On behalf of the Gargi family its principal, distinguished faculty, staff and my dear students, I extend a warm welcome to you all on this august occasion of **Gargi College Day**.

Today is indeed a day of historical importance for our college, that on this World Science Day, we have as our Chief Guest, the eminent scientist, Professor M. G. K. Menon. A former Minister for Science and Technology and also for Education, a Member of the Rajya Sabha during 1990-96, Scientific Advisor to the Prime Minister of India, Prof. Menon's contributions in the field of Energy, Space Research and Science and Technology are enormous and inspiring. He is currently Advisor to The Indian Space Research Organization, President of Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta and of the India International Centre, Delhi. He was awarded a Ph.D. degree by the University of Bristol, UK in 1953, which was followed by Honorary Doctorates conferred by a number of Universities in India and abroad. He is a Fellow and former President of all three Science Academies in India. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society, London, The Institute of Physics, UK and a Founding Fellow of the Third World Academy of Sciences. He has been Director of Tata Institute of Fundamental Research. Director General of Council of Scientific and Industrial Research and Chairman, Commission for Additional Sources of Energy, a subject of vital importance in our over-populated world. He has also been Secretary to the Government of India in the Departments of Electronics, Science and Technology, Defence Research and Environment. He was awarded Padma Shri in 1961, Padma Bhushan in 1968 and Padma Vibhushan in 1985.

Sir, your presence in our College is a great honour to us and we keenly look forward to your address.

It is indeed a matter of delight that our Guest of Honour today is Dean, Planning, University of Delhi. Prof. Vivek Suneja teaches Strategy and International Business at the Faculty of Management Studies. As a Felix Scholar, Prof. Suneja studied for his Doctorate at the University of Reading, UK, supervised by Prof. Mark Casson, the founding father of the discipline of International Business Strategy. Prof. Suneja has worked in prestigious international institutions including the University of Salford (Manchester), University of Reading and the Open University Business School, UK. He has also been teaching on the Oxford study abroad program of George Mason University, Washington, USA. Prof. Suneja has done consulting work for several leading International firms. His research is in the areas of Strategic Management, International Business, Marketing and Economic Policy. Gargi College is lucky to have as Chairman of its Governing Body, Professor G. K. Chadha, Professor Emeritus and former Vice Chancellor of Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. He is also Emeritus Fellow (Economics) of University Grants Commission and a Member of the Economic Advisory Council of the Prime Minister of India. He has had an illustrious academic career with a teaching experience of 38 years, authorship of 16 books and 85 research papers published in national and international journals. He has been Visiting Fellow at Institute of Development Studies, University of Sussex, England; Visiting Research Fellow at Institute of Developing Economics, Tokyo and a Visiting Professor at University of Mauritius. He is currently an Honorary Professor at Shenzhen University, China and Nihon Fukushi University, Japan, as well as a member of the International Advisory Board of the Centre for Development Research, Colombo. He has also been consultant to several international development organizations such as FAO, ILO, UNCTAD and ESCAP among others. He has been President of the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics and Society of Labour Economics and

is currently President of the Indian Economic Association. Recipient of numerous awards, the latest honour conferred on him is an honourary D.Litt degree by Panjab University, Chandigarh.

Gargi College was established in 1967. It was yet another year of achievements and multifarious events.

HALL OF FAME

1. Academic:

Gargi College offers 17 academic disciplines in all three streams: Arts, Science and Commerce at Pass and Honours levels and two career-oriented degrees, B.A. (Hons.) in Business Economics (introduced in the current year) and B.A. in Elementary Education. Three disciplines are offered at the post-graduate level. More than 2000 students appeared in university examinations of 2007. 822 students obtained first division, while pass percentage in all disciplines ranges from 96 to 100 percent. 53 students were placed among top five positions in Delhi University or its South Campus.

First Positions in Delhi University

Meera Sharma has been awarded DU's Shankaracharya Swanandashram Hari Prize for standing first in the University in B.A. (Hons.) Sanskrit III year with 82%. She has also given several public lectures on the Bhagavatam and won much media acclaim. Shalini Rao has received Delhi University gold medal for obtaining first position in the University in B.A. (Hons.) Applied Psychology III year. Shivani Kapur has secured the first position in the University in B.A. (Hons.) Applied Psychology II year. Pooja Ghosh has stood first in the University in B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany II year. In Botany (Hons.) I year, the first 5 positions of

Delhi University were bagged by Gargi College. Aditi Goel and Sneha Datta share the top position in the University. Manpreet Kaur of Microbiology (H) II year and Niharika Singh of I year of the same course stood first in the University. Divya Choudhary of B.El.Ed. II year has topped in the University.

2. Sports

Gargi College strives to achieve excellence in sports and our students receive intense coaching by professionals in volleyball, cricket, basketball, chess, yoga, table tennis and Judo. Besides those selected to represent the college in these fields, all students are encouraged to participate in march-past, athletics, aerobics and other events on the annual sports day. Ms. Anjum Chopra, the distinguished Arjuna Awardee woman cricketer of India was the Chief Guest of this year's sports. The following are some of the highlights of this year's achievements in competitive and other sports:

Parineeta Chauhan climbed Mt. Mulkila at a height of 6517 meters in an All Women Moutaineering expedition. She has now been selected to climb Mt. Cho Yu, an 8000 meters high peak in Nepal in the month of April.

Gunjan Kumar bagged two Gold Medals in the 22nd ITF Taekwon-Do Championship.

Pushpa Lakra bagged the Gold Medal in 800 Meters and the bronze medal in 400 Meters races at the Delhi State Athletic Meet and was placed in the second position at the Delhi State Cross Country Championships 'under 20' category.

Meenakshi Naudiyal was placed sixth in the Delhi State Cross Country Championship and won the Bronze Medal in the 10,000 Meters race at the Delhi State Athletic Meet. Puneeta Kapoor won the Bronze Medal in Discus Throw in the same event, while Anumeha and Amulya Janardan won the Bronze Medal in 100 Meters and 200 Meters respectively.

Avalpreet Kaur won the Silver Medal and **Monica Goswami**, **Deepika** and **Manu Tanwar** won the Bronze Medals in the inter-college Judo tournaments.

The following students were selected to be in the Delhi University team for different inter-university tournaments:

University which won the gold medal in the All India Inter-Varsity championships.

Geetanjali Rana and **Preeti Bhandari** in Volleyball. Geetanjali Rana also represented Delhi State in the Senior National Volleyball Tournament and was highly commended for her game.

Jyoti Saini in Handball, also represented Delhi State in the Senior National Handball tournament. Jyoti Saini, Neha Sejwal and Preeti Bhandari represented Delhi State in the Federation Cup Handball Tournament held at Bhilai.

The Gargi tennis and volleyball teams won second positions and the Basketball team was placed third respectively in different inter-college tournaments. The cross country team won fourth position.

3. Cultural:

It is the policy of Gargi College to encourage students to express their creativity in diverse art forms by providing professional training and facilities for participation in competitions in diverse venues in and outside Delhi. The organization of our annual three-day festival Reverie is now increasingly being carried out by students, a testimony to the highly promising youth power of India. The festival hones their skills in leadership, teamwork, negotiating power with sponsors and service providers and sensitivity to contemporary issues. The Student Council deserves great appreciation for carrying through Reverie 07 on the theme "Be the Light" with great success. It is indeed praiseworthy that the different cultural societies in the college have adopted contemporary issues as themes in their art forms. The state of our education system, stress related disorders such as anorexia, schizophrenia as well as suicide and women empowerment were sensitively presented this year.

- Upstage, The Dramatics society won the Best Play award at Mata Sundri and at Gargi, 2nd Best at LIC and 3rd prize at IIT Kanpur. It was also selected for performance at National School of Drama. Swati Budhwar, Ananya and Simran won Best Actor awards at National Institute of Immunology, Mata Sundri and Miranda House respectively.
- Q.E.D., The English Debating Society was adjudged Best team at LIC with participation by Pooja Menon and Jagriti Shivapuri. They also made an impressive presence at the International Parliamentary Debate. Sugandh Gupta won 1st prize at JMC, Udita Purkayastha won 2nd prize as Speaker at Dehsbandhu, 1st prize for paper presentation at Hansraj and 2nd in Daulat Ram. Jagriti Shivapuri won Best Speaker awards at LIC and at Sathya Sai Debate. Jyoti Nagarajan won 2nd prize at Dayal Singh College.
- The Hindi Debating Society participated in debates, paper reading and elocution contests in various institutes. Varsha Bharadwaj won 1st prize at a Hindi Declamation organized by "Mahila Lekhika Sangh", Kriti won the 1st and Anchal the 2nd prize for poem recitation at JDMC and MTNL Health Mela respectively. Aanchal and Meenakshi were adjudged the Best Team at KNC. Jaya and Varsha won 1st and 3rd prizes respectively for Debate at Gargi, while Kriti and Meenakshi won 1st and 2nd prizes respectively for poem recitation at Gargi.
- The Quiz society won 1st prize at Gargi, 3rd at JDMC, 4th at KNC, 6th at AIIMS.
- Hues, The Fine Arts Society deserves appreciation for its innovative decorations at various functions of the college. The members participated in rangoli, collage making, tattoo art, poster designs and body art competitions and won several prizes at Sri Venkateshwara, AIIMS, IIT Delhi and Gargi. A week-long Ceramic workshop was organized for the members

- of this society. Talented artists include **Prakriti**, **Hanisha**, **Mukta and Niharika**.
- Nazaakat, The Indian Dance Society secured the first position at the National level folk dance competition at AIIMS. They also won 1st prize at Gargi, KNC, LIC and 3rd at JMC, IIT Kanpur and Mata Sundri. Isha won a Special prize at JMC and Niharika won 3rd prize for a solo performance at KNC. Some of our talented students were selected after rigorous audition for being trained at Lok Utsav: an organization which promotes Indian folk dance and culture nationwide. The members were also invited to perform in front of international delegates at NBPGR, Pusa.
- Sparx, The Choreography society won 1st prize at IIPM, Gargi, Sri Venkateshwara, 2nd at LIC, IIT Delhi and 3rd at Pioneer Media School and HT Youth Nexus.
- Enliven, The Western Dance Society won 2nd prize at Amity School of Business.
- Samaranjini, The Indian Music Society won Best Duet at LSR, Best Solo in folk at LSR and LIC, 2nd at Gargi, 3rd prize in classical solo at Gargi, Best Solo in semi classical at KNC and Gargi and 2nd at LSR, KNC, LIC and Sri Venkateshwara College, and 3rd at Gargi. The Group won 1st prize at Gargi, 2nd at KNC, Sri Vekateshwara and 3rd at LIC. Outstanding singers include Madhumita, Murchana, Tulika, Malini, Radhika, Aishwarya, Vidisha, Vineeta, Richa, Krutika, Hanisha, Priya, Priyadarshini, Pooja Medhavi and Devika.
- Euphony, The Western Music Society won 1st prize in Duet at Gargi, with Shruti and Prabha as participants. This year marked the formation of Gargi college Acoustic Band comprising of guitarists, percussionist, keyboard player and vocalists. They put up several performances independently and as accompanists in the solo, duet and group categories at various colleges of the University of Delhi, IIT, AIIMS and also at BITS Pilani.

- IRIS, The photography society was launched this year and, in its maiden year it went an to win 1st prize at LSR, IHE and Gargi and 1st and 2nd prizes at IIT Delhi and 2nd at St. Stephens College.
- The BBE inter-college festival: The first batch of the newly introduced course of B.A. (Hons.) Business Economics participated in ZEPHYR-2008, the BBE inter-college festival held at Sriguru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College and I am proud to announce that the fledgling Gargi team won the first prize in almost all the events.

In addition to the art forms that feature in inter-college competitions, the college offers facilities for self enrichment and sensitive awareness of the world around them through other fora. **Glass I, the film club** which perceives cinema as an art form, screened several films of national and international acclaim. Every screening was followed by a discussion on the movie screened, its editor, technology and modes of representation. As part of the **SPICMACAY** programme, the college hosted a Hindustani classical concert by Ms. Kaushiki Chakravorthy. Gargi college ushered in the **SAARC Folk Festival** into its own campus. The folk dance teams of Gujarat and Sri Lanka put up their performances.

4. Faculty Shining:

The college has over 145 members in its faculty, 129 of them are permanent and 82 of them hold doctorate degrees. Some are engaged in projects that have earned them Major Research Grants from UGC.

Curriculum Enrichment

A major stimulus towards academic research and creativity is provided to our students through the programmes of various departmental associations. Here students get opportunities to present research papers, make power point presentations, hear renowned speakers on diverse topics and latest developments as well as to organize and participate in discipline-based inter college competitions. I present here a few highlights.

Major Seminars

The **Chemistry Department** organised a two day National Seminar on "Chemistry, Environment and You-Challenges for future". It was addressed by many eminent scientists and academicians from various prestigious institutions across the country. The key-note address was delivered by our Pro-vice chancellor, Prof. S.K. Tandon who demonstrated the connection between global warming and the movements of the earth. Prof. Mihir Choudhari, Vice-chancellor, Tezpur University spoke on Green chemistry. Prof A.K. Susheela, talked of methods of minimizing water related hazards.

The **History Society** celebrated "The 2550th year of Mahaparinirvana of the Buddha". Prof. S. Rimpoche, Prime Minister in-exile of the Tibetan Government spoke on "The Contemporary Relevance of Buddha's Message". Prof. S.R. Bhatt, former Head of the Department of Philosophy, University of Delhi, spoke on "Huien Tsang and the state of Buddhism in 7th Century India". Benoy Behl, a noted art historian, mapped the progress of Buddhism with graphic slides.

Other Departmental meets

Botany combined art and academics by innovative competitions such as 'Best Out Of Waste' and 'Botanic Philately'.

Rasgandhayan, the Chemistry Society arranged lecture on *Chemistry* in everyday life by Prof. S. Chandrasekaran of the Indian Institute of Science. Three students of Chem(H) III yr participated in a tele-conference on *Eliminating poverty in South Asia* held at India Habitat Centre, wherein students of various SAARC countries took part.

The **Commerce department** held its annual festival *Cascade* focusing on the theme *Retail-revolution: The Indian Scenario*. Mr. B.N. Puri, Principal Advisor (Planning Commission) presented an overview of the subject. A panel discussion was held in which personalities from the media, government and the corporate world presented their points of view.

The **Department of Elementary Education** organized a panel discussion on *Elementary Education: The Road Ahead*, a two day seminar on "Storytelling and Children's literature".

The **English Literary Society** held deliberations and student paper reading competitions on "Literature and Film".

GERMS, The **Microbiology association** organized its one-day festival Microphilia. The inaugural lecture on *Emerging and Reemerging Infectious Diseases* was delivered by Prof. J.C. Samantaray, Head of the Department of Microbiology, AIIMS.

The **Department of Philosophy** conducted a two day festival "Dialectica" on the theme *Issues in Affirmative action: Theory and Praxis.*

Ray, the Physics Association hosted a lecture on Fibre Optic Communication by Prof. Enakshi Sharma. Prof. T.S.Natarajan from IIT, Chennai, presented a lec-dem on Pleasures of Learning Physics and Electronics by Doing. Impressed by his approach to Physics, the Principal has announced an annual Prof. Natarajan Award for the best innovative idea in science presented by a student.

The **Psychology department** organized a seminar entitled "Understanding Positive Psychology: A new beginning...." Wherein interactive sessions with well-known psychiatrist Dr. Jitendra Nagpal and Dr. Samir Parikh were held. Counselors from an NGO, Sanjivani also discussed the role of counseling in understanding problems.

The **Sanskrit** association arranged a lecture on *Culture in Ramayana and Mahabharata* by Dr. Pankaj Mishra, Reader in St. Stephens College.

Albatross, the **Zoology association** conducted a *conservation festival* aimed at spreading awareness about energy, environment, conservation

and wildlife protection. The General Secretary and CEO, WWF India, Mr. Ravi Singh presided over the function as Chief Guest. Our students actively participated in the Save the Tiger signature campaign.

The **BA program association** was launched this year with a *panel discussion on Yuvajagriti*. Panelists included Secretary, Central Information Commission, Ms. Rita Sinha, Secretary AICC, Ms. Alka Lamba and VLCC founder and mentor, Ms. Vandana Luthra.

Centre with Potential for Excellence

Gargi College was recognized as Centre with Potential for Excellence and was awarded a special grant by UGC. A three-year plan of scientific research, additional courses and social welfare programmes spanning 9 departments was initiated. In the final year of its term now, the following are the projects in progress:

- Botany: The department has created an imaging laboratory equipped with advanced microscopes with image projection system for interactive teaching and a Tissue culture laboratory to facilitate students to carry out projects on regeneration of economically important plants.
- Chemistry: The department has developed an alternate method of qualitative inorganic analysis to replace the toxic Hydrogen Sulphide gas. This was presented and well received at the second International Conference on Green Chemistry organized by the International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry. Trials are on in the area of Laboratory Waste Management.
- Microbiology: A 4-day workshop on Recent Trends in Microbiology was organized in July 05; a refrigerated micro centrifuge will soon be purchased and used for research.

- Physics: The department is concentrating on faculty upgradation and research. Development of interfacing of some simple experiments with computers is in progress.
- Zoology: Research through viewing of cells under living conditions is in progress; a digital microscope has just been put under operation. Students are also being trained to use it. Seminars were organized on various topics pertaining to Biotechnology, Drug design, Bioterror and Biosecurity.
- Elementary Education: The department has produced a cassette "Kathasagar", which contains children's stories scripted and narrated by our students, complete with special sound effects produced through voice. These students were given training on voice modulation for this project. "Kathasagar" is being distributed free to schools, especially government schools, as educational aid. A workshop for teachers in mathematics and one for the students on "Dance movement therapy" were organized. Workshop on use of music in primary education, setting up of a curriculum laboratory and translation of textbooks into Hindi are underway.
- Commerce: The following special courses are being offered after college hours: Banking and Financial services, Advertising and Marketing Communications and Use of Tally software.
- Psychology: A series of workshops on Well Being especially on emotional well being, were conducted for faculty and students by Dr. Nagpal.
- Women's Development Centre: A three day National Seminar, Kalakriti: Women and the Arts and Crafts of India, and a stress management workshop were organized. The third day of the seminar was held in the Indira Gandhi Centre for the Arts. A special section on genderissues has been created in the library.

It is hoped that within the year Gargi College will be able to make public some of its achievements through the above projects.

Building Social Responsibility

Gargi College maintains a healthy tradition of making its young adults aware of social disparities and environmental hazards. It provides them diverse avenues for making their contributions to society.

1. National Service Scheme.

A blood donation camp and a Diwali NGO mela were organized. A course on "Education for Peace Building" was held in collaboration with elementary education department. Highlight of the year is the organization of a special day filled with fun, games and dance for the special children from Sankara Special School and Amarjyoti School for physically challenged children and a Friendship Day with Senior Citizens.

2. National Cadet Corps

SUO **Jyoti Sharma**, **Pooja Singal** and **Arathana Muthana** participated in the Republic Day camp, Chief Minister's Rally and National Integration Camp. **Ambika** was declared Delhi's Best Cadet in 2007. She was also one of the three girls from India selected to represent our country in the Youth Exchange Programme held at Bangkok in December, 2007.

3. Women's Development Centre

Especially this year, the WDC has been a very dynamic centre, organizing a number of activities to create awareness of gender issues. Key activities include:

- A discussion on the issue of women's safety with the Delhi Police.
- A workshop on stress management through meditation by the Life Eternal Trust.
- A two-day inter-college event titled Celebrating Women? to draw attention to women's contribution to social progress.
- A crafts mela to promote the work of self-employed women from disadvantaged sectors.

- Screening the film Matrubhumi, followed by a discussion on genderdiscrimination.
- Expanding the Gender Studies section of the College Library.
- Making the voluntary services of the college counselor available to everyone in the institution.

4. Eco-club & Waste Management Project:

The Eco club participated in the National Eco club summit at Bal Bhavan for two days. Students engaged in real time analysis and measurement of atmospheric pollutants at CRRI. Their demonstration of the consequences of burning crackers by measuring the levels of nitric oxide and ozone in the air just before and after Diwali was much appreciated by the Chief Minister of NCT, Smt. Sheila Dixit.

The students also experimented on giving green treatment to Lab effluents emerging from organic chemistry laboratory. The colourless odourless emergent aqueous solution was used for watering the garden. Efforts are on to implement it on a larger scale.

Research work on bees and wasps found within the college campus is in progress.

Communications and Networking

1. Magazines and Newsletters:

Logos, the annual magazine is the voice of Gargi-ites in all their moods. This year's issue has focused on the theme of "Be the Light". Eureka, from students of Sciences, Manthan of History, Oracle of Humanities, Demos of Political Science, Gnosis of Philosophy and Comascent of Commerce are newsletters produced and edited by students for quick mass communication. This year NSS launched its newsletter, Savera. Botany department released the third annual issue of its magazine, Anthesis, while the department of Zoology released the first issue of its new

magazine, **Flight.** And there are several wall magazines for anonymous and more candid expressions!

2. Alumni Outreach

Networking with Gargi alumni is expanding each year and a meet is held in the college every year. Many of our alumni are well placed in all walks of life. Three are on our rolls as faculty and two as staff members. An alumnus of the fourth batch of this college is currently a Professor at Columbia University, U.S.A.; one is Vice-President of a well known consulting firm. A recent alumnus Akansha Arya is pursuing MBA in Indian University of Pennsylvania. We hope to make our website interactive for alumni. An alumni directory of information is underway. The Alumni Association contributed rupees two lakhs to the college Auditorium fund recently. It will shortly institute scholarships for needy students.

3. Placement

A two-day interface with the industry for all disciplines organized in the college last year has increased awareness regarding new horizons of career opportunities in our students. Corporates from various domains such as Publishing, Media, Advertising, HRD and IT, Viz. Google, Capital IQ, Fluor Daniel, E-value serve, Indian Express, and have short-listed eligible candidates in the first round and it is hoped that many will be selected in the forth coming final rounds. Creation of a Placement Web Portal is in the pipeline. Our placement for students of B.El.Ed. is almost cent percent.

4. Health Awareness Programmes

A visiting doctor and a permanent nurse are part of the staff of the college. Apart from routine health check-ups, special medical camps are also organized. A highlight this year was the cancer awareness and detection camp with the help of a mobile mammography van.

Add-On Courses

Gargi College is increasingly becoming popular for its add on courses held after regular classes. They are governed by a vision to maximize opportunities for our students and to provide a bridge between the university curriculum on the one hand, with its focus on liberal education and pure sciences and on the other, a job market demanding new technical skills. The series of add on courses offered by the college fall in two categories. These are:

- Career Oriented Courses: Courses conducted successfully this year are on Banking and Financial Services, Marketing and Mass Communications, Tally software. These courses have been made open to boys and girls of other colleges thereby adding the value of wider interactions.
- 2. Expanding Horizons: Courses in this series are aimed at enriching personality development and general awareness, as also opening new windows for career choices. Courses conducted this year include Historical Tourism, E-governance, Education for Peace, Theatre Workshop and Vedic Mathematics among others.

Faculty for all the courses is drawn from academia, the industry and recognized professional institutes.

The college is also a study center for IGNOU and thereby the college building is put to effective use on sundays. M.A. (English), B.Sc and several diploma courses in areas such as Nutrition, Child Care and Creative Writing are taught at our center, many of them by the Gargi faculty.

Gargi College is also a center accredited by ICAI for preparing students for the CPT examination.

Infrastructure Development

- A second **computer laboratory** with projection facility was installed this year with 21 computers, Internet facility, linux, Windows XP professional and other accessories. 32 free internet stations have been provided in various venues in the college to enable faculty and student research. Recently some faculty members attended a workshop conducted by the Department of Information Technology of GOI and the Delhi University Library System that enlightened them on the phenomenal number of databases and journals that are accessible through the DULS within the college. Process is on to increase the number of Internet stations by acquiring broadband services. The website **www.gargicollege.in** was also launched this year and we hope to expand it to make it interactive especially with the college alumni.
- Ramps for the differently abled have been built to provide access to the
 administrative offices, library, canteen and the Physics and Chemistry
 laboratories of the science block. Funds are awaited from UGC to provide
 access to higher floors. A wheeled chair has been added to the medical
 room.
- A generator with a capacity of 200 kVA has recently been installed. A new acid room and a shower complex for sports students are nearing completion.
- Construction of the new auditorium complex has begun at last after a period of two years spent in selection of design and obtaining approvals from various governmental authorities. The Foundation Stone was laid by the Honourable Chief Minister of NCT, Mrs. Sheila Dixit, Delhi on 17th Jan., 2008. The complex will consist of an auditorium with a seating capacity of 750, a seminar hall with a capacity of 150 and a multi purpose hall below the stage. The college is vigourously engaged in fund raising for this project and I take this opportunity to extend my gratitude to my faculty, staff and students who have made great efforts in this direction.

Library: 1217 books were added during the year under review. Library has been fully computerized.

Vision and Missions for the Future

Gargi College has entered a new decade, the fifth, of its existence this year. Its founding fathers can certainly look back with satisfaction at its growth from a modest beginning with 247 students and two courses in 1967 to its present strength of 2100 students offering about 20 courses. During this journey, the college has transformed from a temple of learning to a hub for total selfdevelopment. It will be our constant endeavour to equip our students with the values and competence required to meet the dual challenges that face our country: to fulfill its potential for global excellence and become the world's knowledge super power on the one hand, and on the other, to eradicate poverty, illiteracy, crime and separatism within its own portals. Added to this is the stress faced by today's youth from competitivess and commerce, the bane of a technologically advanced civilization. The Principal, Faculty and Staff of Gargi College will have as their mission to send forth from this hallowed institute. young women, who will combine self fulfillment with accountability to the community, detached pursuit of truth with involvement through action, who will celebrate diversity without compromising absolute values, attain woman empowerment without losing cherished human ideals. As I begin my fourth year as Principal, I renew my pledge to strive to take Gargi College to a vanguard position in the University of Delhi through academic expansion and consolidation, maximizing opportunities for the expression of diverse talents. through upgradation of infrastructure and by executing an administration that is fair to all.

I take this opportunity to thank the top leadership of the University of Delhi as well as the members of the Governing Body both of the year that was and of the current year for their continuing guidance and support. I must place on record my appreciation for the tremendous cooperation I have received year after year from faculty and staff in the conduct of the academic administration of the college. I am particularly thankful for their giving time to extended activities like add on courses, placement and alumni networking and for the fund-raising efforts for the ongoing construction of the auditorium complex. And to my students, who have always manifested love as well as promise, I wish you the best in the forthcoming examinations and in all pursuits beyond.

Ecology Club

The Eco-awareness campaigns such as Poster making and Slogan writing were organized during the Ozone layer week (16th–23rd of September 2007). After this, the Eco Club visited Asola (Only Wildlife sanctuary in Delhi) on the 17th Sept., 07 to have greater exposure to nature. The members came to know that protection of vulture is a dire need to save the species (99% projected as dead).

Students learnt real time analysis and measurement of the atmospheric pollutants at Central Road Research Institute (CRRI) by using sophisticated devices such as Nitric Oxide monitor and the Ozone monitor. A series of experiments was conducted using these devices wherein the level of Nitric oxide and Ozone in the atmosphere was measured just before and after Diwali. The results showed that each individual during Diwali is more prone to breathing ailments as compared to before. We would like to thank Dr. Anuradha Shukla for inviting us to CRRI to carry out our research work.

The Eco-club of Gargi college was greatly appreciated at the National Eco club Summit held for two days 20th and 21st December, 2007 at Bal Bhawan. Here we presented our work, which comprised of Eco gloves, microscale techniques used in labs and pollution analysis. Mrs. Shiela Dixit, Chief Minister of NCT of Delhi, spent ten minutes discussing the above aspects with the students and was quite pleased with the amount of research and hard work put in by the Club.

The students group participated in the march past on the 15th of February (Sports day) to sensitize the students towards environment issues.

Women's Development Centre (WDC)
