Selection via Auditions

During the pandemic, auditions for membership were held through a two stage process.

In the first phase, a list of songs was provided along with the registration form, and students were asked to submit a 2-3 minute video of themselves singing one of the songs along with their application.

In the second phase, a few shortlisted candidates were invited to perform two songs live via google meet, and about 2-3 people on an average were selected to be part of the society based on their performances.

Decisions regarding the evaluations of the candidates and selection of the new members were made on a democratic basis, taking everyone's input into account

ANNUAL COMPOSITIONS

Each year, Samranjini prepares its annual composition, which is a mellifluous product of in depth musical knowledge, creativity and countless hours of constant practice and improvisation. The motive is to convey a mood through the piece, presenting an atmosphere that is bound to leave a strong impression. Therefore, the first thing to be decided is the overall theme or sentiments that one wishes to convey to the listener. Thereafter, raagas that cater to the thematic purpose of the performance are chosen and compositions taht are set in those particular ragas are selected and made part of the overall piece.

Samranjini has most often indulged in the Hindustani tunes of Khyaals and Taranas, that are brought together and merged in a myriad of symphonies and melodies to make up the composition. We also rely heavily on traditional improvisational devices of Indian classical music such as taans, alap, and other such embellishments to further elevate our rendition of the chosen pieces. In between, the instrumentalists are also given space to display much valued and beautifying additions to the composition. The annual composition is this, the final product of this musical synergy.

Due to restrictions on offline activities during the pandemic, the society maintained its presence through social media.


As such, a *Raagmala Series* was proposed, wherein the members were grouped together and asked to render a composition in certain raagas, which were then uploaded to instagram.


Information including historical background, evolution, significance and meaning of the raaga and the composition were also included in the posts




