


Admission Schedule for 2020-21

General Information

- Candidates must have filled the online registration form of University of Delhi for getting admission in the College.
- Candidates should have passed the Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class XII) of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi (or an examination recognized as equivalent by the University of Delhi). Where grades are given in school, transfer of grades to marks will be in accordance with the norms of Association of Indian Universities.
- Candidates seeking admission to the courses offered by the college should have passed the qualifying examinations obtaining minimum marks specified by the University of Delhi.
- Gap year would be no bar for the purpose of admission to the undergraduate courses but reason for the same must be given.

For admission to Gargi College, candidates should qualify as per the cut-off percentages declared by the college.

There is no discrimination in admission criteria for Hindi medium students. However, at Gargi College the medium of instruction is English in all courses except in the discipline of Political Science. But students, even after receiving instruction in English medium in the class, may still take the examination in Hindi medium, wherever question papers are prepared in a dual medium by the University.

- 1. In case vacant seats are left, further Cut-Offs may be announced by the University to fill the vacant seats.
- 2. On approval of the admission by the Principal of the college, fee payment will be activated on the applicant's dashboard in the Admission Portal. This fee can only be paid online through the portal. The applicant is advised to pay the fees without delay within 24 hours of approval of admission by the Principal of the college
- 3. The original mandatory documents uploaded at the time of admission are to be verified online. The documents need to be submitted in original when the candidate first visits the college as per university guidelines. If not verified, the candidate will be informed.
- 4. Due to the exigencies of the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, the entire admission process will be Online and contactless this year. Students and their parents/guardians are advised not to visit the college in person at any stage of the admission process. - The University may define any other relevant subjects as academic/elective for a particular course.
- In case an applicant has studied elective and core languages, the core/elective language subject will be treated as language, while elective language can be considered as academic/elective subject.
- For the calculation of Best Four subjects percentage for Arts/Humanities honours courses, if the applicant includes subjects other than those given in Lists A and B, then a deduction of 2.5% of maximum marks will be levied for each such subject for the purpose of calculating 'Best Four'.
- Out of three academic/elective subjects chosen above, one must be the concerned subject in which the
 admission is sought, failing which a deduction of 2.5% will be imposed on the calculated 'Best Four'
 percentage.
- All subjects which have a theory and practical component and if included in the calculation of 'Best Four' or PCM/PCB/PCMB must have at least 70% theory and 30% practical components. In case, the considered subject does not have 70% theory and 30% practical components, then the marks of theory and practical shall be converted to 70% and 30% respectively on pro rata basis. These new marks will then be considered for calculation of 'Best Four' or PCM/PCB.

Example of calculation of Pro-rata marks

If an applicant has scored: Paper X 90 (theory 50, practical 40; max. marks theory 60, practical 40), and Paper Y 91 (theory 52, practical 39; max. marks theory 60, practical 40) which is not in ratio of 70:30, then the marks can be converted on pro-rata basis

Pro-rata marks in Paper X = 88.33; $[(50/60) \times 70 + (40/40) \times 30] = 58.33 + 30 = 88.33$

Pro-rata marks in Paper Y = 89.92; $[(52/60) \times 70 + (39/40) \times 30] = 60.67 + 29.25 = 89.92$

Payment of fees to confirm admission

Departments

Botany

The Department of Botany at Gargi College was established in 1967 and is committed to teaching and research in all areas of Plant Biology. The course comprises study of plant diversity and ecology, physiology, economic and industrial importance, cell and molecular biology, genetics, biochemistry, biotechnology, medicinal botany and bioinformatics. The Department of Botany at Gargi has a competent faculty with varied specialisations, trained technical staff and



enthusiastic students. The department is well-equipped with laboratories like Molecular Biology, Bioinformatics and Tissue Culture Labs for carrying out practical classes and research work, a Museum, which exhibits plant specimens, and a well maintained Botanical Garden. The course curriculum also gives options to students to choose from a broad array of specialised areas like Plant Biotechnology, Physiology, Genetics, Biofertilizers, Intellectual Property Rights, Biostatistics, Industrial microbiology, Medicinal Botany, etc. The learning centred curriculum helps students to pursue post graduate studies in Botany, Biosciences, Biomedical Sciences, Molecular Biology, Genetics, Biotechnology, Environmental Sciences, Bioinformatics, etc. Field trips and excursions are also arranged to acquaint the students with direct information of the flora and helps to develop a love for nature. Industrial visits are also organised for the students as a part of their curricular activities. Over the years, the Department has achieved high academic standards and also produced a number of enthusiastic teachers, scientists and many others who do extremely well in various fields.



The Department has been given funding from the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, under the Star College Scheme and Bioinformatics Infrastructure facility (BIF) which facilitates students' work on minor research projects along with their undergraduate course. The Department has an active Botanical Society – "TARU", which organises several cultural and academic events. The Society also publishes an e-magazine "ANTHESIS" where students can explore their scientific writing ability.

<u>Business Economics</u>

The B.A. (Honours) Business Economics course is an inter-disciplinary course having a curriculum designed to equip the students with the knowledge of diverse fields including Economics, Commerce, Mathematics and Research. The structure of the course aims to develop analytical skills in the students which enables them to understand the Business world and the global Economic scenario. The three year programme makes it mandatory for students to gain practical exposure by interning in



different sectors. Our Alumni have interned and been placed in different reputed organizations like PWC, KPMG, Deloitte, EY, Dell, NITI Aayog, NDTV, OLX, NTPC and many more. Students of Business Economics can pursue Masters in Commerce, Economics, Business Economics, Business Administration, Finance, International Business, etc. They can also pursue professional courses like CA, CFA, CS, CMA, FRM, Actuarial Science, etc.

Admission to the course is done through a Joint Entrance Test (JET) for the three courses B.A. (Honours) Business Economics, Bachelor in Management Studies and Bachelor in Business Administration (Finance and Investment Analysis) held by the University of Delhi. The final admission to the course is subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility conditions laid down by the University from time to time.

The academic session begins with a Departmental orientation to welcome the freshers and introduce them to the Departmental academic curriculum and other activities. Competitions are conducted for the students to give them a platform to display their skills. Our flagship Comicon competition is organised with the aim to create an understanding of different economic/business trends among the students. Alumni interactive sessions are conducted on a regular basis to facilitate the interaction of present



batches with ex-students. The department also conducts talks and seminars on various current topics on a regular basis. For long, our department has been winning the Best College Trophy in an Annual Sports Meet – Runbhoomi and Roisters. Advitya – our Annual Departmental Fest organises panel discussions with eminent speakers on current topics. A unique feature of this course is that students are taken for industrial trips so as to enhance their understanding of manufacturing processes and their functioning.

Chemistry

Chemistry is a central science as it interconnects many disciplines and finds applications in areas like pharmacology, environmental science, astronomy, molecular and cellular biology, geology, forensic science, polymer science, to name a few. The knowledge of Chemistry equips a science student with better understanding and opens up numerous career prospects from fields as diverse as medicinal chemistry & drug designing, research and development wings of various private and government firms and



PSUs, analytical laboratories, teaching sectors (schools and colleges) and many more.

The Department of Chemistry, established in 1967, is one of the oldest departments of the college that offers B.Sc. (H) Chemistry as a 6-semester course under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). Besides, the Honours programme, the department is also associated with teaching of the interdisciplinary courses like B.Sc. (Programme) Physical Sciences & Life Sciences. Chemistry is also offered as an elective subject for students of other science courses. The department has more than twenty highly qualified faculty members and an impressive list of notable alumni who have made their mark in various fields.

The course structure and syllabus (as per the University of Delhi guidelines) includes core courses in Inorganic, Organic and Physical Chemistry; Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses; Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC); Generic Elective (GE) Papers; and Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) distributed over a period of 3 years (or 6 semesters). The syllabus along with the practical component is designed to provide an in-depth knowledge of the fundamentals of chemistry to students, and also aims to increase their logical and skill-based aptitude. The liberty to choose papers across various other disciplines in the GE courses has helped students read topics of their interest which may be of use in their future career decisions.

All the students of the Department of Chemistry are a part of the Chemical Society called Rasgandhayan. Under the convenorship of teacher mentors, this society (by the students, of the students and for the students) works all-round the year to organise some interesting activities apart from regular teaching. Student representatives are elected for the various posts. The society releases an annual magazine



Amalgam, which is a students' production and has literary/ creative and scientific articles contributed by the students.

The society always endeavours to supplement classroom teaching with invited lectures by eminent speakers from institutes in and outside of Delhi, academic inter college competitions like paper and poster presentations, extracurricular competitions like debating, extempore, talent hunt, quiz, creative writing, etc. and fun/sports activities. Educational visits/trips are organised by the department and in the academic year 2019-2020, the students were taken to the Central Forensic Science Laboratory, Chandigarh and to the Glass Blowing Facility of IIT Delhi. The society had the privilege to listen to an interesting lecture by Padma Shree Prof. S. Sivaram from NCL, Pune this year. The Dr. C.K. Khurana memorial lecture by Prof. A. Ramanan of IIT



Delhi, the Inter-College Poster and Paper Presentation Competition Chemaroma, a throw ball match of teachers vs. students, Talent Hunt Competition, are a few highlights of the events of this academic year. The year-long activities culminate with the degree distribution ceremony which is a part of the valedictory function.

Several seminars, add-on courses, conferences, workshops are organised to add to the holistic development of the students. Teacher mentors also guide students frequently for various project and research work thus giving them exposure to the world of scientific research at a very early age.



Commerce

Commerce is a multidisciplinary stream which encompasses the study of economics, law, management, accounting and human behaviour. Commerce education equips students with analytical, communication and problem-solving skills to effectively identify issues and find efficient and practical solutions to everyday business problems.

The Department of Commerce offers two under-graduate degree courses – B. Com (Hons) and B. Com (Programme) and teaches one paper of Entrepreneurship and Small Business to the students of BA Programme. Additionally, it runs two Add-on Certificate courses namely Advertising and Marketing Communication and Banking and Financial Services. All these courses pave the way for pursuing further studies in academic and professional courses like M.Com, CA, ICWA, CS, MBA and Actuarial Science. Elementary Education

B.EI.Ed.! That sounds familiar. What exactly is it?

The full form of B.El.Ed. is Bachelors of Elementary Education. It is an exciting four-year integrated professional degree programme for training teachers at the elementary school level.

Does it mean that we will be eligible for jobs after completing it?



Yes! It means that after four years of rigorous training you will be a professionally qualified teacher. Whether you want to teach right away or pursue higher education will, of course, depend on what you wish to do further.

Is it a recognised programme?

Certainly. It is recognised by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE). It was initiated by the Maulana Azad Centre for Elementary and Social Education (MACESE), Delhi University in the year 1994-1995. We have completed 20 years at Gargi College.

But is it available in English only?

Not at all! It is a bilingual programme. Instruction is in both English medium and Hindi medium.



What exactly does this programme encompass?

That's an important question. The idea behind this programme is to integrate the study of subject knowledge, human development, teaching skills and communication skills. Hence, B.El.Ed. offers both compulsory as well as optional theory courses. It has a strong focus on practicum



courses. It also entails a comprehensive school internship programme in its fourth year. A special departmental library cum resource centre is available to the students.

That went a little over my head. Could you explain them to me one by one?

The two essential components of this programme are the theory and practicum courses. There are 19 theory courses which the student is expected to cover during the four year programme of study. This includes:

Foundation Courses: These courses are designed to enable students to make an in-depth study of child development concepts and perspectives in

education, the context in which the education of the child is situated, processes and techniques of social organisation; various issues related to elementary education and to develop skills of communicating and relating.

Core Courses: Core courses offer the prospective teacher the opportunity to reconstruct concepts learnt in school and to integrate them within a multi-disciplinary perspective.

Pedagogy Courses: Courses in pedagogy are designed to help develop core teaching skills specific to the teaching of young children. This includes developing perspectives in pedagogy and techniques related to specific knowledge areas.

Liberal Courses: Liberal optional courses provide students with the opportunity to study a specific discipline with academic rigour. They are designed to enrich the knowledge base to allow further study in the discipline and in the pedagogies in which students specialise. The Liberal Courses offered by Gargi College are: English, Hindi, Political Science, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology (subject to a minimum number of seven students opting for the course.)

Practicum Courses: The Practicum Courses are another very important component of this programme. These courses are designed to allow a variety of work experience with children in and outside elementary schools and opportunities for self-reflection and development. The practicum input includes: Performing and Fine Arts, Craft and Participatory Work, School-Contact Programme, Observing Children, Self-Development Workshops, Physical Education, School Internship, Projects, Tutorials and Colloquia.

What about the eligibility criteria for this programme?

There is Common Entrance Examination conducted by the Department of Education, Delhi University, comprising a written test for the B.El.Ed programme (see Bulletin of C.I.E). For details, visit: Website of CIE: http://cie.du.ac.in/

Economics

Founded in the year 1967, the Department of Economics started offering a programme course in Economics under the guidance of faculty members like Ms. V Bala Subramaniam, Ms. Manjeet Kaur, Ms. Kiran Chopra, Ms. Indu Jairath, Ms. Swaran Bhalla, Ms. Asha Sachdev and Ms. Shobha Mathur. Under the erstwhile FYUP scheme, the department got an overwhelming response admitting 250 students and



attained a resounding success of 100 per cent pass percentage. In the year 2017-18, the department introduced a full-fledged Honours course in Economics with more than 60 students. At present, the department has eight faculty members.

Launched in the year 2011, the Economics Association, Ecomantra, has ventured into organising a vast array of academic activities including the Annual Economics Festival, seminars, and intra as well as inter college quiz competitions. In addition, the association strives to maintain a web presence through its annual e-newsletter, 'The Short Run', which discusses the latest issues in the field of Economics. In the academic year 2019-20, Ecomantra organised the 'Annual Economics Quiz'. Later, amidst nation-wide lockdown in April 2020, the association organised an online quiz, 'Inquizitive', which drew a huge response from students across different colleges of the University.

The department also publishes an annual magazine 'EcoBuzz' which provides an opportunity to the students to put on one's thinking cap and voice opinions on myriad economic, social and political issues.

The department revels in the glorious achievements of its alumni, who have gone on to join IIM Ahmedabad, Delhi School of Economics, Indian Statistical Institute, prestigious foreign universities, the CII, the big four consultancy, etc.



In the first year, the department offers four core papers, namely, Introductory Microeconomics and Mathematical Methods of Economics I in semester I, followed by Introductory Macroeconomics and Mathematical Methods for Economics II in semester II, under the honours course. Two Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs) are to be taken up by the students. The students also need to choose a General Elective paper from disciplines other than Economics offered by another department. The papers offered under Skill Enhancement are Research Methodology in semester III and Contemporary Economic Issues in semester IV.

The programme course includes Discipline papers, namely, Principles of Microeconomics I and II, Principles of Macroeconomics I and II and Economic Development and Policy in India I and II which are spread across six semesters.

The department offers General Elective papers namely Introductory Microeconomics, Introductory Macroeconomics, Indian Economy I and II, Money and Banking, etc. to students of other disciplines. The papers offered under Skill Enhancement for the programme course are Understanding the Economic Survey and Union Budget in semester III and Research Methodology in semester IV.

English

English (Honours) is an impactful undergraduate course that takes students through the best in world literatures. The syllabus is rigorous in its coverage of important literary texts and landmarks, and thus stands students in good stead in their future professional endeavours. Papers range from Indian and Western classical traditions to lively and immediate contemporary authors; students will read widely in different genres including poetry, plays, novels, besides acquiring critical thinking skills that will enable and empower them academically and personally.

Students after graduation go on to future studies (MA/M.Phil/PhD) in literature, and to careers in teaching (at school, college and university levels), in media and mass communication (journalism, film, advertising), publishing (writing, editing, translating), public relations management and also to lateral fields like social work, law, management via masters' study in these fields. The sound thinking and writing skills students gain over three years is also a good foundation for competitive examinations including for management studies and civil services.



The English Department faculty is resourceful and well-networked, and includes widely-published scholars and writers. The Department teaches English to students of all courses, including those majoring in the Sciences, Commerce, Arts and Education streams; besides tutoring MA students. Department resources include the 3,000+ volume Oswal-Sena Library, which offers students access to a world of books beyond the curriculum.

The Department has an exciting co-curricular calendar of varied activities, including an annual national seminar and literary festival, frequent invited lectures and interactions with eminent academicians, creative writers, besides workshops and co-curricular skill-building sessions on different themes like creative writing, editing, translation, theatre and cinema. The department's co-curricular activities are directed through several clubs, any or all of which students are encouraged to join depending on their interests and goals. The Book Club, The Creative Writing Club, The Quiz Club, The Performance Club and The Film Club; all of which are managed by students and mentored by the teachers of the Department. Our Department magazine, Bitacora, provides an independent forum for both creative expression and training in skills such as copy and content editing. A portfolio of activities designed to encourage student creativity and understanding of their discipline, like quizzes and literary competitions keep the six semesters that students spend with us stimulating.

Highlights of Activities in 2019-2020:

The year's activities were inaugurated with a book discussion in September. Sharif D. Rangnekar, a former journalist and a prominent LGBT activist, discussed his book *Straight to Normal* which was published in 2018. This was followed by an enthralling theatre performance of the ancient Greek tragedy *Medea*. The play was performed by Pandies Theatre and directed by Dr. Anuradha Marwah. In October, we organized "Perspectives - A Media Review Competition". It provided the students with a chance to write a review of popular media content and give their perspectives on the same. Later in the month, Dr. Meenakshi Malhotra was invited to deliver a lecture on Women's Writing.

In January Dr. Saba Bashir graced the college with her presence. Dr. Bashir has translated Manto's *Shikari Auratein* into English (Women of Prey) and she shared with the students the process of translation and the issues faced by translators.

The most awaited event of this year was the Literary Festival 2020. The theme for the fest was "Interrogating Masculinities" which is a very relevant issue in today's scenario. The Keynote Speaker for

the fest was Dr. P.K. Vijayan who delivered a thought provoking and informative talk on the nuances of the term 'masculinity'. This was followed by a Panel Discussion on 'Deconstructing Manhood: Histories, Performances and Possibilities'. The speakers for the same were Dr. Charu Gupta and Vqueeram Aditya Sahai. A Movie Screening and Discussion with Mitali Trivedi and Gagandeep Singh on their film *Please Mind the Gap* was also organised.

With a lot of enthusiasm and energy a series of the student's competitions were inaugurated with 'The Mad Hatters' Tea Party' wherein the participants came dressed as different fictional characters. This was followed by many more competitions wherein the students showcased their sense of humor and amused the audience with their punch lines in 'Stand Up Comedy'. Memers and photographers tested their skills in 'Meme Making Competition' and 'Photo story' respectively. The enthusiasm of the organizers and participants boomed in the seminar hall throughout.

To add to this line-up of engaging events, Bitacora, the literary magazine of the English Department introduced the theme 'Living in Dystopia' which encapsulated various experiences of the students and individuals in a time of political, academic and societal changes in the contemporary world.

German

German is offered as a discipline in the B.A Programme Course, which means a student, who opts for German, will study it for the next three years. No prior knowledge of German is required. Students will get to learn from the basics, it is an asset to know a foreign language in today's world of globalization. If one wants to be a real player in the 21st century, learning German will give one the edge one needs. 100 million people worldwide communicate in German! German is spoken not only in Germany, but also in Austria, Hungary and Switzerland as the official language. After learning German for three years at the undergraduate level, a student can do post-graduation in German language. One can go to Germany, Austria, Hungary or Switzerland for higher studies. There are a lot of scholarships too, that these countries offer. And there are no dearth of jobs in the job market with the knowledge of German language. With the knowledge of German language, one improves one's employment opportunities. Germany has the largest

economy in the European Union and the third largest in the world. German, for sure, puts one in high demand. If one is looking for employment in the United States, knowing German can give you great advantages. German companies account for 700,000 jobs in United States and US Companies have created approximately the same number of jobs in Germany. Apart from this, learning German opens a lot of job avenues in the Tourism industry, Hospitality industry, German (Lufthansa), Austrian, Swiss and Hungarian Airlines and also in German, Swiss, Austrian and Hungarian Embassies, teaching jobs in schools, colleges and MBA Institutes like Amity and Symbiosis Universities etc. There are also jobs with German Language Skills as Interpreters and Translators, in German Bank (i.e., Deutsche Bank). It adds to one's CV and gives one an edge over others in the job market.

Hindi

From a contemporary perspective, Hindi (Honours) is an important option at both the levels – National and International. If you are interested in Hindi Literature then this course can create many opportunities in future. The Syllabus of Hindi (Honours) not only introduces students to the great poets, writers, novelists, critics etc., from the ancient times to the present, but also brings out your latent talents.

As we envision the conceptualisation of the Global Village, accordingly the miscellaneous dimensions of the Hindi language are being brought to the world stage. Hindi Literature develops the creativity and literary sensibility of students and also elevates creativity with the use of appropriate words. From the perspective of employment, if you want to enhance your creativity in the field of Journalism, Research, Anchoring, Script-Writing, Editing, Lyricist, etc. then this course is your best option.

Hindi has the third position as a spoken and communication language in the world. Publication of Hindi newspapers and broadcasting of Hindi news channels in large numbers shows the undisputed importance of the Hindi language.

The popularity and predominance of Hindi Cinema across the whole world enhances cultural dialogue and communication. Hindi has been playing an important role in the universities of Mauritius, Surinam, Fiji and America through which new options of employment in embassies are on the rise.

All the faculty members of the Hindi Department are experienced and qualified and play an important role to tap the potential of the students and bring out the best in them. For the ceaseless development of the department all the members of the faculty take part in National and International Seminars and Workshops on a regular basis. To provide a platform for the students to hone their literary talents and skills, the Department conducts debate competitions, poetry-writing, story-writing, essay-competitions, etc. throughout each semester. We believe in nourishing the thoughts and ideas of the students by helping them find a good balance between tradition and modernity, the past and the present, to work towards a holistic future.

History

The History Department was set up as one of the core departments of Gargi College during its establishment in 1967. Initially, History was offered at the BA Pass level (now called the BA Programme). History teaching at the Honours level commenced from 1972. Over time, History has evolved into a highly specialised discipline, and our faculty members have expertise in particular areas of Indian and World History.

B.A. Honours in History focuses on the study of twenty discipline-specific credit courses - fourteen Core Credit (CC) Courses, four Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) papers, and two Skill Enhancement



Courses (SEC) spread over six semesters. The History Honours syllabi pertaining to the History of India, covers a long span of time, and include specifically tailored papers on India's Ancient, Medieval, Modern and Contemporary pasts. The World History papers, including Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of the Ancient World, Rise of the Modern West, and History of Modern Europe among others, offer an insight into significant eras of global history. Honours students in the first year have compulsory Ability Enhancement Credit Courses (AECC) on Languages and Environmental Science. In addition, the students need to opt for Generic Elective (GE) papers offered by other Departments from the first to fourth semesters. Similarly, GE papers are offered by our department to students from other courses.

History discipline and discipline specific Core and Elective papers are taught to students of the BA Programme. The GE and SEC courses offered by the department are in high demand by the students of BA Programme. SEC courses, at both the Honours and B.A. Programme level, have a component of field trip/excursion related to the paper content.



The History Association was initiated by the department in the year 2006. It aims to broaden the horizons of the discipline of history and familiarise students with the emerging trends in the field. Routinely, through the academic session, the Association organises a series of lectures, book discussions, and film screenings on pertinent subjects. Eminent historians from various national and international universities, archaeologists from apex organizations such as The Archaeological Survey of India, independent scholars and heritage experts are invited to share their expertise. Besides these co-curricular events, the Association organises an annual Inter-College History Festival titled 'Antaraal' revolving around a specific theme that is topical and academically stimulating. Antaraal comprises an academic session, with scholars of eminence speaking on the subject; and a cultural aspect where students engage in competitive events woven around the theme, and showcase their knowledge and talent. Over the years, varied themes like the History of Delhi, Environment, Food and Cuisine, Religion and Religiosity, Art History and New Histories, etc. have been taken up in the organisation of Antaraal.

After three years of studying History at the undergraduate level, students can look forward to a more comprehensive understanding and knowledge of our historical past. This equips them to step into either the academic or professional world with knowledge based on skills of critical reasoning, assessment, and cogent expression.

Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics, Gargi College offers a three-year degree programme B.Sc (Honours) Mathematics. The department comprises fifteen faculty members with the combination of experienced seniors and dynamic young members. Faculty members specialise in different areas of pure, applied, financial mathematics, and Computer Science. Faculty members are involved in various research activities and their



research papers get published in various Journals at the National and International levels. The Department is also involved in inter departmental teaching through other courses such as B.Sc (Hons.) Chemistry, B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics, B.Sc. Physical Sciences, B.A. (Hons.) Economics, B.A. (Hons.) Business Economics and B.A. (Prog), B.El.Ed, etc.

The curriculum for B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics has been prepared by the University of Delhi keeping in mind the needs and aspirations of students of mathematics as well as the evolving nature of mathematics as a subject. The course has a balance between pure and applied mathematics. There is an exceptionally broad range of topics covering: Linear Algebra, Metric Spaces, Statistics, Linear Programming, Numerical Analysis, Mathematical Finance, Coding Theory, Mechanics and Biomathematics in the course.



The main aspect of mathematics teaching is the application of it in the real world. To achieve this goal, many papers in the course are based on computer programming and simulation techniques involving real-life problems. For this purpose, the college has a well-equipped computer lab having latest facilities along with several mathematical software like Wolfram Mathematica, R, Scilab, Latex, etc. The

department emphasises on training the students in such a way that they can opt for teaching, research or join industry after graduation. The department also supports the students as they seek to enhance their analytical skills by studying mathematics which helps them in cracking various competitive examinations at national and international levels. Students are made aware of various avenues which would be open after studying mathematics such as Education, Research, Management, Civil



Services, Industry, Finance and many more. A brief structure of the programme is given below:

Structure of B.Sc. (Honours) Mathematics: A student is required to complete 148 credits for completion of the course. For more detail follow the link.

Besides the academic and curricular engagement, the Department is also actively involved in organising and participating in interdisciplinary activities too. Our association 'MATHEMA' organises seminars, lectures and competitions to nurture our students with the knowledge and skills for a successful realisation of their goals.

Microbiology

The recent outbreak caused by the 2019 novel coronavirus (officially named SARS-CoV-2), has highlighted the importance of Microbiologists in the world. They are the ones who deal with the microbes i.e. the organisms too small to be visible to the naked eye yet important for human life. These include bacteria, viruses, algae, fungi, protozoa, etc.

The Department of Microbiology of Gargi College offers B.Sc. (Honours) in Microbiology, which is one of the most



prestigious and sought after 3 years degree courses. The course includes the study of microorganisms; their diversity, structure, nutrition, habitat, mode of reproduction, physiology, taxonomy, etc. The applied aspects of Microbiology are included in the form of study of the medical, food and dairy, environmental and industrial microbiology fields. Besides these, the course also ventures into a large number of fields like molecular biology, biochemistry, microbial genetics, recombinant DNA technology, immunology, biotechnology, metagenomics, bioinformatics, etc.



Under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) programme, B.Sc. (Honours) in Microbiology is offered in the form of a broad range of core courses, Discipline specific elective (DSE) courses and skill enhancement (SE) courses distributed over six semesters.

This course not only imparts an in depth knowledge of the subject, but also enables students to gauge the huge possibilities and practical

applications of microbes in Food, Dairy, Beverage, Pharmaceutical and Cosmetic industries, Climate change, Renewable energy resources, Clinical research, Agriculture, Nanotechnology and many more. For these opportunities, a student may have to pursue M.Sc and PhD in the respective area. These courses can be pursued at various national and international universities and research institutes. The students can also diversify into other fields like marketing, law, journalism, patenting, publishing, etc.

Apart from the Honours course in Microbiology, the Department also offers Generic Elective (GE) courses to students of other science departments.

#hilosophy

Philosophy is the study of general and fundamental problems and inquires - Where does the world come from? How was the earth formed? Does God exist? Did God create the world or has the world been in existence eternally? How is it that man thinks, what is the relation between brain and thought? What is the relation between will and ability? It puts into perspective life issues in the context of Gender, Environment, Medical Ethics, matters of law, Media, Arts, Films, etc. In its broader aspects Philosophy examines the various



kinds of existence and their interrelationships, in Metaphysics; the nature and validity of knowledge, in Epistemology and logic; and the nature of value, in Ethics and Aesthetics.

So, the objective of this subject is to make you read, think, research and critically analyse the world around you. It helps you obtain a self-consistent understanding of things observed. Philosophy helps students



prepare for careers in education, research, mass communication, journalism, social work, law, film appreciation, civil services, management studies and gender studies.

Apart from the Honours course in Philosophy, we offer interdisciplinary papers (GE) as well as skill enhancement courses (SECs) for students of other Honours courses and B.A. Programme. Some of these are: Ethics in the Public Domain, Logic, Feminism, Bio-ethics, Inductive Logic, Technology and Ethics, Ethical Decision

Making, Yoga Philosophy, Critical Thinking, Art and Film Appreciation, and Philosophical Thought of Ambedkar.

Highlights of Activities in 2019-2020:

Mimamsa-Philosophy Society: It is a platform exclusively for philosophical discussions and debates open for participants from all disciplines including students and teachers.

Gnosis-Philosophy Newsletter: It is published annually for the students and by the students. Students propose a central theme every year. This year's theme was 'Philosophy and Fashion'

Dialectica-Annual Philosophy Festival: The Department holds an annual academic meet on a topical issue and a panel of eminent speakers is invited. The speakers are requested to contextualise their presentation in relation to Philosophical Discourses. The latter half of the day is dedicated to competitive inter-college students' events like debates and creative events focussed around the theme. The theme in the just concluded year was: 'Relevance of Philosophy in shaping 21st Century socio-cultural thought'.

There are series of talks and lectures focussed upon the curriculum and inter-disciplinary nature of Philosophy. Some movies are screened too to add to the relativist perspective that we encourage.

This academic year a series of Talks, Films and Lectures by subject experts is lined up.

#hysics

The Physics Department offers various Physics papers to B.Sc. Physics (Honours) and B.Sc. Physical Sciences students. The Department also offers Generic Elective papers to students of various departments. In the last academic year, Physics Department had taught the following Generic Elective papers: Electricity & Magnetism (semester I), Mechanics (semester II), Waves & Optics (semester III) and Thermal and Statistical Physics (semester IV).





Over and above the regular academic curriculum, the students pursue research and do projects under the guidance of the teachers of the Department. Two of the faculty members are supervising PhD scholars. The Department has a Delhi University recognised research lab in which students are earnestly doing research. Physics Department organises summer school every year during the

vacations to introduce the students to various dimensions of the field of Physics. In the last academic year, the Physics Department had organised a summer school to introduce the students to research in the fields like crystal structures, X-ray diffraction, etc.

The Physics Department society, Quasar, is always abuzz with activity throughout the year. The department, under the aegis of this society, organises lectures by eminent scientists from various institutes. To give an opportunity to the students to showcase their talents, various events and competitions are held throughout the academic year. The students are also encouraged to participate in intra/inter college events. They are regularly taken to well-known institutes to expose them to all the research done in these institutes and to the latest state of the art technology available there. The students as well as the faculty members of the Department attend/organise seminars and conferences to keep abreast with current research and latest developments in Physics and other fields.

After completing graduation in Physics, the career options available to students are numerous. To name a few: becoming a scientist, teaching Physics, management, administration, a career in law, etc. Physics graduates are also welcomed into the research and development wing of diverse industries like Material Sciences, Environment and Energy sector, Information and Technology, Defence Research and the communication industry.



#Jolitical Science

Political Science as an academic discipline is well known and much sought after. In recent times, its popularity has grown exponentially. It has become one of the most popular courses being opted for by admission seekers at Gargi College. Political Science analyses and explores the study of state, government, society, social movements along with their interface and political behaviour. At the department of Political Science, Gargi College, the faculty uses innovative pedagogy to deconstruct conformist ideas and attempts to understand politics in an intersectional dimension. Contemporary global issues like climate change, pandemics and many others have made political science a multidisciplinary endeavour wherein we attempt to question and seek answers beyond the Eurocentric notions of development, globalisation, and administration; in a postcolonial society that is racing towards becoming a post truth society.

The Department of Political Science has an exceptional legacy as far as achievements of our faculty members and



students are concerned. Academic excellence is our mantra that allows the department to engage with conceptualisation of governance theory and politics. The Department prides itself on having experienced and academically renowned faculty, whose scholarship and teaching- learning expands across various subfields of Political Science. The courses offered by the department are-- BA Honours, BA Programme and MA in Political Science.

The Department of Political Science at Gargi College offers papers like Political Theory, Indian Politics, India's Foreign Policy in a Globalising World, Indian Political Thought, International Relations, Western Political Thought, Feminism, Development Process and Contemporary Social Movements in India and Public Policy. Considering the contemporary multidisciplinary debates in the world, the Department offers Generic Elective papers like - Politics of Globalisation, Nationalism in India, Understanding Ambedkar, United Nations, Public Opinion and Survey Research, etc. that help students in mapping out the contemporary discourses concerning human development and deepening of democracy in India.

The Department is immensely proactive in organising workshops, talks, seminars and lectures on themes of contemporary global relevance. Thought leaders, Ambassadors, Researchers, Activists, Lawyers and



acclaimed Public Intellectuals from across the globe are invited throughout the year to share insights on political and social issues. The Department endeavours to instil confidence and develop a nuanced understanding of politics and society among its students; hence, it organises several academic and co-curricular activities in which the students play a pivotal role. Elections are held every year by the Department to constitute the student body - Political Science Association, which manages the multifarious departmental activities.

The Department of Political Science holds its flagship event, its Annual Festival, 'POUL POURRI' consisting of day long activities like seminars, debates, and various other competitions that encourage participants from all the colleges across Delhi /NCR. Further, the magazine of the department - 'DEMOS' is published annually to provide a platform to students to articulate their perspectives and comment on contemporary political issues. The Department also organises trips for the students every year during the semester breaks.

It's a matter of great pride for the Department that many of our students are Delhi University toppers. Our students have gone on to do internships at various government ministries and International organisations like UNDP and UNICEF; pursued masters in international universities with scholarships and have gone on to become journalists, lawyers, political analysts and bureaucrats. The Department endeavours to bring about wholesome all-round development of its students during their three years of engagement with the Department.

#sychology

The Department of Psychology at Gargi College was established in the year 1972 when the Psychology course was offered to the students of BA (Programme). Applied Psychology (Honours) as a course was started in 1987. The Department of Psychology, Gargi College started the first ever Honours degree course in University of Delhi in Applied Psychology and till date has spearheaded all the revisions of the syllabus to keep the course in sync with changing times.





The course provides a fundamental knowledge of basic psychology and applications of it in various life settings. The present structure aims to impart basic knowledge in Applied Psychology via the core papers, specialised areas are introduced in the discipline cantered courses and the students are exposed to the application possibilities via the skill based courses. The focus is on foundations of psychology, cognitive, social, counselling; organisational, clinical, media, youth and health psychology. The students are trained to

carry out academic inquiry into psychology and its major sub-fields with an emphasis on its application in real life situations. They are taught effective communication skills, counselling abilities and understanding of scientific writing with a focus on its ethical use. Further they are trained in critically thinking about the linking of personal experiences with concepts studied and using curricula for personal development as well as for emotional and self-regulation skills. The students are encouraged to evolve as individuals with positive attributes of non-judgement, empathy, kindness, multicultural sensitivity and responsibility towards self and community.

≸anskrit

The Sanskrit Department of Gargi College is one of the best Departments of Delhi University. The relevance of studying Sanskrit has increased in recent times and can offer students many avenues of intellectual and professional growth. A knowledge of Sanskrit is useful in many professional areas like media (Sanskrit news reading and other programme based on ancient culture), management (knowledge of Indian system of management of life),



Ayurveda, yoga, poetics, music, theatre, history, philosophy of languages, linguistic, computer linguistics, animation industry and translation work, etc. The Department offers an Honours course in Sanskrit.

The Department also organises inter-college and inter-class competitions every year to boost the confidence of students and give them sufficient exposure to develop their overall personality.

Zoology

The B.Sc. (Honours) Zoology curriculum offers a detailed and comprehensive study of animals, their structure, functions, behaviour and evolution. The programme also includes a study of physiology, biochemistry, immunology, genetics, cell and molecular biology, biotechnology; developmental biology as well as ecology making. The Zoology (Honours) course is a balanced one. Inclusion of some recent papers like neurosciences, computational biology, research methodology, medical diagnostics, etc. have further added value to this course. The theoretical part of the curriculum is well supported with the practical exercises where students get hands on experience in handling many scientific instruments and learn latest techniques in biology.

The department has four well-equipped teaching laboratories, an advanced microscopy room and a research room. In addition to this we have a wonderful museum with a good stock of invertebrate and vertebrate specimens.

The excellent teaching staff of the Department are entrusted with bringing out the best in students through lectures, presentations, assignments, excursions, seminars, workshops, etc.



The Department maintains a good research culture and many students of the Department are involved in minor research projects guided by the teachers.

Regular Departmental Activities

The departmental society 'Albatross' organises several lectures and competitions throughout the year on various academic and other topics of general interest to motivate and encourage students.

Highlights of Activities in 2019-2020:

- The Zoological Society organized two lectures in this session. Dr. Sushil K. Jha, Associate Professor of Neurobiology, School of Life Sciences, JNU spoke on the topic 'Sleep & Memory Consolidation: What, How & When?' and the second lecture by Dr. Rashmi Sharma, Scientist E, Department of Science & Technology, Government of India was on "Opportunities in Science & Technology".
- A poetry competition was organised where participants showcased their poetic skills leaving the audience spellbound.
- On the occasion of World Heart Day, a poster making competition was organised on the theme 'Be a heart hero, make a heart promise'. Participants unleashed their creative and artistic side.
- To spread awareness and to emphasise the importance of suicide prevention, the Department organised a doodling competition. The theme of the event was 'LIFE: your story isn't over yet'.
- Two Hands-On Workshops viz. "Hands-on in biological techniques" and "Biotechnique" were conducted that exposed students to latest techniques in the field of Biology.
- In continuation of its endeavour of keeping students closely connected with their environment; to see, understand and appreciate diversity, the Department organised a bird count in the college campus on February 17, 2020, in collaboration with 'Great Backyard Bird Count'.
 - Students graduating with an 'Honours' degree in Zoology have various avenues open to them. Channels like National Geographic, Animal Planet and Discovery Channel provide ample opportunities for the zoologists. The degree also serves as a basis for higher studies in this field, like M.Sc, M.Phil and PhD in Zoology, and also Life-sciences, Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Toxicology, Genetics, Forestry & Wildlife, etc. With the acknowledged importance of the environment in human development and survival, a study of Zoology equips students with the necessary skills to contribute meaningfully to the future of planet Earth.

B.A. Programme

B. A. Programme with its interdisciplinary structure and opportunities is one of the most sought-after courses for students who wish to explore different academic subjects while learning about their mutual connections. This course is definitely meant for students who wish to chart their own unique paths. The B.A. Programme course which is being offered by the University of Delhi is extremely flexible as students are introduced to diverse subjects of disciplinary and interdisciplinary nature.

Subjects in B.A. Programme are relevant to the immediate context of academic opportunities and offer intellectual skills expected of a programme pertaining to higher education. Students can choose from an array of subjects, explore new and interesting courses and, at the same time, can plan to do a Master's programme in any of the offered discipline subjects. This course provides the students enough knowledge about a discipline to pursue postgraduate studies. It is perceived both as a terminal degree with substantial

intellectual stimulation and as an enabling degree for further studies. It is a course that opens up various avenues and a promising range of opportunities after graduation. Gargi College offers a wide range of subject combinations over the 6 semesters.

GE - Generic Elective is an elective interdisciplinary paper which is chosen from a subject other than the main disciplines/subjects being opted for.

In B.A. Programme, you need to remember:

- Each student will have to study minimum 4 papers in each semester.
- English and Hindi are compulsory language papers for all students.

- Students who have scored 80% and above in English in Class XII will study the English Language through Literature Paper.
- Students who have scored 60% and above up to 80% will study the English Fluency Paper.
- Students who have scored less than 60% will study the English Proficiency Paper.
- Students who have studied English till Class X will study English B
- Students who have studied Hindi till Class XII will study Hindi A
- Students who have studied Hindi till Class X will study Hindi B
- Students who have studied Hindi till Class VIII will study Hindi C
- In case a student has not studied Hindi in school up till class VIII, she will have the option of studying papers in Philosophy in lieu of Hindi. Students who take the combination of Discipline English and German will also be studying papers in Philosophy in lieu of Hindi. Students who wish to opt for this alternative will have to bring the necessary supporting documents.
- Each student has to choose 2 Discipline papers which cannot be changed during the course of 3 years
 as per rules of the University of Delhi. The students must pursue the same combination in all the
 three years.
- Seats in each Discipline are limited.
- Courses/Papers will not be offered if the total number of students opting for a particular course/paper is less than 10.
- No prior knowledge of German is required to opt for German as a Discipline course.
- You may choose a different SEC and GE course option in each subsequent semester that is you can opt for courses being offered by different departments of the college.
- Students opting for mathematics should have compulsorily studied and passed mathematics till class XII.

Besides having a rigorous academic structure, the B.A. Programme Association, Navadrishti, organises a plethora of activities throughout the year. B.Sc. Programme

The B.Sc. programme curriculum offers multidisciplinary knowledge of science subjects. It includes B.Sc. Life Sciences and B.Sc. Physical Sciences. B.Sc. Life Sciences is a combination of Botany, Chemistry and Zoology while B.Sc. Physical Sciences includes Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics as its core subjects. These courses have been designed to provide a



comprehensive study of both conventional and contemporary topics from the field of science with a combination of experimental and theoretical knowledge. A degree in B.Sc. Programme provides students with a broad spectrum to specialise in a subject of their choice at the Master's level. The B.Sc. Programme students have an association named "ZENITH" which organises a series of academic and extra-curricular activities throughout the year for overall development of the students. 'Zenith' has also started its annual magazine named "Infinitus" in the session 2018-19. This magazine promotes sharing and expanding knowledge through team work, peer learning and peer evaluation thus allowing the natural talents of students to flourish. B.Sc. Programme students are actively engaged in popular societies of college like Euphony, Hues, Nazaakat, Kshitij, Sparx, NSS, NCC and Sports. Research opportunities are also provided to interested students. In the year 2019-20, several activities were organised by the Department. Talks on

the 'Significance of Forensic Chemistry in Crime Scene Management'; "Gender Bias in Science" and "Nanotechnology: Big Things from Tiny World" by Dr. G.S. Sodhi, Dr. Sushmita Chowdhury and Dr. Vinod Kumar, respectively, were organised by the Department.

A debate on "Is It Possible to Live without Plastic in Today's World?" a Quiz competition named 'Zenith Trivia' and competition of 'Face Painting' on the theme "Sci-fi fantasy" were the other noteworthy activities. B.Sc. Life Sciences students went for educational visits to the National

Their resoluteness was at its peak when they hosted the western dance event "Zenith" at Reverie 2020 which enabled the dancers of Delhi



University to showcase their talents. Enliven organised another event, Short Circuit, which had a line-up of showcases of talented artists from all over Delhi.

With the motive to aspire and achieve more they believe in 4 C's - Confidence, Coordination, Competition and Compassion. They bagged multiple prizes (in 33 fests till date and counting) under the guidance of



their mentor Mr. Dheeraj Soni, the choreographer, in colleges like Shivaji College, Mata Sundari College, DTU, SPMC, Shaheed Sukhdev and many more.

They have achieved the top 12 rank within the professional crews in all India and have also been acknowledged as one of the strongest girls' crews in India.

Euphony-The Western Music Society

Euphony, the western music society of Gargi college is one of the most prestigious a Capella societies in Delhi University. They have creatively covered a wide range of music genres - from classical to jazz, pop to R&B, etc. - with their own touch and renditions, decorated with the experimental abilities of its dynamic members.

The society provides opportunities for the development of knowledge in music both as a choir and as individual musicians through various workshops, apart from its active involvement in Gargi's cultural programmes.

Glass Eye-The Film Club

Glass Eye was started with the motive of only screening movies on various issues and holding discussions for the same. However, in 2012, it has stepped into the field of documentary and film making. In its 7th year, Glass Eye has become one of the most reputed societies in the DU circuit. It has achieved accolades and recognition in various colleges and competitions. In 2019, the society was placed first at the 72 hour film-making competition hosted by Miranda House and third at the Ad-mad hosted by Sri Venkateswara College. The society also curated a Zine on Gully Boy which was appreciated publicly by Zoya Akhtar herself. The society hosts various events throughout the year, including at Reverie and Prism.

HUES - The Fine Arts Society

HUES, the fine arts society of Gargi College, aims at learning different art forms, craft techniques and overall skill building and provides a creative outlet for its society members. The society focuses on three main artistic productions- Fresher's, Prism- a visual art exhibition and Reverie - the annual festival of the college.

Apart from these large scale events, Hues has painstakingly yet elegantly and successfully held and attended exhibitions inside and outside the college as well as organised several workshops throughout the year including an acrylic in-house workshop, an outhouse workshop and a talk on storyboard and composition headed by NID graduate Mr. Partha Sengupta.





Prism, our main visual arts event is an amalgamation of exhibitions of fine arts, photography and filmmaking and was held on 19th October 2019. It paved a way for artists to showcase and explore various art styles and mediums like watercolour, acrylic, sketching, posters, digital painting, craft and installations.

Hues participated in and won many competitions throughout the year in several institutions like IIT Delhi - where our members secured positions in Tattoo making, Live sketching and Charcoal sketching, IIT Bombay- where they participated in and won in Costume Designing , and DU colleges like LSR, JMC, SGGSCC, Maitreyi,

ZHDC, Dyal Singh College and others where they won several events like Costume Designing, poster making, Poetry Illustration, Doodling, sketching, collage making and canvas painting among others.

Iris - The Photography Society

The Photography Society of Gargi College is a unique group of enthusiastic young photographers trying to hone their skills and develop their own photography styles.

We nurture our members' talents by holding workshops with professional photographers who help to infuse finesse in our techniques and inspire us to experiment with different camera settings, light and genres. We also conduct regular Photo walks across Delhi NCR, which then manifest into hundreds of photographs for our annual exhibition held during our college fest, 'Reverie'.

Iris currently consists of 15 members with Dr. Swati Shweta as the Teacher Convener and Tejaswini as the Student Convener.

For the 2019-2020 session, Iris started off by conducting a basic photography workshop



by Mr. Vinit Gupta, a professional photographer which was followed by various photo walks to historical monuments, markets of Old and New Delhi like Chandni Chowk, Paharganj, Ghazipur phool mandi, Nizamuddin Dargah, and many more. Iris also took a workshop on narratives and perceptions of



photography by Mr. Kabir and another workshop on in-depth technicalities of photography from Mr. Jawed Syed Azghar, and a studio lighting workshop by Miss Anjali Lohia. Besides the photo walks, we also organised both outdoor as well as indoor shoots where Iris experimented with all that had been taught using props and lights.

This year Prism was also conducted along with the Film-Making Society, Glass Eye and Fine Arts Society, Hues. It had various displays of work categorised as 'Mard', 'Diwar', 'Hara' and 'Roti-Kapdha-Makaan' where members of Iris had come together to put photographs under one theme. The festival had fun interactive games and a kaleidoscopic display of photographs by the members of the society.

Apart from these activities, Iris also organised two photography competitions during the college fest 'Reverie', where it received an amazing response. Iris also put out an exhibition on the theme of 'La Expresión' during Reverie which had a studio wall, a wall of portraits and an abstract display. It was a grand success. During the fest season, our members bagged top three positions in different colleges. Other members who participated got recognitions as well.

Kshitij - The Street Play Society

Kshitij - The Street play Society of Gargi College was formed in 2003. The society is made up of dynamic young women who fearlessly use theatre to raise their voice against social evils and political issues. Their annual play production of this year, RA-वर्ण-VAAS, talks about Casteism as an issue that has prevailed over the centuries even after the 72 years of provision of equality by the Constitution of India, an inviolable sacrament of democracy. The burden of the caste system falls on the





lowest castes, violating fundamental rights on humanitarian grounds. The play focuses on how throughout history, The Dalit, Bahujan and Adivasi communities have been marginalised and their revolts have been silenced. And as this problem prevails, the aim is to stick to Dr. BR. Ambedkar's commandments- Educate, Agitate, Organise. Having had the opportunity to perform at ARSD College's Streetplay event, the new production, 'RA-quf-VAAS' grew organically as a successful play in the circuit and bagged many

laurels like the 1st position at Shiv Nadar University, Sri Guru Gobind Singh College and NIFT. Additionally, it bagged the second position at Zakir Hussain College. The annual street play production of 2018-19, 'हালার 21' was selected for Pulse, the cultural festival of AIIMS. The team also performed the play at the International Healthcare Symposium hosted at Indian Habitat Centre, a Durga Pooja event, Fabula, The Streetplay event of IMT, Ghaziabad, winning the award for Best Music and at Manipal University, Jaipur, successfully closing the play and bagging the first position. Kshitij also won the second runner up award for The Best Theatre Society category at The Delhi College Awards Ceremony organised by The Education Tree.

Instruments like Djembe, Harmonium, Dholak, Clap box and other small instruments like, manjira, maracuss, and bongo are played in the play to intensify the scenes. Various props are made by the students according to the topic of the play to add beautiful visuals to the scene. Kshitij brings to light the important and valuable issues each year and makes a play each year aiming at bringing change in the society. 


Sparx - The Choreography Society

The event was very successful in many ways as we had 2 guest demonstrations in between performances for it to not remain just a competition but, an immersive learning experience. The event received a great response, with there being more than 75 entries for participation with 6 teams eventually making it to the finals. Social Outreach and Awareness

It may not be within everyone's reach to help monetarily but an individual surely possesses an angelic heart, to take pity on the needy, visit the sick and comfort the lonely. Gargi College teaches its young adults that the goal of self-fulfilment is conjoint with one's responsibility towards society in the true spirit of Sir Jagdish Chandra Bose's axiom, "Remember there can be no happiness for any one, unless it is won for all." The social awareness and outreach programmes provide numerous avenues to students to fulfil their higher order needs. Some of our programmes are:

Avni : The Eco Club

Avni - the Eco Club Society of Gargi College has worked to create an ecological consciousness in the college campus by organising activities that can create green footprints for a sustainable society. The inaugural lecture this year was delivered by Prof. V. K Sharma (Former Senior Professor, Disaster Management, IIPA). During this event the students of the eco-club took a pledge to reduce the use of one-time use plastic.

A workshop on 'Green Senses: An Educational Campus Inventory, An Eco Survey' where the students were trained to survey and audit the resources in the campus in the 5 major domains: Energy, Water, Waste, Land and Air, by CSE (Centre for Science and Environment). This workshop was organised by the ECO CLUB in collaboration with IQAC and the B.El.Ed. Department of Gargi College. Five dedicated teams worked on doing the Eco Survey. The results of the Eco - survey were presented by Ms. Sakshi Kabra at the North Regional Conclave organised by CSE in Guru Nanak Dev University in Amritsar.

Eco Club worked concertedly towards water conservation this year. A visit to the rainwater harvesting facilities was conducted by Dr. Shashi Tyagi. Sakshi Kabra of the Eco-Club trained students to do personal water audits. The Eco Club organised a 3 hours Lecture cum Demonstration workshop on "Adulteration in Food and Preparation of Herbal Cosmetics". The workshop was organised in association with Star College Scheme in Gargi College. A special booklet was prepared titled "Adulteration in Food and Preparation of Herbal Cosmetics" by the teachers, these books were given to students as resource material for the workshop. The workshop witnessed a huge participation of 110 students of Gargi College from different courses. The Eco Club also organised a Lecture on Environmental Issues. The lecture was delivered by Dr. B.C. Sabata (Senior Scientific Officer, Department of Environment, Delhi Secretariat). The lecture gave a critical insight to students about the environmental issues in their surroundings and helped them to know the solutions to combat these issues. To map the zoological diversity in Gargi College Campus, a bird watching session was organised. The Eco Club also organised a sapling distribution drive, a campaign on 'Save the Tiger' and a poetry writing session for students. The students of the Eco-Club also participated in several events outside the college like Climate Jamboree by TERI, workshops on noise pollution control organised by Ministry of Environment, Environmental Film Festival organised at IIC and Ecothon organised by IGNCA.

Centre for Diversity and Inclusion

The Gargi College Centre for Diversity and Inclusion was set up in June 2020 with the intention of working actively to inculcate empathy in our students and make them aware of the diversity of not only their peers but also the community that they inhabit. This is in keeping with international best practices of educational institutions and a model we aspire to emulate, in keeping with Gargi's proud traditions of preparing our students to become good citizens of the world and don mantles of leadership in whatever field they choose to enter after graduation.

We are a part of society which is constantly evolving and is highly diverse in nature. In such times, the distinguished and democratic institutions of the country, such as the likes of Gargi, need to have active representation from all the different minorities that house them. A widely accepted structure among the most prestigious educational institutions all across the globe, Diversity Centres serve this purpose by drawing attention to the needs and concerns of the minorities in their respective spaces. Having a formal structure in place for the minorities will provide them with the agency to organise events that will initiate important democratic interactions. This will further invite several perspectives, giving the students of Gargi a chance to push their boundaries, helping them grow and providing a sense of collectiveness along with increasing their understanding of the social issues that prevail in our society. This initiative will serve as a common platform that helps the students to look at important issues from various perspectives and work empathetically towards them in a more holistic way.

We have a model of affiliation of the existing societies in the college that are already working actively in this field: The Equal Opportunity Cell; The Enabling Unit; The North East Society and Izhaar. Along with them we have also affiliated a Club that seeks to address issues of gender orientation and belonging - The White Rose Club.

While each of the existing societies will continue to work independently with their individual student and teacher committees, this Centre will be the common umbrella under which we could meaningfully engage with the issues that are of great interest and importance for our students and organise events accordingly, with a common event every year to synergise our common goal - celebrating individual differences.

Our primary aim is to sensitise the students and indeed all stake holders of Gargi, towards acceptance without pre conceived notions clouding their judgments. The Centre will also act as a safe space for all the members, facilitating their mental health and helping them achieve a holistic and happy life.

This is a great milestone in the journey of our college, towards the enrichment and empowerment of all our students.

Enabling Unit

The enabling unit of Gargi College helped provide support to the differently abled students within the college. Each student was assigned a 'buddy' who can provide critical support wherever needed. The enabling unit held the screening of a film by Shweta Ghosh titled 'Accsex' which explores journey of four women with disability on issues of beauty, body image and sexuality. The annual festival of Enabling unit was held on 26th March 2019. A movie titled 'Intouchables' was screened based on issues of care of the disabled. A special lecture on 'Challenging 'Normalcy' and 'Ableism' in Context of Persons with Disability' was delivered by Prof. Anita Ghai, Professor, School of Human Studies, AUD. The student events were conducted in a structurally non-competitive and dialogical format to challenge the concept of 'Ableism'.

Enactus Gargi

Enactus is a global non-profit organisation committed to the idea of transforming lives through entrepreneurial action. At Enactus, students take up projects and spearhead social change. Enactus Gargi, established in 2013, is currently a team of 65 undergraduates successfully running three projects - Project Rachna, Project Aagah, and Project Neev.

Within Project Rachna, Enactus Gargi provides employment and income opportunities to the marginalised and differently-abled sections of women from Jharsa, Vasant Kunj, Paharganj, and

Faridabad communities by training them to make utility products out of post-consumer textile waste. Project Rachna has directly impacted the lives of over 310 people and indirectly impacted the lives of approximately 908 people. The products created by the women are further marketed by us through setting up stalls at various colleges, corporates, and markets. Thus, by training women to make useful and quirky products out of consumer textile waste, Project Rachna is one step closer to ensuring a sustainable lifestyle.

Under Project Aagah, we aim to influence the youth of the underprivileged sections of the



society by imparting knowledge and raising their civic awareness. We have worked on themes ranging from gender to inclusion and successfully conducted workshops with the community of Masoom Zindagi NGO, Vardhaan Old Age Home among many others. With this approach, we turn the youth into active and aware citizens and motivate them to take up entrepreneurial projects of their own.

With Project Neev, we initiated a step towards preserving the dying art form of pottery by amalgamating it with yet another important aim of sustainability. At its nascent stage, this project was initiated in college in the year 2019-2020 to make the campus plastic-free by substituting plastic cups/glasses with Kulhads. Along with a plastic-free healthy campus, this Project aims to render livelihood to the potters' community.



With this project, we take one step closer to building a healthy sustainable plastic-free environment.

We also organised the third edition of the annual Enactus Festival, Aarohanam 3.0 which saw active participation of over 65 teams. The theme of the fest was 'Climate Action' and saw experts sharing their views on the pressing issue alongside several competitions



where participants brainstormed to find their solutions to the most prevalent climate concerns. Enactus Gargi, with our diligence, aims to continue working with enthusiasm, inspire change, and uplift the marginalised sections of society.

Equal Opportunity Cell

The equal opportunity cell of the college, set up in 2010, is a multidisciplinary group which undertakes many activities with the objective of sensitising the students regarding the challenges faced by the disadvantaged groups of the society. The cell is committed to providing an equal platform to every student and to specifically cater to the requirements of physically challenged students of the college. The cell addresses the issues of access and equality.



Purpose of the Cell

To empower the differently abled students by providing them an enabling environment to help them overcome their problems and realize their potential.

Capacity building of the students through the various programmes of the cell which helps them to understand different perspectives related to issues of equity, justice and inclusion.

Activities of the Cell

Keeping the above objective in mind, the EOC organises various activities like -

- Lecture series
- Provides active support to the differently abled students of the college in terms of dissemination of relevant information from the University and other institutes and



- assistance in arranging writers for the examination.
- Organises inter-college fest for the differently abled students.
- The fest comprises of inter-college competitions like poster making, singing, dance, creative writing and rangoli making.
- The physically challenged students of the college participate actively in the cultural and sports events organised by the University.
- Mentoring the students admitted under PH category

Highlights of Activities in 2019-2020

This year the Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC) organised a talk by Dr Satish Misra, Senior Fellow, Observer Research Foundation, on "Concept of Equality in the Indian Constitution" on 6th November, 2019. He focused on the various provisions pertaining to the concept of equality, equity and social justice in the Indian Constitution and analysed them in the present context. He raised questions like: Is everyone equal in our country? How deep is our democracy and how well established are the constitutional values of equality, justice and equality of opportunity, in practice? In our citizenry in free India is everyone equal? The session was engaging, thought provoking and enjoyable. The audience raised several questions about the contemporary Indian social realities and how these would shape the destiny of our country in the years to come. The cell also empowered the differently abled students by providing them an enabling environment to help them overcome their problems and realise their potential.

Gandhi Study Circle

The Gandhi Study Circle (GSC) of the college was established in 2008 with a view to revisit, review and debate Gandhi by the young generation. Gandhi Study Circle of Gargi College is a prominent cell not only among all the societies of the college but also of the entire University of Delhi. Here, the students become part of the Gandhian theories and practices. The study circle conducts a number of programmes to make the students, both members and non-members,



aware about the non-violent ideas of Gandhi. The circle invites renowned scholars to deliver lectures and talks on various aspects of Gandhi and Gandhian thought with a view to revisit, review and debate Gandhi by the young generation as also to inculcate Gandhian values and ideals among them.

Purpose of GSC

- To inculcate Gandhian values and ideals among students
- All round development of the students by emphasising Gandhian principles of simplicity and selflessness
- To understand and implement the work and philosophies of Mahatma Gandhi
- To educate students about the impact and importance of Gandhian ideologies and their relevance in contemporary times

Activities of GSC

To promote Gandhian thought and action, the Circle organises many programmes and activities like:

- Lectures and panel discussions
- Film and documentary screenings
- Intra and inter college competitions like poster making, slogan writing, debate, quiz, etc.
- Visit to National Gandhi Museum and Gandhi Samadhi Rajghat
- Book and photo exhibition on Gandhi
- Cleanliness drive as part of Swach Bharat Abhiyaan

Activities during 2019-2020

The circle's activities commemced with Gandhi Jayanti celebrations on 27.9.2019 with a talk by Prof. Salil Mishra, PVC, Ambedkar University on "Gandhi in Today's World".

This was followed by intra-college poster making & slogan writing competition on 8.11.2019. Gargi students participated in both these events in good numbers and with much enthusiasm.

The study circle had its Annual Fest on 5.3.2020. The Fest comprised of a talk on "Mahatma Gandhi: Satya aur Satyagraha" which was delivered by Prof. Girishwar Misra, former VC, Mahatma Gandhi Antarashtriya Vishvavidyalay, Wardha.

As part of the Fest, inter-college events like Debate, Poster Making and Slogan Writing competitions were organised. The students debated on the topic "Satyagraha as a political strategy is unworkable in today's corrupt and violent society". They made poster presentations and wrote slogans on the topic "Gandhi: Satya aur Satyagraha". All these events saw a good participation of students from DU colleges. The Fest was a huge success.



Marketing Society

Established in 2013, the aim of The Marketing Society has been to develop a 360-degree exposure to the field of marketing management. The society aims at inculcating the skills of critical thinking and reasoning, analytical abilities and marketing knowledge in all its members.

The society organises its annual marketing fest, ALOHOMORA, on contemporary topics in the domain of marketing. We have had the pleasure of hosting eminent personalities such as Mr. Suhel Seth, Mr. Surjit Bhalla, Mr. Dilip Cherian, Mr. Sudhir Chaudhary, Prof. Pushpesh Pant and Ms. Nitibha Kaul, as panellists for our events. Over the years, the fest has seen massive participation from students from a number of colleges, who are intrigued and fascinated by the various competitions that test their marketing acumen and skills.



The society also organises Ebullience - the marketing week. Online competitions are held throughout the week and students from across Delhi NCR participate enthusiastically in it.

This year the society established its Instagram account-'tms.gargi', whose relatable and informative content became an instant hit. Our online campaigns 'Aesthetics' gained massive popularity and was



appreciated and recognised extensively across the DU circuit. Within a short span of time, the society has managed to acquire a reach of 80,000+ through intriguing social media campaigns and engaging stories.

To showcase our knowledge acquired over the year, the society publishes its annual newsletter based on the theme established for the year. The newsletter is circulated in various colleges, and has been consistently appreciated. This year the society was rated 2nd best amongst marketing societies by DU Assassins.

National Cadet Corps

NCC plays a pivotal role in shaping the overall personality of a cadet and preparing them for new walks of life, for unforeseen challenges. The Gargi College NCC unit is committed not only to help the youth but is also committed to larger causes i.e., to serve the nation and help developing it for the more challenging times ahead. It conducts various activities like firing, rock climbing, parachuting, trekking, flying, paragliding, snow skiing, mountaineering, river rafting, etc. at suitable sites. At the institution, during NCC classes, cadets are trained to do Drill, Guard of Honour, Section Attack, Cultural Activities, Mock-drills of



Disaster Management and all theory subjects. They participate in various camps such as Para-sailing

Besides, our cadets also participate in different inter-college competitions and bring many laurels to the college. Our cadets also participate in social service activities like visit to old age homes, helping blind students, antidrugs rally, AIDS awareness drive, Swachcha Bharat Abhiyan, tree plantation, community health awareness, etc. Not only this, our cadets are voluntarily participating in Govt. of India's initiatives to deal with pandemic COVID-19.

Northeast Society

The Northeast Society of Gargi College was formed in March 2018 with an aim to integrate and empower students from the eight states of Northeast India. The society strives to create a platform to manifest the uniqueness and diversity of the region. It tries to sensitise the community by conducting various exposures in the form of talks, exhibitions, cultural performances and competitions. It also aspires to





spread awareness among people especially the college fraternity about the lesser known cultures of the region and thus bring more understanding and cohesiveness amongst students and faculties of the college and beyond.

Every academic session a cultural festival 'Mèlange' meaning Variety, is held displaying the cultural uniqueness and diversity of the region through songs, dances, ethnic attires and cuisines which attracts a lot of audience.

National Service Scheme

NSS Gargi, is one of the most active units of the University of Delhi circuit, has laudably lived up to its motto "Not Me; But You", by organising and participating in various activities revolving around the social benefits for our society. Fourteen in-campus cleanliness drives were organised this year besides participating in cleanliness drives at Yamuna Bank and Shahpur Jat. Other activities like seminar, pledge and distribution drive were held under 'Swacchta Hi Seva' campaign. Donation Drives of newspapers, dry snacks, sanitary napkins, food and clothing have also been organised consistently throughout the year.



NSS Gargi also organised events like open mikes, movie screenings, awareness programmes on self-care, group discussions, competitions, oath takings, etc. to celebrate occasions like NSS Day, Gandhi Jayanti,



National Unity Day, Voter's Day, Republic Day and the first anniversary of decriminalization of section 377 of the IPC. A series of eight holistic workshops were organised, for enhancing personality, healthy relationships, leadership skills and stress management. These events have consistently allowed a better exchange of ideas and have spread awareness through the enthusiastic participation of volunteers.

NSS volunteers also got various opportunities throughout the year to attend a number of lectures like, the

launch of iSAFE, lecture on public diplomacy, memorial lecture on Late Mr. Arun Jaitley, seminar on voting rights, road safety and positivity and a workshop on Tide Turner - The Young Leaders Plastic Change. Furthermore, in order to spread awareness on electoral functions, an 'Electoral Verification Program' collaboration with SVEEP was organised, along with seminars, pledges and competitions. The flagship event: Blood Donation Camp and the Annual NSS fest: Zistatva had performances by NGOs and NSS stalls were also put up. Besides organising such events, NSS works with various NGOs like The Vidya Foundation, Connecting Dreams Foundation, The Vidya Jyoti Project, JAAV, Wishes and Blessings,

AADI, Cheshire Home, Asiad Village, etc. to assist the people there.

With a vision to produce conscientious, smart and confident citizens who serve humanity, NSS Gargi has grown in different ways. It would always strive to reach out to the larger society through the sacred actions of service.



Unmukti, The Women's Development Centre

Gargi is a college named after an extremely courageous and accomplished woman, unafraid to ask troubling questions. Unmukti, the Women's Development Centre (WDC), is a space that strives to give contemporary young women a chance to honour their potential to grow up free, fearless and dignified. Our college's WDC is a vibrant forum for the undergraduate student to think about, talk about and act upon gender and sexuality based inequality and violence, which remain a stubborn and disturbing fact of our everyday lives. The services provided by the WDC are available to all members of the Gargi student community, but students are also welcome to take up membership in the core team and participate in 60 hours of activities, spanning workshops, seminars, talks, debates and discussions, and field trips. All our

activities engage with the gendered nature of a range of issues, be they legal, economic, social or cultural.

Our focus is to provide academic opportunities and skills-development along a variety of planes. We empower students to learn how to tackle everyday physical harassment, for example, through the Self-Defence training we provide in collaboration with other organisations including the Delhi Police. We conduct intensive skill-building workshops on subjects like child abuse, surviving gender-based violence and abuse, police procedure, legal redress so that students become more resourceful when faced with these challenges.

Our Outstation Students Cell offers support to students who come from outside Delhi - a major chunk of the corporate body of the college - including guidebooks on the city of Delhi, resources on paying guest accommodation/hostels, healthcare facilities and the like. In addition, we also run a sanitary napkin vending service on a cost-to-cost basis, as well as a day-care facility for the children of any member of the college needing such services.

The Centre organises, besides its annual festival, add-on/certificate courses and workshops/trainings and internships which provide academic opportunities beyond coursework. Our action-based research projects, such as our Safety Audit of the immediate zones of/around college, lead to publishable writing for student participants besides helping to change things in the worlds they move through for the better. We also encourage students to take up summer and winter internships in collaboration with important NGOs to enable students to gain co-curricular skills that stand them in good stead in future personal and professional ventures including higher education in gender-core programs. Unmukti invites students to join to make the most of their opportunity to make change, be it ever so small, in an unequally gendered world.

All our student work is conducted through a diverse and heterogeneous team of "Gender Champions," elected office bearers from each department, who organise and conceptualise specific activities for sensitisation and mainstreaming of gender-based equality under the supervision and mentorship of the teachers' committee. This is a prestigious and important position available to students and we hope many of you prospective students will consider taking it up. We look forward to another lively and inspiring year of Unmukti!

Internal Quality Assessment Cell

The IQAC in 2019-2020 continued with the internal training of members and utilisation of opportunities to interact and learn from IQAC teams of institutions from outside New Delhi.

 Presentation of work on 'Eco-survey' initiated by IQAC in collaboration with Ecoclub in the One-Day National Conference on 'Importance and Implementation of Academic, Administrative, Green and



Gender Audits in HEIs' held at Shivaji Mahavidyalaya, Udgir, Dist: Latur (Maharashtra) on 30-01-2020 in collaboration with National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore. It was presented by student-convener of EcoClub for the past two years and she won the best presenter award. She presented the work as a research paper titled 'Green Sense at a Delhi College, Eco-Audit and Best Practices for Sustainable Development'.

- Detailed face-to-face feedback suggestions to seek suggestions from all stakeholders faculty members, administrative staff, lab staff, support staff on suggestions for improvement in their direct sphere of work along with institutional development. The IQAC team shared its sphere of work and its endeavours in the past three years. IQAC gained many insights from these meetings and planned for the formation of future sub-committees involving all stakeholders in finalising the SOPs in various spheres of institutional work. This would take into account suggestions of all stakeholders and their aspirations for improvement of institutional culture.
- Digital initiatives for transparency in accessing information by staff and students was attempted along with the website committee and Mobiquel. A trial run by a core-group tested related apps developed as a consequence of the initiative to ascertain their effectiveness.
- Constitution of sub-committee for the proposal to set up a Language Lab at Gargi.
- Memorandum of understanding signed with ICT Academy in December 2019 to promote skill training through organising digital literacy and financial literacy for students and skill enhancement for administrative staff and FDPs in the next 12 months. During the lockdown days it has provided opportunities for continuous learning in digital knowledge for students and teachers. This is in addition to the online teaching by faculty through various formats.
- Student-members of IQAC ran a campaign on Instagram to ascertain student perspective of 'institutional distinctiveness' of Gargi College.

Placement Cell

A total of 94 companies provided recruitment opportunities this year, beginning in the month of August 2019, with the arrival of EY GDS. Some of the visiting organisations were big corporate names like Deloitte India, EY India, KPMG India, D.E Shaw, Genpact, Bain and Company, Byju's, PriceWaterhouse Coopers, Inshorts, ITC Hotels, Macquarie Bank and Josh Talks among others. Several organisations including Deutsche Bank offered placement opportunities to the alumni batches. The highest package this placement season has been 20.5 LPA offered by D.E Shaw group, a global investment and technology development firm followed by Lido learning and ITC Hotels.













A total of 125 organisations provided internship opportunities to the students. Aditya Birla Sun Life, Ashoka University, University of Essex, Eigo Paathshala, Zomato Feeding India and Doubtnut were some of them. For the first time KPMG extended CA articleship opportunity for the final year batch.

Deloitte USI extended an opportunity to the first and second years of commerce stream to be a part of their Graduate School Maverick Program. This year the placement cell took up four new initiatives to help the students get acquainted to the corporate world. Corporate Connect, our first initiative was to help students



prepare for recruitments. These include group discussions tips, personal interview tips, etc. Crack the Code, our Instagram initiative helped the students with relevant tips to ace the interview with the frame of various profiles. Mind Scribble, our WhatsApp initiative was to enhance the knowledge set of students and to keep them well informed. Our LinkedIn initiative focuses on maintaining an annual report of all the events and functioning of the cell.

Infrastracture and Facilities

Auditorium

The college boasts of having its own state-of-theart auditorium: the meridian of architectural finesse, with a seating capacity of 750 spread over the main floor and the mezzanine. The airy, spacious portico endowed with natural daylight and furnished with tables and chairs serves as a quiet place for conducting tutorial classes. The auditorium block is fully air-conditioned and equipped with solar lighting installations.



Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility

Gargi College is one of the two colleges and the only Women's college in University of Delhi to have BIF (funded by DBT with a yearly grant for maintenance and allied expenses). Undergraduate

students from any discipline of Science can implement bioinformatics projects with guidance from faculty.

Bookshop

A bookshop offering attractive discounts is stocked with the curriculum books for various courses as well as with stationery products. It is located on the passageway to the library.



Computer Laboratories

Computers have become an indispensably essential part of the undergraduate college curricula with the introduction of a variety of revised and restructured courses. The three computer laboratories in the college consisting of 110 computers with Wi-Fi connectivity provide students with an opportunity for hands-on training and enhancing their computing skills. The laboratories are also available for career-intensive education after regular class hours.



Food Court

The Food Court, the students' favourite hangout, is where the action is. With lots of yummy food offered at reasonable prices, this is a place where students from all streams meet, interact and confabulate over steaming cups of tea/coffee. Cold drinks, fruit juice, spicy chaat, crispy spring-rolls, delicious idli, vada, dosa, mouth-watering pastries, cakes, burgers, patties, samosas and bread pakoras are among the



various food items on offer. A water harvesting system has been installed in the canteen area. The canteen has been renovated and extended with the construction of an additional food outlet: Happiness Corner!!! A Nescafé kiosk is also posited in the precincts of the cafeteria.

Laboratories - Science/Elementary Education/Psychology

The Botany, Chemistry, Elementary Education, Microbiology, Physics, Psychology and Zoology laboratories are not only spacious and well-ventilated but also very well-equipped with various resources. Working in any of these laboratories is a pleasurable experience. There are separate research laboratories for Botany and Physics Departments where research is being conducted by the faculty members.

Learning Resource Centre

WEBOPAC and facility of UGC INFLIBNET and access to DU Library Catalogue continued during the year. Gargi College Library website http://www.gargicolglibrary.webs.com and online use of e-resources increased during the year for easy understanding and online access to Library resources and facilities. 617 books were added till March, 2018 making total of 74027 accessioned books in all. At present the library has an asset of 217 CDs and subscribes to 51 periodicals and 10 newspapers. Electronic



Resource Management package for e-resources: User control provided by NLIST. The library subscribes to a large number of Electronics Resources through UGC-Infosnet which includes e-resources (6,000+ e Journals and 31, 35,000+ e-books) and University of Delhi connectivity which includes Delhi University Library System. It includes the Reference Sources, Bibliographic Sources, Statistical Sources, and Full Text Sources. A brief description of these under given resources including the Subject Coverage, Search Features, Database Services, Document Category, etc. are available through more information for the help of users. Medical Room

The Medical facility is available to students during college hours. There is a medical room with a trained nurse for providing basic first aid to the students. Besides, students can also get their health check-up done. Regular medical and dental check-ups are conducted in the college by qualified medical professionals.



Open Air Theatre

A new open air stage has been recently constructed behind the office block with sufficient seating provision for the audience in the form of adjoining steps and a lush green lawn at its centre. This would serve as an open-air platform for students for various events and especially for Street Plays and other such open air events.

Seminar Hall

Adjoining the auditorium is a splendiferous seminar hall with a seating capacity of 125. It is instrumented with latest audio-visual equipment and is utilised for hosting various academic events.

Students' Common Room: 'Retreat'

Located near the cafeteria, the students' common room, 'Retreat' is a place where students can unwind, chitchat with friends and interact with seniors. It helps them learn about the college life and get familiar with their campus, which is their second home for three years. Students' very own space in college. Retreat always has its doors open for all students.



Students' Union Room

The Students' Council of Gargi College is a step towards instilling the values of democracy among students. The General Body elects a new council each year which is of the students, for the students, by the students. The Students' Union Room is the 'Head Quarters' from where the decisions made by the collective students' body are executed - from weekly cultural events to departmental festivals and the gala college festival: Reverie. The Students' Union Room is not just a space for a selected few; rather it is an open platform for all students to express their views and ideas.



Research Projects for Students

The Gargi Pathfinder Award

The Gargi Pathfinder Award in the streams: Science, Commerce and Humanities has been instituted, to encourage research and innovation among our students. Contestants have to submit an original project guided and certified by a faculty supervisor and supplemented with an audio - visual presentation to a panel of external judges, followed by a viva-voce. This Award is to promote originality and encourage the innovative spirit amongst undergraduate students. The students of the three streams put forward their ideas and after stringent selection are encouraged to research on their topics. This is cash cum certificate award, one each in Humanities, Commerce and Sciences. As individuals or in teams, contestants can present original research on significant issue, innovative business proposals or new scientific experiments. Details are continuously updated on the college website.

Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility (BIF)

Gargi College is one of the two colleges and the only Women's college in the University of Delhi to have BIF. It is funded by Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India since 2008, with an annual grant for maintenance, manpower, training and other allied expenses. This facility enables undergraduate students from all science courses to do bioinformatics projects beyond their curriculum. These projects often lead to presentation of research work in national and international conferences which is rewarding and very motivating for the students. Implementation of interdisciplinary as well as multidisciplinary projects is especially encouraged. Under the BIF programme, workshops are conducted for students as well as faculty members to keep them updated about the advances made in this field. Besides undergraduate students, the facility also has post graduate students, trainees and Research Associates who contribute towards research publications. Gargi College BIF was adjudged amongst the top five BIFs of undergraduate colleges, based on research publications.

Awards of Excellence

Gargi College provides innumerable opportunities to students to excel both in academic as well as extracurricular activities. It is our constant endeavour to help students acquire various skills, confidence, and the experience that will be on their side as they embark upon their varied careers after graduating from our college. On Annual Day each year, we acknowledge the achievements of students through prizes and scholarships.

The following are the prestigious awards and scholarships that students compete and aspire for:

The Best All Rounder Awards

The most prestigious awards, the Best All Rounder Awards, are conferred in each of the three streams namely, Science, Humanities and Commerce. These are highly coveted awards for the students that acknowledge and recognise academic excellence, active participation in extra-curricular activities, and significant contribution to college life as a whole. All final year students of the college are eligible to apply for this award through their respective departments. There is screening at various levels to select the most deserving candidate. The final decision is taken by a duly constituted committee for the same.

- The Best All Rounder Award (Science) is presented to a final year student who is adjudged the best all-rounder among the departments of Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Microbiology, Physics, Zoology, B.Sc. Life Science, and B.Sc. Physical Science.
- The Best All Rounder Award (Humanities) is presented to a final year student who is adjudged the best all-rounder among the departments of BA Programme, Business Economics, Economics, Elementary Education, English, Hindi, History, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, and Sanskrit.
- The Best All Rounder Award (Commerce) is presented to a final year student who is adjudged the best all-rounder among all students of B.Com Honours and B.Com Programme.

The Long Strider Award

The Long Strider Award is given to illustrious alumnae of this college who have displayed commendable excellence in their respective fields within ten years following their graduation from Gargi College. The award recognises the meaningful social commitment and potential for invigorating research that the candidate has achieved in this period.

The Gargi Pathfinder Award

The Gargi Pathfinder Award, instituted by the college, incentivises original research carried out by students under the mentorship of faculty members of the college. As individuals or in teams, contestants present original research projects that then go through an intensive screening process with the involvement of external judges. The students carry out research on significant social issues, innovative business proposals, or new scientific experiments. These are supplemented with presentations in other media, such as Power Point, film, or artistic production before a panel of judges. This is followed by viva voce and the declaration of the results. This award is given in each of the three streams namely, Humanities, Commerce and Science. This award is open to all students of the college.

Awards for Academics

Students who secure the highest aggregate in each class are given certificates and prizes for their academic excellence. Apart from that, there are several disciplines where academic awards and scholarships for meritorious students have been instituted by illustrious donors.















