, two synthetic tennis courts- One court, one fine-mud Volleyball court - 18 m x 9 m. A long jump pit - 9 m / 2.75 width. One Table-Tennis Table and 32 new Judo practice Mats in the Auditorium Basement. One Cross training equipment and three Volleyball training equipment.

The college's IT infrastructure effectively meets the needs of both staff and students. High-speed Wi-Fi, with speeds up to 100 MBPS, is available across campus, serving approximately 4,500 users. ICT-enabled labs and additional computers from a recent university expansion enhance the educational experience.

The library features a fully computerized system with barcoded memberships and nine computers that offer Wi-Fi and specialized software for visually impaired users. Access to e-resources from Delhi University further enriches the learning environment. Internal coordination ensures effective management of official records, supported by robust backend servers managed by a dedicated website committee.

Ongoing professional development programs keep teaching and administrative staff informed about the latest technological advancements. Software tools promote transparency in procurement processes, while projectors in classrooms facilitate student presentations. The Placement Cell conducts online assessments with the assistance of computer lab staff, utilizing college resources efficiently even on weekends.

Comprehensive facilities include LAN connectivity throughout labs, offices, and computer centers, along with updated software licenses such as Windows Server 2008 (R2), Mathematica 9, R Studio, R, Scilab, Python, and Argus Lab.

Maintenance of laboratory instruments is managed by faculty and dedicated lab staff. Each lab attendant maintains cleanliness and washes glassware, supporting lab assistants as needed. Assistants oversee attendants, prepare reagents, and manage inventory and expenses. Plans are in place for coverage during staff absences.

Repairs for equipment and electrical systems are promptly reported and resolved. Some labs are equipped with projectors used for teaching and student presentations. The college-wide Wi-Fi supports research, teaching, and administrative tasks.

New instrument acquisition is ongoing to replace outdated equipment and accommodate increasing student numbers.

Resource utilization is optimized through systematic procedures:

- The library receives lists of essential reading from departments and promotes regular student visits. Digital library access requires college Wi-Fi.
- Departments schedule computer lab use, equipped with internet, Wi-Fi, and specialized software. Headphones aid in video lectures.
- Classrooms are allocated based on class size, with projectors enhancing teaching efficiency.
- Sports facilities are open to students with scheduled activities and events to promote participation among staff and students.

6.1.2 - The effective leadership is visible in various institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management.

Gargi College, under the aegis of IQAC, organized a two day, interdisciplinary national conference on National Education Policy 2020: Perspectives, Challenges and the Way Forward on 3-4 Nov 2023 to create a knowledge base for handling the new curriculum and challenges. All departments of the college were involved in a decentralized way to enhance participation, access, and skillbuilding. Preparations for a successful conference started about 6 months prior to the date. All stakeholders including faculty, students, and administrative staff were actively involved in the organization and preparation. Apart from the Convenor, there were 4 Co Convenors, who were assisted by an Organising Committee, composed of teachers from all departments. Specific committees prepared the concept note, brochure, and a schedule of technical sessions. Departments were encouraged to organize panel discussions on a particular aspect of the main theme. There were 6 technical sessions on key and critical aspects of NEP 2020. The various committees coordinated with each other and also with the non-teaching staff, regarding discipline and refreshments. Each session had a dedicated team of teachers and students who handled registration and provided technical support. Paper and Poster presentations were organized for both faculty and students. Active student participation was ensured by each department, which nominated them as coordinators, volunteers, and compers. The Photography and Film-making student societies were also involved in recording and photographing the sessions.

6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/perspective plan is effectively deployed

We as an institution foster and encourage quality research through our Research and Development Cell (RDC), set up in 2022, which has meaningfully informed teachers and students about research opportunities as well as helped faculty upgrade their research skills meaningfully. Such training has helped acclimatize new faculty into the academic environment as well as aided senior faculty update their curricular and research knowledge. Training regarding best practices and standards as well as publication guidelines helps sustain a research culture despite our undergraduate teaching profile, as evinced by the prestigious projects and grants our researchers have brought in from nationallevel state-funded bodies like the National Medicinal Plant Board (NMPB), AYUSH Ministry, the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology and others like National Academy of Sciences, India (NASI), with awards totaling to approximately Rupees 33 lakhs. In addition 3 national patents, 8 books published by houses of repute like Routledge, Elsevier, and Springer Nature, close to 50 book chapters, and more than 100 research articles of which 28 were published in Scopus Indexed journals, 14 in Web of Science and 19 in the UGC CARE list demonstrate commitment to quality research.

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6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

As a constituent college of the University of Delhi, the college is governed by the statutes, ordinances, and regulations of the University which mandate a fifteen member Governing Body including a Chairperson, Treasurer, Principal, two teacher representatives, and one representative member from the non-teaching staff. The Staff Council through its duly constituted committees, especially the IQAC, is the key body aiding and advising the Principal in the administration of the college through committees constituted to administer all aspects of college life, from student admissions to staff requirements to co-curricular activities. Individual departments are helmed by Teachers-in-Charge, and by rotation of seniority, head individual departments. The various student bodies, functioning under the umbrella of the student union, and mandated bodies like NCC, NSS, and WDC are all overseen by teacher convenors. All parties report to the Principal, who serves as the nodal and reporting officer for all staff. The administrative office, laboratory, karamchari, and security staff are headed by the Administrative Officer (AO) and the Library staff is by the Librarian. The college also has a duly constituted ICC, Antiragging, and other legally mandated mechanisms as stipulated by the University of Delhi.

All schemes and rights are available to teachers including pensions/gratuity, medical (including WUS/CGHS panel), educational and travel benefits/reimbursements, childcare leave, study and sabbatical leave, leave for deputation to attend fellowships are duly and speedily processed so that all staff is enabled in their lives.

Ward Quota Admission benefits are provided to the wards of all staff members; non-teaching staff wards are also given the benefit of freeships. Our Daycare facility, created with funds from a UGC Plan grant, is available to use for all staff, facilitating child care for those with young children. The college clinic offers medical assistance to all staff. There are sixteen staff quarters - ten for non-teaching staff, five for teaching, and one for the College Principal - facilitating on-site residence, which improves employee quality of life and also serves as a massive support in the day-to-day college functioning.

Staff skill upgradation for career growth is encouraged, through participation in Faculty Development Programmes, Orientation Courses, Refreshment Courses, Workshops, Paper presentations. Staff benefit from a convivial and collegial environment with facilities including co-working staff rooms, open-air gym and lawns, full Internet availability and institutional email IDs, and routine updates regarding College and University activities.

he college provides a conducive and enabling environment so that all staff can meet the performance-related goals, whether teaching-learning or administrative, set for their career enhancement and promotions. All staff annually submit APARs as per prevailing

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rules.

Faculty submit their APARs online through the college website. Faculty appraisal as required for promotions through the CAS 2018 using API (Academic Performance Indicator) format and PBAS (Performance Based Appraisal System) is based on the annual performance on the basis of classroom teaching, research publications, co-curricular activities, including training and upskilling through faculty development programs, academic seminars, duties related to evaluation, contribution through Staff Council committees including academic monitoring committees and other administrative duties. The APAR is duly appraised by the reporting officer.

The non-teaching members submit a hard copy of their APAR to their reviewing officers forwarded by the reporting officer. The promotion for the non-teaching members is through two duly approved channels: first, seniority-cum-fitness based promotion on completion of five years of service and after reviewing the ACR of the candidate, and Limited Department Exams (LDE) are conducted specifically for the administrative staff in case of a vacancy and multiple candidates.

As a constituent college of the University of Delhi, 95% of our funds are derived from the UGC and 5% is funded by the Delhi Administration.

The College prepares the budget for each financial year in the month of April keeping in mind the expenditure likely to be done under various heads and the same is forwarded to the University Grants Commission for the allocation of funds.

Every year in the month of September, the University Grants Commission asks for a revised budget estimate from the College for the final allocation of funds.

Every year, the Delhi government sanctions approximately 5% of the

fund, subject to the sanctioned strength of the students.

The College utilizes the funds on revenue expenses, students, and infrastructure requirements as and when required in the best possible way.

The college also receives some scholarships and awards from organizations and individuals (usually from staff members, superannuated teaching staff, former Principals, and individual philanthropists). These are awarded to students every year on Annual Day after the students have fulfilled the specific award criteria.

6.5.1 - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes

The IQAC Gargi College has taken active initiative to improve teaching-learning

in Gargi by encouraging creativity in various levels of knowledge production and sharing. Through periodic meetings with teachers in charge of departments to chart out academic endeavors for 2023-2024, efforts are made to conduct collaborative activities that bring together multiple disciplines. The four national and international conferences that the college hosted in the 2023-24 academic year on areas ranging from the National Education Policy to Ageing/Elderly issues, Financial Literacy to Bioinformatics. In each arena, the college received funds from major sources to create these platforms for experts in the fields and for our faculty and students to present their work to the public. The IQAC has supervised and recommended the signing of various MoUs with institutions that will provide students and staff with resources and opportunities to contribute to society. The MoUs have various focal points, such as community outreach (Government College Zanskar, Ladakh) and skill upgradation and training (ICT Academy), integrating mental health with aspects of pedagogy and communal

life (MoUs with Institute of Human Behaviour and Allied Sciences, IHBAS and Rekhi Foundation of Happiness), Google (upgradation of computer labs), K.R. Mangalam University (student and faculty exchange initiatives).

Teaching-learning processes have been strengthened by encouraging students to co-create research with their teachers through our Pathfinder competition, which sees considerable participation from all streams of students. In 2023-24, Rs 25,000 was awarded in the science stream and Rs 15,000 each to the humanities and commerce streams in the form of prizes to successful students who undertake research projects on various areas of interest. The competition is interdisciplinary and allows students and teachers to work together on areas drawing from the curriculum, yet breaking new ground. Five students from Commerce Stream, seven in humanities, and thirteen from science received awards in the academic year 2023-24.

Second, integrating classroom pedagogy with field visits and handson exposure.

Training in various subjects has helped students to learn more deeply and holistically. An

an example is the English Department's SEC course Visual Communication and Photography, where students are taken to see art and culture in various museums and other sites in Delhi. Similarly, visits by the Chemistry Department to IISF 2023, the History Department visit to the National Archives, and the B.El.Ed. Department participating in the Astronomy workshop at Nehru Planetarium aid in obtaining a deep understanding of the field, subject, and skill creation.

Regular psychological support is available to students through professional counselling services, peer to peer support through Izhaar, regular training by Ananda and close supervision by teachers with their 25 mentees ensuring a holistic approach to well-being.

The College implementscompostingpractices to promotesustainable waste management practices. In the microbiology laboratories, all unwanted and used microbial cultures and culture media are first sterilized by autoclaving to kill all microbes present before being disposed off safely in garbage bags in order to prevent any health hazard. No radioactive compound/material is used in the campus.

Similarly, the labs prioritize minimizing waste through innovative experiments: organic compounds synthesized by students are reused whenever possible, and organic solvents are frequently distilled before being reused. Waste materials from experiments such as unreacted sodium metal and phenol-water mixtures are disposed of responsibly, helping to reduce overall waste generation.

Further solid waste management efforts include distributing dustbins across campus, raising awareness about waste segregation, and arranging transportation for effective solid waste management. There are also other e-waste collection points across campus. Collectively, these efforts contribute to a more sustainable and environmentally conscious campus community.

1. Community Outreach

Our college is dedicated to transformative community outreach, empowering students to engage with and uplift local neighborhoods. This engagement fosters awareness of community needs and offers hands-on learning opportunities. We organized various blood donation, food and clothes donation drives, awareness campaigns, socio-emotional skills training, mental health support for marginalized groups. Gargi helped support the livelihoods of local artisans, and created successful collaborations with the specialneeds (neurodiverse) and elderly individuals. Students contributed 1,000 internship service hours with Cheshire Home. To enhance our efforts, longer semesters and additional financial and logistical support are needed for our outreach initiatives.

2. Environment Sustainability.

Gargi College aims to promote environmental conservation and sustainable development. We endeavour to minimize our carbon footprint through sustainable initiatives, applying the 5Rs: refuse, reduce, reuse, repurpose and recycle. Our efforts include application of waste management strategies, workshops on Environmental Studies for creating awareness and sensitisation, cleanliness and plantation drives, minimizing plastic and paper use and incorporating sensitisation within classroom teaching. Collaborating with IPCA, we launched a 10 kg plastic waste collection program and organized field trips to sewage treatment plants and organic farms. Short-term courses on 'Waste Management and Sustainability' and 'Eco-Friendly Agriculture' were also offered.

Wellbeing

Gargi College places a premium on the wellbeing of all Gargi members and actively cultivates the collective wellbeing of community and nature on which individual wellbeing is dependent.
