Gargi College is lucky to have as Chairman of its Governing Body, Professor Nargis Panchapakesan, yet another alumna of the University of Delhi and its former Dean, Faculty of Education. Interestingly, her Master's degree was in Physics, which she also taught at Delhi and in the USA, but later obtained a doctorate degree in Education from the University of Chicago. She was at the forefront in the conception and introduction of the B.El.Ed. programme in select colleges of the University. She has been consultant to various governmental and non-governmental organizations and was a resource person for the NCERT project for revision of the national framework of school curriculum.

2. Sports:

Gargi College strives to achieve excellence in sports and our students receive intense coaching by professionals in volleyball, cricket, basketball, chess, yoga, tennis, table tennis and Judo. All students of the college are encouraged to participate in march-past, athletics, aerobics and other

events on the annual sports day. The Chief Guest at this year's Sports Day was Saba Karim, the former Test cricketer. Our college was the venue for the exchange of baton for the Youth Commonwealth Games held in Pune. The following are some of the highlights of this year's achievements in sports:

Athletics: Pushpa Lakra is one of our star sportswomen. She stood first in 400 meters and second in 800 meter races of the DU Athletic Championships, while Amulya Janardan came third in the 400 meters. The college Athletic team consisting of Pushpa, Amulaya and Naseema stood second in the DU Inter College Cross Country Championships.

Basket Ball: The college basketball team stood second in the AIIMS tournament.

Chess: The chess team stood second in the DU inter-college championships and at the LSR tournament. Team leader Vasudha Talwar and Poonam Sharma deserve special accolades.

Cricket: The cricket team bagged third prize in the Harry Cup. Neha and Babita Negi were declared best fielder, best bowler and best wicketkeeper in different matches. Babita also represented DU in the All India Cricket championships.

Judo: The Judo team stood second at Delhi State and DU inter-college championships as well as in the LSR sports festival. The college is proud of Shally Manral, who was the only member of the Indian contingent to win a medal (bronze) at the Asia Junior Sports Exchange held at Tokyo, Japan and was given a cash award by the Chief Minister of NCT of Delhi. She won two gold medals each in the DU and Delhi State championships and a bronze at the All India University Judo Championships. Monica Goswami has been selected to represent Delhi in the Senior National Championships.

Delhi State Women's festival, was placed fourth in the DU Championships and won second prize in the LSR Sports festival.

Table Tennis: The college team was placed in the fourth position in the DU Championships and won third prize in the LSR sports festival.

She was also a special invitee at the Base Camp of the Indian Armed Forces in the Siachen Glacier.

#### 3. Cultural:

Gargi College provides immense opportunities to students to develop and showcase their talents in various forms of art. The legacy of the various cultural societies continues to be further enriched each year and we proudly affirm that students are now carrying out tasks of conceptualisation, design, direction and production by themselves with great finesse, apart from putting up superb performances at various competitions and bringing. laurels to the college. In classical solo, first prize was won by Devika Kundu at IP, second prize at IIT Kanpur by Mrinal Sharma, at Sri Venkateshwara by Anjana Sheshadri, and at Janaki Devi Mahavidyalaya and Jesus and Mary College by Nitisha Nanda.

Sparx, The Choreography Society departed from the traditional fusion of Indian dance and contemporary dance and experimented with some classical western ballet movements. They won the first prize at Hansraj College, where it was a hat trick for them this year and at Sri Venkateshwara College. They stood second at IIT Delhi and third at Reverie.

Enliven, The Western Dance Society won third prize at Reverie and at the Commerce festival at Kamla Nehru College.

Samaranjini, The Indian Music Society won first prize in the group category at IP and third at Gargi College and Sri Venkateshwara College; in the duet category they won the third prize at Reverie. In the solo category, second prizes were won at Gargi by Madhumita, at IP and KNC by Murchana, who also won third prize at LSR and Sri Venkateshwara. Madhumita made it to the top ten out of a hundred competitors at IIT Delhi.

#### CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT

#### Major seminars and workshops:

A National Interdisciplinary Seminar was hosted by the college on the topic **Rights for Human Dignity** on 17<sup>th</sup> February, 09. It was inaugurated by Ms. Kiran Walia, Minister for Health and Family Welfare, of the NCT of Delhi. This workshop will provide impetus for research, and for academic deliberations and sharing of knowledge outside the classroom.

# Other Departmental Meets:

Gargi College has a rich tradition of major annual academic events conducted by each department. These consist of panel discussions by experts on emerging new areas of knowledge in the disciplines, followed by presentations by students as well as inter-college competitions. Most students of Gargi College pursue higher studies after graduation. However to those interested in a job after the under-graduate degree, the college has been facilitating placement through a group of very committed faculty members operating the placement cell. Several private sector

A Bio-informatics laboratory is in the final stages of completion. It has been made possible by a grant from the Department of Biotechnology of the Ministry of Science and Technology of the Government of India. The lab will not only be a useful centre for hands on experience for some topics in the curriculum, but we also hope to offer short add on certificate courses on the subject for our students.

**Library:** 1718 books were added this year bringing the total to 63473 volumes and 75 journals. The library is fully computerized.
