15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The ethos of the National Education Policy (NEP) is woven around the principles of multidisciplinary and holistic education, which we have enthusiastically embraced at Gargi College. With the NEP now in full swing across all academic years, interdisciplinary education has become the cornerstone of our educational framework. Our Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) exemplifies this by mandating that students choose at least four elective papers from disciplines outside their core areas of study. These Generic Electives are designed to provide an interdisciplinary approach to education, ensuring the unity and integrity of all knowledge. Not only in academics, but also in extracurricular activities, we adopt and welcome interdisciplinary approaches, recognizing the

limitations of drawing knowledge from a single discipline when addressing societal problems. For instance, the Pathfinder Award encourages students to identify problems significant to youth, with faculty from any discipline mentoring them. Gargi College has a wellestablished culture of organizing seminars, conferences, and workshops that transcend specific disciplinary perspectives. The themes of our seminars, webinars, workshops, conferences, and departmental festivals are carefully selected to broaden students' knowledge base and address contemporary concerns. Our add-on courses are designed with an integrated approach, honing the skills needed for problem-solving and creative thinking. For example, we recently organized a conference on the NEP, aimed at educating and sensitizing our academic fraternity about the opportunities and challenges posed by the policy. Other events organized in college, such as a conference on revisiting well-being and empowering the golden years (a conference aimed at empathizing with the problems of the elderly and finding ways to make them feel empowered) further reinforce our multidisciplinary approach, ensuring our students receive a well-rounded education that prepares them for the complexities of the modern world. These initiatives reinforce our commitment to a multidisciplinary and holistic education system that spans all genres, including science, humanities, sports, and commerce. Through these efforts, we aim to instill a deep appreciation for the interconnectedness of all fields of knowledge, thus truly embodying the spirit of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary education in practice.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Gargi College implements the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system in line with the directive policies of the University of Delhi and National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. As a constituent college of Delhi University, we cannot independently establish our own policy on academic credits, and therefore rely on guidance and approval from the university's academic bodies. The ABC system of credits is designed to provide students with greater flexibility and mobility in their educational journey, allowing them to take courses across different disciplines and accumulate credits, thus promoting a multidisciplinary education. Gargi College is well-equipped to provide an interdisciplinary approach, offering a wide range of courses from various disciplines to enhance students' chosen programs, forming the basis for creating academic credits and also enabling students to personalize their educational experiences, fostering a more inclusive and adaptable learning environment. Institutions with which we have established MOUs for knowledge sharing and support under the Vidya Vistar Scheme are eager to

participate in credit-based courses at our institution, validated by our university. This alignment with the ABC system demonstrates our commitment to providing a flexible and comprehensive education, enabling our students to succeed in a diverse and changing world.

17.Skill development:

At Gargi College, we prioritize skill development among our students through innovative and practical-teaching methodology. Gargi College is one of the first institutions to realize the significance of "skill development" and started add-on courses over two decades ago, inviting industry experts to train our students to hone both their soft and hard skills thus facilitating a smoother transition to workplaces. Hands-on-training sessions, workshops, and short-term online/offline courses organized by individual departments and the student body/placement cell, in addition to multiple add-on courses, facilitate experiential learning among our students. These initiatives are instrumental in addressing the objective of skillbuilding across various domains of science, humanities and commerce. With the National Education Policy (NEP) now fully implemented across all academic years, the importance of developing skilled manpower and fostering innovation has been further highlighted for overall national development. The essence of the NEP suggests that employability prospects are improved for candidates with versatile skill sets, as industries and work sectors in contemporary times are discipline-agnostic. In alignment with the NEP, the university has mandated each department/discipline to offer a Skill-Enhancement Course every semester from a pool of courses designed for improving competency, proficiency, and skills. Students across disciplines have the opportunity to choose from a diverse array of skill enhancement courses, the one which they feel will most effectively enhance their industry and corporate preparedness. Thus both within and beyond the curriculum, we at Gargi are diligently focused on fostering the skill development of our students.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The NEP, 2020 recognizes the rich heritage of ancient and eternal Indian knowledge and thought as a guiding principle. Gargi College takes immense pride to have derived its name from Vidushi Gargi of Brihadaranyaka Upanishad of the Vedic Age who embodied the spirit of inquiry juxtaposed with faith as is shown by her challenging questions to the great sage Yajnavalkya. At Gargi, we aim to instill this spirit in our students, encouraging them to validate and only then implement knowledge into practice. The very essence of Gargi College is thus deeply rooted in the Indian Knowledge System,

evolving from experience, observation, experimentation, and rigorous analysis. Besides, the Indian Knowledge System Committee at Gargi College is actively engaged towards promoting a sense of belief, value and appreciation for our Indian Knowledge systems among our students. However, as a constituent college of a central university, we are also mindful of the inherent linguistic, cultural, and regional diversity among both students and staff, and its implications for citizenship education. We recognize the historical consequences of colonialism in perpetuating linguistic inequalities and privileging certain knowledge systems over others, thereby endangering knowledge available in Indian languages and hindering the nation's growth. To address this, we advocate for our faculty members to engage with students using both Hindi and English. Furthermore, we encourage them to incorporate examples from their own languages and cultures to nurture self-esteem, encourage peer interaction, and foster mutual respect among students. Cultural, performing and non-performing societies such as dance, music, drama, and creative writing focus on educating students about the plurality of Indian culture, which is both Indian and universal. The campus's 'sacred garden' serves as a context to explore the Indian knowledge system without disciplinary boundaries, while programs on Indian languages and English language courses provide opportunities to engage with scholarship in all languages.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

In the NEP system, each course is meticulously designed with a focus on its outcomes and relevance to the program. Even prior to NEP, in the Choice Based Credit System, the learning-outcome-curriculumframework (LOCF) clearly outlined the outcomes of every paper and program of study. In order to be able to effectively translate these outcomes into tangible realities during curriculum transactions, faculty members regularly undergo training provided by the university through orientation and refresher programs. Additionally, teachers independently enhance their skills by participating in Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) and workshops, thereby staying updated with emerging technologies. They also identify employment opportunities within their domains to better align the curriculum with industry needs and expectations. Our alumni play a crucial role in bridging the gap between academia and industry by sharing their experiences. Career counseling sessions conducted by alumni shed light on research opportunities in their respective fields. Cocurricular activities, including online quizzes, competitions, webinars, and paper presentations, empower students to express themselves innovatively and prepare them for future work contexts across industries. Gargi College's dedication to outcome-based

education, evident in both the NEP system and the prior Choice Based Credit System, ensures that students receive a comprehensive education aligned with industry demands, supported by ongoing teacher training, alumni engagement, and a rich array of cocurricular activities.

20.Distance education/online education:

The apprehensions and hesitations of embracing technology in teaching and learning through distance mode dissipated during the COVID-19 pandemic. Following this, with the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP), significant emphasis has been placed on distance education and online learning as essential components of the educational landscape. Recognizing the transformative potential of technology, the NEP advocates for the use of digital platforms to ensure equitable access to quality education, especially in remote areas. At Gargi College, faculty members are diligently working to embrace the e-space of knowledgesharing through online lectures (PPTs, MOOCS, SWAYAM, video presentations, useful online links to various sites, etc.). Faculty members are enthusiastically working towards enhancing their digital literacy skills by familiarizing themselves with online teaching tools, learning management systems (LMS), and other relevant technology platforms. Post-COVID, the shift towards a blended mode of education has facilitated global interaction and the exchange of ideas, making the world more interconnected. Emergence of webinars and online Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) has continued benefiting a larger audience than previously possible. Despite these advancements, the challenge remains to strike a balance between leveraging these opportunities and maintaining reasonable work schedules while prioritizing the well-being of all stakeholders. ur commitment towards an inclusive learning environment remains unwavering, and we are continuously striving to enhance and expand our distance education initiatives to meet the evolving needs of our students.

At Gargi College, transparency in the internal assessment system is paramount. The college mandates clear communication of assessment criteria, procedures, and schedules to students at the beginning of each course and during the orientation. The same is also uploaded on the college website. For the faculty, the assessment criteria's have been cleared specified in the college registers for both Internal Assessment (IA) and Continuous Assessment (CA).

The assessment processes at Gargi College are designed to be participatory and inclusive. Students are encouraged to engage in self-assessment and peer-assessment activities, fostering a deeper understanding of the evaluation criteria and promoting a culture of accountability and mutual respect. 2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

We have constituted an Internal Assessment Committee to handle IA and CA related issues. The committee follows university guidelines to ensure a transparent, timely, and fair process. Students can talk to their teacher, the Teacher-in-Charge (TIC), or any committee member if they have concerns.

The committee sets deadlines for mark submission, teacher and student verification, office submission, and final posting on the University portal and college website. This ensures a smooth assessment process involving students at every stage.

According to the National Education Policy (NEP), each subject has different components for Internal Assessment (IA) and Continuous Assessment (CA). At the start of the course, teachers explain these components and the assessment process to the students. Teachers and students can discuss and choose the mode of continuous assessment.

Throughout the semester, assessments are conducted, and teachers give feedback. Students can ask questions and seek clarifications. If a student misses an exam due to valid reasons, they can take a re-test. Evaluated answer sheets and attendance marks are shown to students for transparency. Any discrepancies are resolved by the respective teacher. Students who want to improve their scores can take a re-test. Once verified and signed, the assessment sheets are submitted to the office

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college has excellent infrastructure spanning across 9.198 acres with multi-storey buildings interconnected by long corridors. Currently expanding, it features numerous classrooms, laboratories, and lecture halls. Unique offerings include professional courses like B.El.Ed. and B.B.E. alongside traditional disciplines.

Classrooms are distributed across Arts, Commerce, and Science blocks, including 4 lecture theatres and additional rooms equipped with LCD projectors. Innovative bamboo huts serve as flexible spaces for teaching, meetings, and extracurricular activities.

Science facilities encompass 21 labs for Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, and Microbiology, with specialized areas like Bioinformatics and nanotechnology research. Each lab is well-equipped with necessary apparatus, ACs, and safety measures like fire extinguishers and exhaust systems.

Computer Labs, totaling 3, maintain a 1:1 student-to-computer ratio and support practical classes and administrative functions. The college emphasizes digital administration with workshops for staff training.

Projectors are available in most of the classrooms and departments, enhancing educational delivery. Comprehensive fire safety measures include 62 fire extinguishers strategically placed throughout campus facilities.

In summary, the college's infrastructure supports a wide array of academic and extracurricular activities, fostering an environment conducive to learning and innovation.

The college has a 750-seat Auditorium and a Seminar Hall seating 100-120, renowned for hosting cultural events, inter-college competitions, and society festivals. During festivals, the spacious foyer and Arts Quad serve additional purposes. Societies like the Fine Arts Society have designated storage, while debate and non-performing societies use lecture theatres equipped with projectors and mics for activities. Dance societies utilize the basement Audi foyer for practice, doubling as a secure storage area.

An Open Air Theatre behind the office block offers seating on adjoining steps and lush lawns, ideal for outdoor events like Street Plays. The college supports diverse extracurricular activities, including NCC's adventurous pursuits and ANANDA: Well-Being Center's focus on mental and physical health with workshops and community programs.

Other amenities include a botanical garden, rainwater harvesting system, bookshop, and xerox center. The sports facilities feature a 200m grass track, basketball court, cricket pitches with advanced equipment, synthetic tennis and volleyball courts, long jump pit, and fitness training equipment.

Maintenance of the building is managed by building maintenance committee. The committee holds meetings every now and then to take care of the requirements of repair and take action accordingly. The lab equipment are maintained by the respective departments with the help of dedicated lab staff. Each lab attendant maintains cleanliness and washes glassware, supporting lab assistants as needed. Assistants oversee attendants, prepare reagents, and manage inventory and expenses. Plans are in place for coverage during staff absences.

Repairs for equipment and electrical systems are promptly reported and resolved. Some labs are equipped with projectors used for teaching and student presentations. The college-wide Wi-Fi supports research, teaching, and administrative tasks.

New instrument acquisition is ongoing to replace outdated equipment and accommodate increasing student numbers.

Resource utilization is optimized through systematic procedures:

- The library receives lists of essential reading from departments and promotes regular student visits. Digital library access requires college Wi-Fi.
- Departments schedule computer lab use, equipped with internet, Wi-Fi, and specialized software, headphones aid in video lectures.
- Classrooms are allocated based on class size, with projectors enhancing teaching efficiency.
- Sports facilities are open to students with scheduled activities and events to promote participation among staff and students.

6.1.2 - The effective leadership is visible in various institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management.

As part of the centenary celebrations of the University of Delhi, Gargi College organized a two-day, multidimensional, interdisciplinary conference on Revisiting Wellbeing: Perspectives, Challenges and the Road Ahead. Preparations for a successful conference started about 6 months prior to the date. All stakeholders, including faculty, administrative staff, and students, were actively involved in the organization and preparation. An Organising Committee and a Core Committee, composed of teachers from different departments were formed to prepare the brochure and concept note and finalize a tentative schedule. All departments of the college were encouraged to collaborate and organize panel discussions and workshops on a particular aspect of the main theme. There were 4 technical sessions and 4 workshops, organized by mutual collaboration between 3 to 4 departments, with teacher core committees responsible for concept notes, expert selection, and logistics. Each department nominated teachers and students who would participate in the conference as paper presenters, volunteers, and comperes. Papers were presented by both students and teachers from Gargi and other colleges. 56 paper presentations were conducted, 49 offline and 7 online, on a wide array of topics, ranging from technology management to spirituality, from climate change to psychosocial oncology, from financial inclusion to SMEs.

6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/perspective plan is effectively deployed

One of our challenges as an undergraduate institution has been how to channelize resources adequately for research, as a supplement to teaching. To address this, a Research and Development Cell (RDC) has been set up in 2022 which informs teachers and students about research opportunities, streamlining information gathering meaningfully for staff, as well as conducts training to develop and enhance research capabilities and awareness. Starting in October 2022, the RDC organized a series of programs with the goal to complement teaching and research in view of NEP and to guide faculty members on how to conduct quality research that results in impactful publications. Training regarding best practices and standards as well as publication guidelines is also provided to update teachers' preparation to help face the ever-evolving academic environment. An example of this was the inaugural lecture by Prof Asani Bhaduri which addressed the question of standards in research, Journal metrics, indexing sites, and how researchers can build accessible profiles so that their research reaches the larger world of academia. The RDC of the college has since routinely emailed teachers from the sciences to the humanities, about a wide variety of grants, fellowships, and research avenues in a timely manner so that potential applicants can meet deadlines.

6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

The college is a constituent college of the University of Delhi and is governed by the statutes, ordinances, and regulations of the University of Delhi. Our Governing Body has fifteen members including Chairperson, Treasurer, Principal, two teacher representatives, and one representative member from the non-teaching staff. The Staff Council, with its duly constituted committees, is the key body aiding and advising the Principal in the administration of the college through the committees constituted herein that oversee all aspects of college life, from students admissions to staff requirements to co-curricular

activities. Individual departments are helmed by Teachers-in-Charge, a position occupied and rotated according to seniority; similarly, the various student bodies, functioning under the umbrella of the student union, and mandated bodies like NCC, NSS, and WDC have their designated teacher convenors to supervise internal administration. All parties report to the Principal, who serves as the nodal and reporting officer for all staff. The administrative office, laboratory, karamchari, and security staff are headed by the Administrative Officer (AO), and the Library staff by the Librarian. The college also has a duly constituted ICC, Anti-ragging, and other support mechanisms for students as mandated by the University of Delhi in keeping with current laws.

The college clinic offers medical assistance to all staff. There are sixteen staff quarters - ten for non-teaching staff, five for teaching, and one for the College Principal - facilitating on-site residence, which improves employee quality of life and also serves as a massive support in the day-to-day college functioning.

Staff skill upgradation for career growth is encouraged, through participation in Faculty Development Programmes, Orientation Courses, Refreshment Courses, Workshops, Paper presentations. Staff benefit from a convivial and collegial environment with facilities including co-working staff rooms, open-air gym and lawns, full Internet availability and institutional email IDs, and routine updates regarding College and University activities.

The promotion for the non teaching members is through two duly approved channels: first, seniority-cum-fitness based promotion on completion of five years of service and after reviewing the ACR of the candidate, and Limited Department Exams (LDE) are conducted specifically for the administrative staff in case of a vacancy and multiple candidates.

The College prepares the budget for each financial year in the month of April keeping in mind the expenditure likely to be done under various heads and the same is forwarded to the University Grants Commission for the allocation of funds.

Every year in the month of September, the University Grants Commission asks for a revised budget estimate from the College for the final allocation of funds.

Every year, Delhi government sanctions us approximately 5% of the fund, subject to the sanctioned strength of the students.

The College utilizes the funds on revenue expenses, students and infrastructure requirements as and when required in the best possible way.

The college also receives some scholarships and awards from organizations and individuals (usually from staff members, superannuated teaching staff, former Principals, and individual philanthropists). These are awarded to students every year on Annual Day, after the students have fulfilled the specific award criteria.

For example, through one such collaboration, the college has contributed to the educational enrichment of Government Model Degree College Zanskar of the University of UT Ladakh, by providing lectures on specific topics. Upskilling of faculty through FDPs and other training organized by agencies with whom we have collaboration has enhanced skills for staff and students. Interdisciplinary collaborations between departments which foster connections with industry and experts in the field have been strengthened. Additional networking possibilities in the form of active alumni associations have been explored. Opportunities for students' career advancement have successfully integrated with the mainstream of college life by enhanced Placement Cell activity to which sustained mentoring activity has been added. Each student is assigned a teacher-mentor who helps them develop their overall personality through counselling, self-development, feedback on the teaching-learning process and career guidance, thus aiding holistic progress for students by refining several aspects of personality growth, communication skills, presentation skills, teamwork and leadership qualities.

Through focused formal and informal meetings with various stakeholders, the IQAC has helped to integrate various processes that contribute to academic excellence. We have incorporated inputs and suggestions emerging from previous assessment cycles to

refine and enhance learning beyond the classroom, to encourage internships and on-site or industry visits to strengthen student understanding of the curriculum. We implement progressively better learning methods guided by our focus on understanding the student experience. Teachers focussed contact with students through rigorous mentoring processes has helped refine the performance of academic and administrative tasks such as work allocation, timetable preparation, internal assessment and examinations by making us aware of how better to meet student needs. Teaching through lectures, tutorials, practicals utilizes conventional and ICT methods; techniques to improve learning experiences including small group learning, interactive feedback and focussed guidance based on student needs have been institutionalised. All departments have elected student bodies that are important avenues for student co-curricular learning, leadership, skill-training and peer networking which strengthen the teaching-learning process. Academic and co-curricular societies orient students on activities like enrichment lectures, intra- and inter-college cultural programs and competitions, elections to various student bodies and opportunities like internships and placements. Departmental magazines supervised by faculty also offer training in various skills such as writing, editing, research and presentation, which are important in student growth.

The Centre for Diversity and Inclusion, comprising societies like the White Rose Club and Izhaar, spearheads initiatives aimed at advancing gender equity. These include awareness campaigns and inclusive discussions which frequently addresses issues pertinent to LGBTQIA+ community. Unmukti, the Women Development Centre provides support on various issues affecting women and gender minorities. Through workshops, film screenings, book discussions, and interactive sessions, it actively addresses concerns in the community. The annual fest had sessions on child sexual abuse, women's revolution, and acid attacks, etc. Unmukti runs a daycare center for staff and students' children and has installed sanitary pad machines on campus. Regular counseling with a psychologist available to students. With safety being paramount, the college implements various measures like CCTV surveillance, restricted entry, and the presence of female guards.

The college has taken proactive steps to reduce plastic usage on campus. Students are encouraged to opt for eco-friendly alternatives like 'kulhads' instead of plastic or paper cups. Strict guidelines ensure a clean and hygienic environment, with emphasis on no littering and proper waste disposal in designated dustbins. In the botany department, composting techniques are being practiced promoting sustainable waste management practices. The microbiology laboratories follow rigorous protocols for waste disposal, including autoclaving liquid and solid waste from media preparation before safe disposal in garbage bags, with a commitment to avoiding the use of radioactive compounds. Similarly, the chemistry laboratory prioritizes waste minimization through innovative experiments. Organic compounds synthesized by students are reused whenever feasible, while organic solvents undergo frequent distillation for reuse. Waste from experiments, such as unreacted sodium metal and phenol-water mixtures, is

managed responsibly, contributing to a reduction in overall waste generation. Additional measures for solid waste management include distributing dustbins across the campus, raising awareness about waste segregation, and arranging transportation for efficient solid waste management. Further e-waste collection facilities are also available on campus. These initiatives collectively contribute to a more sustainable and environmentally conscious campus community.
