
Admission Schedule for 2021-22

General Information

- Candidates must have filled the online registration form of University of Delhi for getting admission in the College.
- Candidates should have passed the Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class XII) of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi (or an examination recognized as equivalent by the University of Delhi). Where grades are given in school, transfer of grades to marks will be in accordance with the norms of Association of Indian Universities.
- Candidates seeking admission to the courses offered by the college should have passed the qualifying examinations obtaining minimum marks specified by the University of Delhi.
- Gap year would be no bar for the purpose of admission to the undergraduate courses but reason for the same must be given.

For admission to Gargi College, candidates should qualify as per the cut-off percentages declared by the college.

There is no discrimination in admission criteria for Hindi medium students. However, at Gargi College the medium of instruction is English in all courses except in the discipline of Political Science. But students, even after receiving instruction in English medium in the class, may still take the examination in Hindi medium, wherever question papers are prepared in a dual medium by the University.

Note:

- 1. In case vacant seats are left, further Cut-Offs may be announced by the University to fill the vacant seats.
- 2. On approval of the admission by the Principal of the college, fee payment will be activated on the applicant's dashboard in the Admission Portal. This fee can only be paid online through the portal. The applicant is advised to pay the fees without delay within 24 hours of approval of admission by the Principal of the college
- 3. The original mandatory documents uploaded at the time of admission are to be verified online. The documents need to be submitted in original when the candidate first visits the college as per university guidelines. If not verified, the candidate will be informed.
- 4. Due to the exigencies of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the entire admission process will be Online and contactless this year. Students and their parents/guardians are advised not to visit the college in person at any stage of the admission process. Please visit the Delhi University and the Gargi College Website for all your doubts and queries.

Further cut-off lists schedule may be declared depending on the number of vacant seat(s).

BBE and B.El.ED schedule of admissions which involve entrance test is as per DU notification.

- For the calculation of Best Four subjects percentage for Arts/Humanities honours courses, if the applicant includes subjects other than those given in Lists A and B, then a deduction of 2.5% of maximum marks will be levied for each such subject for the purpose of calculating 'Best Four'.
- Out of three academic/elective subjects chosen above, one must be the concerned subject in which the admission is sought, failing which a deduction of 2.5% will be imposed on the calculated 'Best Four' percentage.
- All subjects which have a theory and practical component and if included in the calculation of 'Best Four' or PCM/PCB/PCMB must have at least 70% theory and 30% practical components. In case, the considered subject does not have 70% theory and 30% practical components, then the marks of theory and practical shall be converted to 70% and 30% respectively on pro rata basis. These new marks will then be considered for calculation of 'Best Four' or PCM/PCB.

Example of calculation of Pro-rata marks

If an applicant has scored: Paper X 90 (theory 50, practical 40; max. marks theory 60, practical 40), and Paper Y 91 (theory 52, practical 39; max. marks theory 60, practical 40) which is not in ratio of 70:30, then the marks can be converted on pro-rata basis

Pro-rata marks in Paper X = 88.33; $[(50/60) \times 70 + (40/40) \times 30] = 58.33 + 30 = 88.33$

Pro-rata marks in Paper Y = 89.92; $[(52/60) \times 70 + (39/40) \times 30] = 60.67 + 29.25 = 89.92$

Departments

Botany

The Department of Botany at Gargi College was established in 1967 and is dedicated to teaching and research in all fields of plant Biology. The Department of Botany at Gargi comprises of faculty with diverse specialisations, well-equipped technical staff and enthusiastic students. The Department is well-equipped with laboratories for carrying out practical classes and research work, a Museum, which hosts plant specimens, and a Botanical Garden. The course structure also allows students to choose from a wide array of specialised areas like Environmental Biotechnology, Biofertilizers, Intellectual Property Rights, Industrial Microbiology, Medicinal Botany, etc. The well-designed course facilitates the students' pursuit of post graduate studies in Botany,



Biosciences, Biomedical Sciences, Molecular Biology, Genetics, Biotechnology, Environmental Sciences, Bioinformatics, etc. Field trips and excursions are organised to enable students to have a first-hand



experience of the flora in their natural habitat. Industrial visits are also organised for the students as a part of their curricular activities. The Department also organises various workshops and student enrichment courses. Over the years, the Department has maintained high academic standards and also produced a number of dedicated teachers, scientists and many others who excelled in various fields. The Department encourages students to work on minor research projects along with their undergraduate course.

The Botany Department has an active Botanical Society – *Taru* – which organises several cultural and academic events. The challenging conditions during the pandemic motivated the Department to organise various online webinars and other academic enrichment courses, thus benefitting the students with a first-hand experience of interaction with internationally renowned researchers. The Society also publishes an e-magazine "ANTHESIS" where students can explore their scientific writing skills.

Business Economics

Gargi College is one of the premier colleges in the University of Delhi which offers the BA (H) Business Economics course. The course was started in Gargi College in the year 2007. Students of this department have demonstrated success not only in their career paths and academically, but also in various extracurricular



activities be it Creative Writing, Art, Dance, Music, Sports or Drama. Our students have bagged various awards at the College, University and National levels. Our students have also been winning the Best BBE College Trophy for many years consecutively. The course allows students to develop skills such as entrepreneurship, research, leadership, ethics, etc. It is for this reason that our students after graduation have either enrolled in Masters' Programmes at reputed universities and business schools across the globe or have been placed in reputed companies.

The B.A. (Honours) Business Economics course is a perfect blend of practical, analytical and theoretical tools so as to imbibe proficient capabilities in students to analyse data and information for sound policy formulation and decision making. This course is an inter-disciplinary course with a curriculum designed to equip the students with knowledge of diverse fields including Economics, Commerce, Mathematics and Research. The academic alignment of the course has been designed to create a strong orientation towards seamless applicability of Economics and related tools in the various functions of a business enterprise. The three-year programme makes it mandatory for students to gain practical exposure by interning in different sectors. Our Alumni have interned and been placed in different reputed organisations like PWC, KPMG, Deloitte, EY, Dell, NITI Aayog, NDTV, OLX and NTPC, to name a few. Students of Business Economics can pursue a Masters in Commerce, Economics, Business Economics, Business Administration, Finance, International Business, etc. They can also pursue professional courses like CA, CFA, CS, CMA, FRM, Actuarial Science, etc.

Admission to the course is done through a Joint Entrance Test (JET) for the three courses B.A. (Honours) Business Economics, Bachelor in Management Studies and Bachelor in Business Administration (Finance and Investment Analysis) conducted by the University of Delhi. The final admission to the course is subject to the fulfillment of eligibility conditions laid down by the University from time to time.

The academic session begins with a Departmental orientation to welcome the freshers and introduce them to the Departmental academic curriculum and other activities. Competitions are conducted for the students to give them a platform to display their skills. Our flagship *Comicono* competition is organised with the aim of creating an understanding of different economic/business trends. Alumni interactive sessions are conducted on a regular basis to facilitate the interaction of present batches with ex-students. The Department also conducts talks and seminars on various current topics on a regular basis. Our Department has also been consistently winning the Best College Trophy in an Annual Sports Meet – *Runbhoomi* and at Roisters. *Advitya* – our Annual Departmental Fest is organised by the Business Economics Association every year with unparalleled zeal, enthusiasm and dedication. The Department also organises various workshops, career counselling sessions and guest lectures with eminent speakers on latest topics. A unique feature of this course is that students are taken for industrial trips so as to enhance their understanding of manufacturing processes and their functioning.






Chemistry

Chemistry is a central science as it interconnects many disciplines and finds applications in areas like Pharmacology, Environmental Science, Astronomy, Molecular and Cellular Biology, Geology, Forensic Science and Polymer Science, to name a few. The knowledge of Chemistry equips a science student better and opens up numerous career prospects from fields as diverse as medicinal chemistry & drug designing, research and development wing of various private, government firms and PSUs, analytical laboratories, teaching sectors (schools and colleges) and many more.

The Department of Chemistry, established in 1967, is one of the oldest departments of the college and offers B.Sc. (H) Chemistry as a 6-semester course under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). Besides, the Honours programme, the Department is also associated with the teaching of interdisciplinary courses like B.Sc. (Programme) Physical Sciences& Life Sciences. Chemistry is also



offered as an elective subject for students of other science courses. The Department has highly qualified faculty members and an impressive list of notable alumni who have made their mark in various fields.

The course structure and syllabus (as per the University of Delhi guidelines) includes core courses in Inorganic, Organic and Physical Chemistry; Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses; Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs); Generic Elective (GE) Papers; and Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) distributed over a period of 3 years (6 semesters). The syllabus along with the practical component is designed to provide an in-depth knowledge of the fundamentals of Chemistry to students, and also aims to increase their logical and skill-based aptitude. The liberty to choose papers across various other disciplines in the GE courses has helped students read topics of their interest which may be of use in their future career decisions.

All the students of the Department of Chemistry are a part of the Chemical Society called *Rasgandhayan*. Under the convenorship of teacher mentors, this society (by the students, of the students and for the students) works all-round the year to organise some interesting activities apart from regular teaching. Student representatives are elected to the various posts. The society releases an annual magazine *Amalgam*, which is a students' production and has literary/creative and scientific articles contributed by them.

This society also endeavours to supplement classroom teaching with invited lectures by eminent speakers from institutes in and outside of Delhi, academic inter-college competitions like paper and poster presentations, extra-curricular competitions like debating, extempore, talent hunt, quiz, creative writing,





etc. and fun/sports activities. Educational visits/trips are usually organised by the Department every year. This year, the society had the privilege of listening to two interesting lectures - the Inaugural Lecture, by Shanti Swaroop Bhatnagar Awardee Prof. Uday Maitra from IISc, Bangalore and the annual Dr. C. K. Khurana Memorial Lecture by Dr. Vivek K. Sharma from UMass Medical School, USA. A few



key events of this academic year included the Inter-College Comic-Strip Making Competition and Paper Presentation Competition *Chemaroma*, the Diwali Function *Deepak-e-Jashan*, Photography Competition, and Intra-College Declamation competition. The year-long activities culminate with the degree distribution ceremony which is a part of the Valedictory Function.

Several seminars, add-on courses, conferences and workshops are organised throughout the year, to contribute to the holistic development of the students. Teacher mentors also guide students to undertake various projects and research work thus giving them a exposure into the world of scientific research at a very early age.

The Department recognises the efforts of meritorious and outstanding students across all three years in the form of various academic awards and prizes, thus motivating them for good work in future as well.

Commerce

Commerce is an integral part of our day-to-day life. Every economic activity is interlinked with commerce. To carry forward trade and industry successfully and to meet the growing needs of the society, requires developing skills, attitude, and knowledge which are possible only through revitalised commerce education.



The Department of Commerce was established in 1973 and currently encompasses a strength of nearly 1000 students. The Department has a brilliant pool of dedicated and experienced faculty members who have specialised in various fields of commerce that contribute to providing quality education for the holistic development of students. The faculty is additionally engaged in writing, publishing, and presenting analysis papers in various National and International Journals.

At present, the courses being offered are B.Com (Prog.) and B.Com (Hons.). Besides this, the Department also runs Add-n Certificate Courses (of 100 hours duration) in Advertising & Marketing Communication and Banking & Financial Services.

The primary focus of the commerce course is to create strong practical and theoretical foundations across Corporate Accounting, Management Accounting, Business, and Corporate Law, E-Marketing, Taxation, Entrepreneurship, Financial Management, Human Resource control, etc. which will further enable the students to become competent leaders, managers, and professionals in a dynamic business world.



The Department of Commerce strives to provide its students the necessary exposure in the areas of Finance, Entrepreneurship, and Leadership through the various departmental societies that are managed and run by hard-working students under the guidance of dedicated faculty members. The societies that work under the Department of Commerce are: The Commerce Association and the Bi-Annual *Comascent* Magazine.

The Annual Inter-College fest CASCADE is organised by The Commerce Association every year with a great deal of zest and commitment. Various workshops, career counselling sessions, special lectures by renowned speakers, competitions about the world of commerce, and many more activities are organised by the Department to provide students practical exposure and also enrich students' educational experiences. The quality academic education when coupled with co-curricular activities instils confidence among the students which helps them undertake the challenges of their professional journeys, with greater self-confidence.

The Commerce students at Gargi College have been placed in reputed institutes like KPMG, Ernst & Young, Accenture, Deloitte and Tres Vista, to name a few, through campus placements. We are also very proud of the fact that some of our alumni have returned to Gargi as faculty members in our Department.

Elementary Education

B.EI.Ed.! That sounds familiar. What exactly is it?

The full form of B.El.Ed. is Bachelors of Elementary Education. It is an exciting four-year integrated professional degree programme for training teachers at the elementary school level.

Does it mean that we will be eligible for jobs after completing it?

Yes! It means that after four years of rigorous training you will be a professionally qualified teacher. Whether you want to teach right away or pursue higher education will, of course, depend on what you wish to do further.

Is it a recognised programme?

Certainly. It is recognised by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE). It was initiated by the Maulana Azad Centre for Elementary and Social Education (MACESE), Delhi University in the year 1994-1995. We have completed 20 years at Gargi College.

But is it available in English only?

Not at all! It is a bilingual programme. Instruction is in both English medium and Hindi medium.

What exactly does this programme encompass?

That's an important question. The idea behind this programme is to integrate the study of subject knowledge, human development, teaching skills and communication skills. Hence, B.El.Ed. offers both compulsory as well as optional theory courses. It has a strong focus on practicum courses. It also includes a comprehensive school internship programme in its fourth year. A well-equipped departmental library cum resource centre is available for the students.

That went a little over my head. Could you explain the components of this programme to me, one by one?

The two essential components of this programme are the theory and practicum courses. There are 19 theory courses which the student is expected to cover during the four-year programme of study. These include:

Foundation Courses: These courses are designed to enable students to make an indepth study of child development concepts and perspectives in education, the context in which the education of the child is situated, processes and techniques of social organisation; various issues related to



elementary education and to develop skills of communicating and relating to students.

Core Courses: Core courses offer the prospective teacher the opportunity to reconstruct concepts learnt in school and to integrate them within a multi-disciplinary perspective.

Pedagogy Courses: Courses in pedagogy are designed to help develop core teaching skills specific to the teaching of young children. This includes developing perspectives in pedagogy and techniques related to specific knowledge areas.

Liberal Courses: Liberal optional courses provide students with the opportunity to study a specific discipline with academic rigour. They are designed to enrich the knowledge base to allow further study in the discipline and in the pedagogies in which students specialise. The Liberal Courses offered by Gargi



College are: English, Hindi, Political Science, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology (subject to a minimum number of seven students opting for the course.)

Practicum Courses: The Practicum Courses are another very important component of this programme. These courses are designed to give the students a wide range of work

experiences with children in and outside elementary schools and opportunities for self-reflection and development. The practicum input includes: Performing and Fine Arts, Craft and Participatory Work, School-Contact Programmes, Observing Children, Self-Development Workshops, Physical Education, School Internship, Projects, Tutorials and Colloquia.

What about the eligibility criteria for this programme?

There is Common Entrance Examination conducted by the Department of Education, Delhi University, comprising a written test for the B.El.Ed programme (see Bulletin of C.I.E). For details, visit: Website of CIE: http://cie.du.ac.in/

Economics

The Department of Economics was founded in 1967. It envisioned excellence in academic performance through quality education by offering a programme course in Economics under the guidance of faculty members like Ms. V Bala Subramaniam, Ms. Manjeet Kaur, Ms. Kiran Chopra, Ms. Indu Jairath, Ms. Swaran Bhalla, Ms. Asha Sachdev and Ms. Shobha Mathur. Under the erstwhile FYUP scheme, the Department got an overwhelming response admitting 250 students as it's a much sought-after course and has attained a resounding success of 100 per cent pass percentage. In the year 2017-18, the Department introduced a full-fledged Honours course in Economics with more than 60 students. At present, the Department has eight dynamic and dedicated faculty members with diverse specialisations and vast experience in the fields of teaching and research.

The Department has made revolutionary changes by hosting various activities including the Annual Economics Festival, seminars, and intra as well inter college quiz competitions through *Ecomantra*, the Economics Association launched in the year 2011. It strives to maintain its web presence through its annual e-newsletter, *The Short Run*, which discusses the latest issues in the field of Economics. Despite the challenging times induced by the pandemic, it has earned a name in University circles by successfully organising a host of events throughout the academic session. This year the Department hosted several reputed speakers, namely, Prof. C.S.C. Sekhar, Professor, Institute of Economic Growth, Delhi; Prof. Lekha S. Chakraborty Professor, National Institute of Public Finance and Policy, New Delhi and, Prof. Jayan Jose

Thomas, Professor, Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi. The academic year 2020-21 started with a webinar on the topic, 'The Farm Bills 2020: A Thorough Analysis' as a part of the 2nd episode of *The Economics Parley*. The 9th Annual Economics Festival, *Artha Nirbhar* 2021, themed on "Self-Reliance: A Utopian Idea?", was successfully organised by the departmental association.

The Department also publishes an annual magazine *EcoBuzz* which provides an opportunity to the students to put on one's thinking cap and voice opinions on a range of economic, social and political issues.

The Department revels in the glorious achievements of its alumni, who have gone on to join IIM Ahmedabad, Delhi School of Economics, Indian Statistical Institute, prestigious foreign universities, the CII, the big four consultancy, etc.

The programme course includes discipline papers, namely, Principles of Microeconomics I and II, Principles of Macroeconomics I and II and Economic Development and Policy in India I and II which are spread across six semesters. The Department also offers General Elective papers like Introductory Microeconomics, Introductory Macroeconomics, Indian Economy I and II, Money and Banking, etc. to students of other disciplines. English

The Department of English has a long and illustrious innings at Gargi ever since the college was founded in 1967. English (Honours), that was introduced in 1978. is an impactful undergraduate course that takes students through the best in world literatures. The syllabus is rigorous in its coverage of important literary texts and landmarks, and thus stands students in good stead in their future professional endeavours. Papers range from Indian and Western classical traditions to lively and immediate contemporary authors; students will read widely in different genres including poetry, plays, novels, besides acquiring critical thinking skills that will enable and empower them academically and personally. Some of the exciting core courses that students will study across the 6 semesters are: Indian Classical Literature, European



In addition to these core courses, you can also choose 4 Discipline Specific Electives from among Literature of the Indian Diaspora, Literary Theory, Literature and Cinema, Partition Literature, etc.

You will also have the opportunity to choose four Generic Elective Papers from among those offered by other Departments of the college and 2 Skill Enhancement Courses offered by your own Department.







Some of these SECs as they are called, include Film Studies, English Language Teaching, Soft Skills, Translation Studies, Creative Writing, etc.

Finally, you will also study 2 Ability Enhancement Courses (one each in English Language and Environmental Studies).

Students after graduation go on to further studies (MA/M.Phil/PhD) in literature, and to careers in teaching (at the school, college and university levels), in media and mass communication (journalism, film, advertising), publishing (writing, editing, translating), public relations management and also to lateral fields like social work, law, management via masters' study in these fields. The sound thinking and writing skills students gain over three years is also a good foundation for competitive examinations including those for management studies and civil services.

The English Department faculty is resourceful and well-networked, and includes widely-published scholars and writers. The Department teaches English to students of all courses, including those majoring in the Sciences, Commerce, Arts and Education streams; besides tutoring MA English students. Department resources include the 3,000+ volume Oswal-Sena Library, which offers students access to a world of books beyond the curriculum.

The Department has an exciting co-curricular calendar of varied activities, including an annual national seminar and literary festival, frequent invited lectures and interactions with eminent academicians, creative writers, besides workshops and co-curricular skill-building sessions on different themes like creative writing, editing, translation, theatre and cinema. The Department's co-curricular activities are directed through several clubs, any or all of which students are encouraged to join depending on their interests and goals. Some of these include *The Book Club*, *The Creative Writing Club*, *The Quiz Club*, *The Performance Club* and *The Film Club*; all of which are managed by students and mentored by the teachers of the Department. Our Department magazine, *Bitacora*, provides an independent forum for both creative expression and training in skills such as copy and content editing. A portfolio of activities designed to encourage student creativity and understanding of their discipline, like quizzes and literary competitions keep the six semesters that students spend with us stimulating.

German

German is offered as a Discipline subject in the B.A Programme Course, which means a student, who opts for German, will study it for the next three years. No prior knowledge of German is required. Students will get to learn from the basics. They are initiated into the German language in the first year, but by the time

they reach third year they are exposed to famous German short stories and folk tales. We also have a German Section in our annual college magazine, in which the students write poems, articles, essays, etc.

It is an asset to know a foreign language in today's world of globalization. If one wants to be a real player in the 21st century, learning German will give one the edge one needs. 100 million people worldwide communicate in German! German is spoken not only in Germany, but also in Austria, Hungary and Switzerland as the official language. After learning German for three years at the undergraduate level, a student can do post-graduation in the German language. One can go to Germany, Austria, Hungary or Switzerland for higher studies. There are a lot of scholarships too, that these countries offer. And there are no dearth of jobs in the job market with the knowledge of the German language. With the knowledge of German, one improves one's employment opportunities. Germany has the largest economy in the European Union and the third largest in the world. Knowledge of German, for sure, puts one in high demand. If one is looking for employment in the United States, knowing German can give you great advantages. German companies account for 700,000 jobs in the United States and US Companies have created approximately the same number of jobs in Germany. Apart from this, learning German opens a lot of job avenues in the Tourism Industry, Hospitality Industry, German (Lufthansa), Austrian, Swiss and Hungarian Airlines and also in German, Swiss, Austrian and Hungarian Embassies, teaching jobs in schools, colleges and MBA Institutes like Amity and Symbiosis Universities, etc. There are also jobs for those with German Language Skills as Interpreters and Translators, in German Banks (like Deutsche Bank). There are a host of job opportunities in a lot of Indian and German Multinational Corporates such as Siemens, BMW, Audi, Volkswagen etc. All in all, it is a skill based course. It adds to one's CV and gives one an edge over others in the job market.

Hindi

The Department of Hindi was founded in the year of 1967 when Gargi College came into existence and is well known for its academic activities. From a contemporary perspective, Hindi (Honours) is an important option for undergraduate studies in our college. If you are interested in Honours in Hindi Literature then this graduation course can open up many avenues and opportunities in future. On the lines of the concept of the Global Village, the multifaceted dimensions of the Hindi language are



being brought to the world stage. Hindi Literature develops creativity and literary sensibility in the minds of students. The Syllabus of Hindi (Honours) not only introduces students to the great poets, writers, novelists,

critics, etc., from the ancient times to the present, but also brings out your latent talents. From the perspective of employment, if you want to enhance your creativity in the fields of Journalism, Research, Anchoring, Script-Writing, Translating, Editing, Lyricist, etc. then this course is your best option. Faculty members of the Hindi Department are experienced and qualified and play an important role in tapping the potential of the students and bringing out the best in them.



Apart from excellence in teaching, the Department has an active and multifaceted literary society, *Hindi Sahitya Parishad*. The Hindi Department provides ample opportunities to its students to attain an all-round development. Engaging in Debating, Creative Writing and Dramatics activities impart various skills, including public speaking and higher order critical thinking. These activities also allow students to explore and find their inner selves. To provide a platform for the students to hone their literary talents and skills, the Department conducts regular debate competitions, poetry-writing, story-writing, essay-competitions, etc. throughout each semester. We believe in nourishing the thoughts and ideas of the students by helping them find a good balance between tradition and modernity, the past and the present, to work towards a holistic future. The Hindi Department has started a magazine for providing a platform to the students to express their thoughts and views on various topics concerning life, society and the nation. Some of the activities you can look forward to are Lectures by Eminent Speakers and Seminars and Workshops, in addition to the activities organised by the departmental association.

History

The History Department was set up as one of the core departments of Gargi College during its establishment in 1967. Initially, History was offered at the BA Pass level (now called the BA Programme). History teaching at the Honours level commenced from 1972. Over time, History has evolved into a highly specialised discipline, and our faculty members have expertise in particular areas of Indian and World History.



B.A. Honours in History focuses on the study of twenty discipline-specific credit courses - fourteen Core



Credit (CC) Courses, four Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) papers, and two Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) spread over six semesters. The History Honours syllabi pertaining to the History of India, covers a long span of time, and includes specifically tailored papers on India's Ancient, Medieval, Modern and Contemporary pasts. The World History papers, including Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of the Ancient World, Rise of the Modern West, and History of Modern Europe among


others, offer an insight into significant eras of global history. Honours students in the first year have compulsory Ability Enhancement Credit Courses (AECC) on Languages and Environmental Science. In addition, the students need to opt for Generic Elective (GE) papers offered by other Departments from the first to fourth semesters. Similarly, GE papers are



offered by our Department to students from other courses.

History discipline and discipline specific Core and Elective papers are also taught to students of the BA Programme. The GE and SEC courses offered by the Department are in high demand by the students of BA Programme. SEC courses, at both the Honours and B.A. Programme level, have a component of field trip/excursion related to the paper content.

The History Association was initiated by the Department in the year 2006. It aims to broaden the horizons of the discipline of history and familiarise students with the emerging trends in the field. Routinely, through the academic session, the Association organises a series of lectures, book discussions, and film screenings on pertinent subjects. Eminent historians from various national and international universities, archaeologists from apex organisations such as The Archaeological Survey of India, independent scholars and heritage experts are invited to share their expertise. Besides these co-curricular events, the Association organises an annual Inter-College History Festival titled *Antaraal* revolving around a specific theme that is topical and academically stimulating. *Antaraal* comprises an academic session, with scholars of eminence



speaking on the theme for the year; and a cultural aspect where students engage in competitive events woven around the theme, and showcase their knowledge and talent. Over the years, varied themes like the History of Delhi, Environment, Food and Cuisine, Religion and Religiosity, Art History and New Histories, etc. have been taken up in the organisation of *Antaraal*.

After three years of studying History at the undergraduate level, students can look forward to a more comprehensive understanding and knowledge of

our historical past. This equips them to step into either the academic or professional world with knowledge based on skills of critical reasoning, assessment, and cogent expression.

Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics at Gargi College offers a three-year degree programme in B.Sc. (Honours) Mathematics. The course was introduced in the year 2016. Before that the department was actively involved in teaching mathematics and computer sciences to various courses such as B.A. (Prog), B.Sc. (H) Chemistry, B.Sc. (H) Physics, B.Sc. (H) Microbiology, B.Sc. (Prog), B.El.Ed. and








BBE. The Department comprises of fifteen faculty members with the combination of experienced seniors and dynamic young members. Faculty members specialise in different areas of pure, applied, financial mathematics, and Computer Science. Faculty members are involved in various research activities and their research papers get published in various Journals at the National and International levels. The curriculum for B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics has been prepared by the University of Delhi keeping in mind the needs and aspirations of students of mathematics as well as the evolving nature of mathematics as a subject. The course has a balance between pure and applied mathematics. There is an exceptionally broad range of topics covering: Linear Algebra, Metric Spaces, Statistics, Linear Programming, Numerical Analysis, Mathematical Finance, Coding Theory, Mechanics and Biomathematics in the course. The main aspect of mathematics teaching is the application of it in the real world. To achieve this goal, many papers in the course are



based on computer programming and simulation techniques involving real-life problems. For this purpose, the college has a well-equipped computer lab having latest facilities along with several mathematical software like Wolfram Mathematica, R, Scilab, Latex, etc. The Department emphasises on training the students in such a way that they can opt for teaching, research or join industry after graduation. The Department also supports the students as they seek to enhance their analytical skills by



studying mathematics which helps them in cracking various competitive examinations at national and international levels. Students are made aware of various avenues which would be open after studying mathematics such as Education, Research, Management, Civil Services, Industry, Finance and many more.

Structure of B.Sc. (Honours) Mathematics: A student is required to complete 148 credits for completion of the course. For more details follow the link.

Microbiology

The Microbiology Department of Gargi College was established in 1989 and has completed 31 glorious years. The Department is well known for its high academic standing in the University of Delhi.

Students of the Department excel academically each year, acquiring University positions and securing admissions in various prestigious Universities and Institutes for their post-graduation both in India and abroad. Our alumni are well established globally, making the Department and college proud!

The recent outbreak caused by the 2019 novel coronavirus (officially named SARS-CoV-2), has highlighted the importance of Microbiologists in the world. They are the ones who deal with the microbes i.e., the organisms too small to be visible to the naked eye yet important for human life. These include bacteria, viruses, algae, fungi, protozoa, etc.

The Department of Microbiology of Gargi College offers B.Sc. (Honours) in Microbiology, which is one of the most prestigious and sought after 3 years degree courses. The course includes the study of microorganisms; their diversity, structure, nutrition, habitat, mode of reproduction, physiology, taxonomy, etc. The applied aspects of Microbiology are included in the form of study of the medical, food



and dairy, environmental and industrial microbiology fields. Besides these, the course also ventures into a large number of fields like molecular biology, biochemistry, microbial genetics, recombinant DNA technology, immunology, biotechnology, metagenomics, bioinformatics, etc.

Under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) programme, B.Sc. (Honours) in Microbiology is offered in the form of a broad range of core courses, Discipline specific elective (DSE) courses and skill enhancement (SE) courses distributed over six semesters.

This course not only imparts an in-depth knowledge of the subject, but also enables students to gauge the huge possibilities and practical applications of microbes in Food, Dairy, Beverage, Pharmaceutical and Cosmetic industries, Climate change, Renewable energy resources, Clinical research, Agriculture, Nanotechnology and many more.

For these opportunities, a student may have to pursue M.Sc and PhD in the respective area. These courses



can be pursued at various national and international universities and research institutes. The students can also diversify into other fields like marketing, law, journalism, patenting, publishing, etc.

Apart from the Honours course in Microbiology, the Department also offers Generic Elective (GE) courses to students of other science departments.

Students of the Department are given the opportunity to take up in-house short-term research projects under the guidance of faculty members. Students are also encouraged to take up internships in other research institutions to further enhance their practical and analytical skills.

In order to keep students abreast with the latest developments in this scientific field, the students' union of the Department *Germs* periodically organises lectures by eminent scientists, seminars, symposia, webinars, etc. This is accompanied by other fun-filled extracurricular activities which draw the enthusiastic participation of students from various departments of the college as well as from other colleges. Our students also actively participate in activities conducted by other colleges.

#hilosophy

Philosophy is the study of general and fundamental problems and inquires - Where does the world come from? How was the earth formed? Does God exist? Did God create the world or has the world been in existence eternally? How is it that man thinks, what is the relation between brain and thought? What is the relation between will and ability? It puts into perspective life issues in the context of Gender, Environment, Medical Ethics, matters of law, Media, Arts, Films, etc. In its broader aspects Philosophy examines the various kinds of existence and their interrelationships, in Metaphysics; the nature and validity of knowledge, in Epistemology and logic; and the nature of value, in Ethics and Aesthetics.

So, the objective of this subject is to make you read, think, research and critically analyse the world around you. It helps you obtain a self-consistent understanding of things observed. Philosophy helps students

prepare for careers in education, research, mass communication, journalism, social work, law, film appreciation, civil services, management studies and gender studies.

Apart from the Honours course in Philosophy, we offer interdisciplinary papers (GE) as well as skill enhancement courses (SECs) for students of other Honours courses and B.A. Programme. Some of these are: Ethics in the Public Domain, Logic, Feminism, Bio-Ethics, Inductive Logic, Technology and Ethics, Ethical Decision Making, Yoga Philosophy, Critical Thinking, Art and Film Appreciation, and Philosophical Thought of Ambedkar.

Departmental Activities:

Students' Union: This year, the Students' Union launched two new initiatives through the department's social media handles: One is 'Humans of Philosophy' through this initiative the students of our department are encouraged to share their stories of any sort of self-progress which is released on the department pages along with their photographs. The second one is: AIM (All Ideas Matter) –an initiative that is meant for student's suggestions, feedback and any other pressing concern. There are series of talks and lectures focused upon the curriculum and inter-disciplinarian of Philosophy. Some movies are screened too to add up to perspective.

#hysics

The Physics Department was founded in Gargi 1967 and offers various papers to B. Sc. Physics (Hon) and B. Sc. Physical Sciences students. The Department also offers Generic Elective papers to students of other

departments. In the last academic year, Physics Department had taught the following Generic Elective papers: Electricity & Magnetism (semester I), Mechanics (semester II), Waves & Optics (semester III) and Thermal and Statistical Physics (semester IV).

Over and above the regular academic curriculum, the students pursue research and



do projects under the guidance of the faculty of the Department. Two of the faculty members are also supervising Ph. D. scholars. The Department has a Delhi University recognised research lab in which students diligently pursue research. The Physics Department also organises a summer school every year during the vacations to introduce the students to various fields of Physics



The Physics Department Society, *Quasar*, is always abuzz with activity throughout the year. The Department, under the aegis of this society, organises lectures by eminent scientists from various institutes. To give an opportunity to the students for showcasing their talents, various events and competitions are held throughout the academic year. The students are also encouraged to participate in intra/inter college events. They are regularly taken to well- known institutes to expose them to all the research done in these institutes and to the latest state-of-the-art technology available there. The students as well as the faculty members of the Department attend/organise seminars and conferences to keep abreast with current research and latest developments in Physics and other fields. This year the first-ever "virtual" inaugural lecture on "Solar Influences on the Earth in the 21st century" was organised on Nov 8, 2020 .The Inaugural lecture was given by eminent scientist Prof. Rajmal Jain, former Professor at the Physical Research Lab (space division), Government of India, Ahmedabad, Gujrat. Different shows like Annual Talent Show: The Talent Story, Photographs - On the basis of theme and creativity Story, Science Quiz Contest on science day were part of this year's society programmes.

After completing graduation in Physics, the career options available to these students are numerous. To name a few: Scientist, teaching Physics, Management, Administration, a career in Law, etc. They are also welcomed into the research and development wing of diverse industries like Material Sciences, Environment and Energy sector, Information and Technology, Defence Research and the Communication industry.



Political Science

Political Science as an academic discipline is well known and much sought after. In recent times, its popularity has grown exponentially. It has become one of the most popular courses being opted for by admission seekers at Gargi College. Political Science analyses and explores the study of state, government, society, social movements along with their interface and political behaviour. At the Department of Political Science, Gargi College, the faculty uses innovative pedagogy to deconstruct conformist ideas and attempts to understand politics in an intersectional dimension. Contemporary global issues like climate change, pandemics and many others have made Political Science a multidisciplinary endeavour wherein we attempt to question and seek answers beyond the Eurocentric notions of development, globalisation, and administration; in a postcolonial society that is racing towards becoming a post truth society.

The Department of Political Science has an exceptional legacy as far as achievements of our faculty members and students are concerned. Academic excellence is our mantra that allows the Department to engage with conceptualisation of governance theory and politics. The Department prides itself on having experienced and academically renowned faculty, whose scholarship and teaching- learning extends across various subfields of Political Science. The courses offered by the department are- BA Honours, BA Programme and MA in Political Science.

The Department of Political Science at Gargi College offers papers like Political Theory, Indian Politics, India's Foreign Policy in a Globalising World, Indian Political Thought, International Relations, Western Political Thought, Feminism, Development Process and Contemporary Social Movements in India and Public Policy. Considering the contemporary multidisciplinary debates in the world, the Department offers Generic Elective papers like - Politics of Globalisation, Nationalism in India, Understanding Ambedkar, United Nations, Public Opinion and Survey Research, etc. that help students in mapping out the contemporary discourses concerning human development and deepening of democracy in India.

The Department is immensely proactive in organising workshops, talks, seminars and lectures on themes of contemporary global relevance. Thought leaders, Ambassadors, Researchers, Activists, Lawyers and acclaimed Public Intellectuals from across the globe are invited throughout the year to share insights on political and social issues. The Department endeavours to instil confidence and develop a nuanced understanding of politics and society among its students; hence, it organises several academic and co-curricular activities in which the students play a pivotal role. Elections are held every year by the Department to constitute the student body - *Political Science Association*, which manages the multifarious departmental activities.

The Department of Political Science holds its flagship event, its Annual Festival, POL POURI consisting of day long activities like seminars, debates, and various other competitions that encourage participants from all the colleges across Delhi/NCR. Further, the magazine of the Department - DEMOS is published annually to provide a platform to students to articulate their perspectives and comment on contemporary political issues. The Department also organises trips for the students every year during the semester breaks.

It's a matter of great pride for the Department that many of our students are Delhi University toppers. The recipient of the prestigious Dr. Shankar Dayal Sharma Gold Medal for all rounder in entire Delhi University is our very own student, Deepanshi Gupta. She was the recipient of Dr. Meera Ramachandran All Rounder Award for Humanities in 2020. Our students have gone on to do internships at various government ministries and International organisations like UNDP and UNICEF; pursued Masters courses in international universities with scholarships and have gone on to become journalists, lawyers, political analysts and bureaucrats. The Department endeavours to bring about wholesome all-round development of its students during their three years of engagement with the Department.

\$\mu_sychology

The Department of Psychology at Gargi College was established in the year 1972 when the Psychology course was offered to the students of BA (Programme). Applied Psychology (Honours) as a course was started in 1987. The Department of Psychology, Gargi College started the first ever Honours degree course in University of Delhi in Applied Psychology and till date has spearheaded all the revisions of the syllabus to keep the course in sync with changing times.

The course provides fundamental knowledge of basic Psychology and applications of it in various life settings. The present structure aims at imparting basic knowledge in Applied Psychology via the core papers; specialised areas are introduced in the discipline centred courses and the students are exposed to the application possibilities via the skill-based courses. The focus is on foundations of Psychology cognitive, social, counselling, organizational, clinical, media, youth and health Psychology. The students

are trained to carry out academic inquiry into Psychology and its major sub-fields with an emphasis on application. They are taught effective communication skills, counselling abilities and understanding of scientific writing with a focus on its ethical use. Further they are trained in critically thinking about the linking of personal experiences with concepts studied and using curricula for personal-development as well as for emotional and self-regulation skills.



The students are encouraged to evolve as individuals with positive attributes of non-judgement, empathy, kindness, gender and multicultural sensitivity and responsibility towards self and community.

Over the years, the Department has consistently had university toppers from our college and the student feedback about the course and teaching processes is available on the college website.

Izhaar_was conceptualized by the Psychology Department Association during the Annual Department Festival - Psy Fiestain 2015. Students of Psychology were motivated to break the stigma associated with mental health by opening a dialogue with the larger Gargi community to create awareness around mental health issues. In 2016 the formal membership for Izhaar was initiated. The membership process to Izhaar is currently open only to students of the department through a rigorous selection process conducted by the Teacher Mentors of Izhaar. To address the impact of the pandemic on students' mental health, membership to Izhaar may soon be open to the larger student body.

The intensive selection process for membership is carried out at the start of every academic year. Members are also trained for the requisite skill sets.



Over the years *Izhaar* has been pivotal in creating awareness about mental health through various initiatives. Undertaking mental health awareness campaign by reaching out

to the students of different departments through face-to-face interactions was found to be extremely effective in busting the myths associated with mental health. Conducting surveys to understand what were the main mental health issues that were faced by the student community was another strategy adopted by *Izhaar* members. The members have also researched the mental health literacy of the students of Gargi across different departments and created supporting interventions on mental health awareness. The members of *Izhaar* have undertaken awareness campaigns around the Gargi campus on significant mental health awareness days like Autism Awareness Day, Suicide Prevention Week,

Mental health Day, etc. A number of interactive lectures have been organised with mental health experts for capacity building on coping strategies for the student community. Team *Izhaar* also serves as peer-to-peer support members where they share their lived experiences of mental health with others in the confines of a safe space and together, they work out strategies that help them cope and support each other.

The Sanskrit Department of Gargi College, is one of the best Departments of Delhi University. The relevance of studying Sanskrit has increased in recent times and can offer students many avenues of intellectual and professional growth. A knowledge of Sanskrit is useful in many professional areas like the Media (Sanskrit news reading and other programme based on ancient culture), Management (knowledge of Indian system of



management of life), Ayurveda, Yoga, Poetics, Music, Theatre, History, Philosophy of Languages, Linguistics, Computer Linguistics, Animation Industry and Translation, etc. The Department offers an Honours course in Sanskrit.

The Department also organises inter-college and inter-class competitions every year to boost the confidence of students and give them sufficient exposure to develop their overall personality.



Regular Departmental Activities include Workshop on various issues, Educational trips, Add on courses on different aspects of ancient knowledge such as Vaastu Shastra, Jyotish, Ayurveda and Yoga, Sanskrit speaking classes and Seminars, talks and lectures by eminent speakers.

The Sanskrit Department Association also organises Essay writing, Sanskrit paper-reading and Rangoli competitions and Sanskrit *Natyavhivyakti* and Sanskrit *Shlokavrriti* competitions during the Annual College festival, REVERIE.

Zoology

The Department of Zoology started in the year 1967. The salient features of the Department include qualified faculty members, four well-equipped laboratories, Zoological Museum and a research lab. The B.Sc., (Honours) Zoology curriculum will empower the learners in various fields of basic Biology and advanced fields. The core papers include Diversity of Non-chordates and Chordates, Comparative Anatomy of Vertebrates, Cell Biology, Biochemistry, Molecular Biology, Ecology, Physiology, Developmental Biology, Evolutionary Biology and Principles of Genetics. Our Department also offers Animal Biotechnology, Immunology, Neuroscience, Computational Biology, Research Methodology and Medical Diagnostics for the students. The theory supported with practical experiments help the students to gain in depth subject knowledge. The skills acquired here help the students to choose a wide range of subjects in their higher education. The Department engages the students in teaching, research and cocurricular activity for their holistic development. The regular activities of the department include: Conducting workshops on various subjects, Encouraging students to do research projects under the guidance of faculty members, Field trips, Conducting conferences on various theme, Conducting add-on courses for skill enhancement, Organising several talks by eminent scientists, Involving our alumni students to guide the students for higher studies and research and Conducting several academic and nonacademic competitions in science fest.





Activities in 2020-2021

Albatross, the departmental society is involved in conducting several academic and co-scholastic activities for the students.

The Department continued its spirit during this COVID era and hosted various events through online platforms. We organised a webinar on "Immunology of COVID - 19" by Dr. Sathyajit Rath, Faculty, IISER, Pune on 5th August, 2020, which was also live streamed on YouTube. Online "3rd hands-on workshop on Bioinformatics" was organised by Dr. Smriti Sharma, Dr. Shivani Tyagi and Dr. M. The student union elections were conducted online on 23 October 2020 and 23 January 2021 respectively for various Zoological Society posts. An inaugural lecture was held on 29 January 2021 on the topic 'Cancer: Disease and Drug development' by Dr. M Rizvi, Professor, Department of Biosciences, Jamia Millia Islamia. We had an online student gathering to welcome the first-year students on 14 January 2021. Doodle Wars, a doodling competition was conducted on the theme 'Nature in Lockdown: a breath of fresh air' on 12th February 2021, to celebrate Darwin's day. 'Interaction with Alumni', a Career Counselling session with our alumni, Ms. Aishwarya, Ms. Rashi Dixit and Ms. Syeda Fatima, was organised on 25th February, 2021 to give an insight about higher studies in India and abroad. On 5th March 2021, an online Inter college Debate competition on the topic 'Should science try to revive extinct or endangered species?' was conducted where students from different colleges of the university participated and put forward their unique thoughts on the topic. Through these various departmental activities, students are nurtured and empowered to become independent thinkers and doers upholding the spirit of Gargi.

1 A. Programme

B. A. Programme with its interdisciplinary structure and opportunities is one of the most sought-after courses for students who wish to explore different academic subjects while learning about their mutual connections. This course is definitely meant for students who wish to chart their own unique paths. The

B.A. Programme course which is being offered by the University of Delhi is extremely flexible as students are introduced to diverse subjects that are interdisciplinary in nature.

Subjects in B.A. Programme are relevant to the immediate context of academic opportunities and offer intellectual skills expected of a programme pertaining to higher education. Students can choose from an array of subjects, explore new and interesting courses and, at the same time, can plan to do a Master's programme in any of the discipline subjects offered. This course provides the students enough knowledge about a discipline to pursue postgraduate studies. It is perceived both as a terminal degree with substantial intellectual stimulation and as an enabling degree for further studies. It is a course that opens up various avenues and a promising range of opportunities after graduation. Gargi College offers a wide range of subject combinations over the 6 semesters.

DSE - Discipline Specific Elective, to be in the same disciplines studied as Disciplines 1 and 2 in the previous semesters.

GE - Generic Elective is an elective interdisciplinary paper which is chosen from a subject other than the main disciplines/subjects being opted for.

In B.A. Programme, you need to remember:

- Each student will have to study minimum 4 papers in each semester.
- English and Hindi are compulsory language papers for all students.
- Students who have scored 80% and above in English in Class XII will study the English Language through Literature Paper.
- Students who have scored 60% and above up to 80% will study the English Fluency Paper.
- Students who have scored less than 60% will study the English Proficiency Paper.
- Students who have studied English till Class X will study English B
- Students who have studied Hindi till Class XII will study Hindi A
- Students who have studied Hindi till Class X will study Hindi B
- Students who have studied Hindi till Class VIII will study Hindi C
- In case a student has not studied Hindi in school up till class VIII, she will have the option of studying papers in Philosophy in lieu of Hindi. Students who take the combination of Discipline English and German will also be studying papers in Philosophy in lieu of Hindi. Students who wish to opt for this alternative will have to bring the necessary supporting documents.
- Each student has to choose 2 Discipline papers which cannot be changed during the course of 3 years as per rules of the University of Delhi. The students must pursue the same combination in all the three years.
- Seats in each Discipline are limited.
- Courses/Papers will not be offered if the total number of students opting for a particular course/paper is less than 10.
- No prior knowledge of German is required to opt for German as a Discipline course.
- You may choose a different SEC and GE course option in each subsequent semester that is you can opt for courses being offered by different departments of the college.
- Students opting for mathematics should have compulsorily studied and passed mathematics till class XII.

specialise in a subject of their choice at the Master's level.

The B.Sc. Programme students have an association named **Zenith** which organises a number of academic and extra-curricular activities throughout the year. Zenith started its annual magazine INFINITUS in the session 2018-19. The magazine is an amalgamation of like yet unique minds for promoting, sharing and expanding knowledge through team work, peer learning and peer evaluation. The combination of Biotechnology & Bioinformatics has a wide range of industrial applications especially in the crucial field of drug development, targeting and drug-molecule interactions. The course offers highend bioinformatics tools and applications that have direct applications in the field of day-to-day research. This course, therefore, through rigorous training, prepares the students who are seeking higher academic degrees, research and industrial opportunities. At the end of the course, the students should be able to not only comprehend the basic as well as advanced laboratory research tools and techniques, but also perform them.)

Bioinformatics - Tools and Applications

Coordinators: Dr. M. Divya Gnaneswari & Dr. Chaitali Ghosh

Bioinformatics is an important component of Molecular Biology and Genomics Research. This field of study has a huge impact on the fields of Biomedical and Biotechnology Research. It is essential for the biologists to get familiar with the biological databases through which one can access genomics data to tackle new challenges in this 'omics' era. The objective of this course is to introduce students to basic computational tools necessary for the genomics research.

The basic bioinformatics areas like biological databases, sequence alignment, molecular phylogenetics and structural bioinformatics will be dealt with, in this add-on course. This will help the students to gain knowledge of the basic principles of bioinformatics. The course has both theory and practical components as given in Delhi University syllabus with some additional topics. All the speakers for the course will be experts in this discipline working in esteemed institutes like, IIT, JNU, DU as well as from abroad.

out-of-house workshop by Ankon Mitra on origami and Ravi Rao on basic sketching and human anatomy.







Q.E.D - The English Debating Society



Teacher Convenor: Ms. Aparna Joshi, Department of Elementary Education



Achievements:


Over the course of the year, Quizzito has continued to bring many laurels to the College.

AVNI: The Eco Club was established with the aim of creating green consciousness and generating sensitivity towards environmental causes, among students. It works towards understanding these issues deeply and implementing sustainable solutions at the individual and community levels.



have organised enabling unit fests that in the very structuring of the student activities have challenged the philosophy of ableism and meritocracy that creates structural competition in society. The student activities like poemages, reflective writings, weaving tales, painting, cartoons have been organised in a collaborative format that affirms the creativity and vision of each students rather than privileging some over the others. We have found that this reflective sharing is very successful even without external motivation of big prize money and encouraged intrinsic motivation. We have organised film screenings, panel discussions, lectures on issues related to disability, like sexuality, gender, art-for disability and challenging ableism which have helped students discuss and celebrate diversity in atmosphere of openness and mutual listening.

Enactus Gargi

Teacher Convenor: Dr. Sheela Dubey, Department of Commerce



Established in 2013, Enactus Gargi is the member branch of the International Non-Profit Organization Enactus. Currently, the team is running four projects: Rachna, Aagah, Neev, and Vikas. Undaunted by the pandemic, the society has attained new milestones with the support of our Principal, Dr Promila Kumar, and our faculty advisors, Dr Sheela Dubey and Dr Payal Jain. It became one of the Top 8 teams to receive Walmart's mentorship. It

won the Best Collaborative Entry Award for Project Vikas, obtaining an initial seedfunding of INR 5,000 under the Ideas for Impact Contest. For the first time, Enactus Gargi bagged the KPMG Business Ethics Grant 2020 of INR 50,000 to provide infrastructural and visual media aid (installation of LED TV for sign language training and skill development) to specially-abled beneficiaries of Project Rachna.



The team showcased its flagship Project Rachna and Project Neev in Enactus India Online Convention and National Competition 2020. This year, the team launched a virtual mental therapy platform ViMeT under Project Aagah and Project Vikas' website: www.enactusgargivikas.com. A panel discussion on 'Digital India: COVID-19's Silver Lining' and a Personal Branding webinar were conducted for the website launch. Throughout the year, workshops and webinars on macrame (sustainable product design), menstrual hygiene, mental health, Rethinking the Future of Plastics and a Fundraiser Workshop with The Parley Project were conducted.



As an advocate of sustainability, the team partnered with Sargam Sweets, a Delhi-NCR based outlet, under Project Neev to replace plastic cups with kulhads.

Enactus Gargi concluded the session 2020-21 with the release of its Annual Newsletter *EnVision* and a virtual session under PRISM 2021, comprising of a key-note address by Mr. Terry Torok, Chief Innovation Officer, Enactus, on the Art of Storytelling in Social Entrepreneurial Ventures, and an art exhibition of Tikuli Art and Virsa Women's craft represented by Mr. Ashok Biswas and Mr. Varinder Kaur Singh respectively.

The society commenced the session 2021-22 on a high note with recognition from the Hindustan Times, as the leading daily published an article lauding its' efforts in managing post-consumer textile waste whilst generating employment for women with hearing impairment. As a part of its Virtual mental therapy initiative, it also conducted a workshop on 'How to deal with stress and anxiety during exams' with Psychotherapist Ms. Shreya Jain to aid aspirants grappling with uncertainty.

Equal Opportunity Cell

Teacher Convenor: Dr. Sweta Mishra, Department of Political Science



The equal opportunity cell of the college, set up in 2010, is a multidisciplinary group which undertakes many activities with the objective of sensitizing the students regarding the challenges faced by the disadvantaged groups of the society. The cell is committed to provide an equal platform to every student and to specifically cater to the requirements of physically challenged students of the college. The cell addresses the issues of access and equality.

Purpose of the Cell: To empower the differently abled students by providing them an enabling environment to help them overcome their problems and realize their potential; and

Capacity building of the students through the various programmes of the cell which helps them to understand different perspectives related to issues of equity, justice and inclusion.

Activities of the Cell

Keeping the above objective in mind, the EOC organises various activities like -Lecture series; Provides active support to the differently abled students of the college in terms of dissemination of relevant information from the University and other institutes and assistance in arranging writers for the examination; Organises intercollege fest with events like poster making, singing, dance, creative



writing and rangoli making for the differently abled students; and mentoring of the students admitted under the PH category.

Activities during 2020-2021:

This year the EOC organised an online talk by Prof Ashwini Deshpande, Professor of Economics, Ashoka University on the topic "Gender Inequalities in the times of Covid-19" on 24th March, 2021. The discussion encompassed topics such as how Covid-19 was not a leveller as it was thought to be, how gender gaps widened, women at the greater risk of losing jobs, facing double pressure and burden, right time for the government to bring changes in policies keeping gender inequality in focus. The session was engaging, thought provoking and enjoyable. The audience raised several questions on the theme.

Gandhi Study Circle



Unmukti, The Women's Development Centre

Gargi is a college named after an extremely courageous and accomplished woman, unafraid to ask troubling questions. Unmukti, the Women's Development Centre (WDC), is a space that strives to give contemporary young women a chance to honour their potential to grow up free, fearless and dignified. Our college's WDC is a vibrant forum for the undergraduate student to think about, talk about and act upon gender and sexuality based inequality and violence, which remain a stubborn and disturbing fact of our everyday lives. The services provided by the WDC are available to all members of the Gargi student community, but students are also welcome to take up membership in

the core team and participate in 60 hours of activities, spanning workshops, seminars, talks, debates and discussions, and field trips. All our activities engage with the gendered nature of a range of issues, be they legal, economic, social or cultural.

Our focus is to provide academic opportunities and skills-development along a variety of planes. We empower students to learn how to tackle everyday physical harassment, for example, through the Self-Defence training we provide in collaboration with other organisations including the Delhi Police. We conduct intensive skill-building workshops on subjects like child abuse, surviving gender-based violence and abuse, police procedure, legal redress so that students become more resourceful when faced with these challenges.

Our Outstation Students Cell offers support to students who come from outside Delhi - a major chunk of the corporate body of the college - including guidebooks on the city of Delhi, resources on paying guest accommodation/hostels, healthcare facilities and the like. In addition, we also run a sanitary napkin vending service on a cost-to-cost basis, as well as a day-care facility for the children of any member of the college needing such services.

The Centre organises, besides its annual festival, add-on/certificate courses and workshops/trainings and internships which provide academic opportunities beyond coursework. Our action-based research projects, such as our *Safety Audit* of the immediate zones of/around college, lead to publishable writing for student participants besides helping to change things in the worlds they move through for the better. We also encourage students to take up summer and winter internships in collaboration with NGOs to enable students to gain co-curricular skills that stand them in good stead in future personal and professional ventures including higher education in gender-core programmes. Unmukti invites students to join to make the most of their opportunity to make change, be it ever so small, in an unequally gendered world.

All our student work is conducted through a diverse and heterogeneous team of "Gender Champions," elected office bearers from each department, who organise and conceptualise specific activities for sensitisation and mainstreaming of gender-based equality under the supervision and mentorship of the teachers' committee. This is a prestigious and important position available to students and we hope many of you prospective students will consider taking it up. We look forward to another lively and inspiring year of Unmukti!

The Placement Cell of Gargi College aims at making the students industry-ready with practical applications along with academic knowledge. It attempts to do this through providing opportunities for internship to gain hands-on knowledge and through getting exposed to patterns of work in industry; to gain an insight into the expectations of industry. A total of 157 companies such as Deloitte USI, KPMG, EY GDS, D.E. Shaw, Accenture, Price Waterhouse Coopers UK, BD India, Protiviti India hired in 2020-21. The highest package has been 21.25 LPA offered by D.E Shaw Group, a global investment and technology development firm followed by Nation with Namo and BD India. 361 organisations provided internship opportunities to the students.

Some of them were Zomato Feeding India, Lido Learning, Hindustan Times, Bajaj Capital, Nation with Namo, and eigo Paathshala. Articleship opportunities were also offered to the final year and alumni batches from companies like SP Chopra & Co., Mahesh Bansal & Co. From providing opportunities to pursuing courses through Coursera, attending workshops to organising the First Internship Fair virtually,

Our students have continuously striven to bring laurels to the college by being one of the top 5 teams in the Graduate School Maverick Program by Deloitte, making it to the top 20 in EY GDS's Young Tax Professional of the Year. We groom the students by providing them training to crack personal interviews, group discussions and enhance their knowledge with the help of various initiatives. *Race to Ace*, our first initiative, was aimed at guiding the students to make the best use of their college years productively. *Mind Scribble* 2.0, the second version of our WhatsApp initiative was planned to enhance the knowledge set of students.

We provide a platform for our team members to work in a group by developing Standard Operating Procedures, setting targets and analysing them. A member of placement cell not only gains exposure and insights into the working of corporate world but also learns how to do quality research, sequence out logical thought processes and give out quality deliverables. We look forward to welcome the new batch into our fold.

Infrastracture and Facilities

Auditorium

The college boasts of having its own state-of-the-art auditorium: the meridian of architectural finesse, with a seating capacity of 750 spread over the main floor and the mezzanine. The airy, spacious portico endowed with natural daylight and furnished with tables and chairs serves as a quiet place for conducting tutorial classes. The auditorium block is fully air-conditioned and equipped with solar lighting installations.



Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility

Gargi College is one of the two colleges and the only Women's college in University of Delhi to have BIF (funded by DBT with a yearly grant for maintenance and allied expenses). Undergraduate students from any discipline of Science can implement bioinformatics projects with guidance from faculty.

Bookshop

A well-stocked bookshop offering attractive discounts is stocked with the curriculum books for various courses as well as with stationery products. It is located on the passageway to the library.



Computer Laboratories

Computers have become an indispensably essential part of the undergraduate college curricula with the introduction of a variety of revised and restructured courses. The three computer laboratories in the college consisting of 110 computers with Wi-Fi connectivity provide students with an opportunity for hands-on training and enhancing their computing skills. The laboratories are also available for career-intensive education after regular class hours.



Food Court

The Food Court, the students' favourite hangout, is where the action is. With lots of yummy food offered at reasonable prices, this is a place where students from all streams meet, interact and confabulate over steaming cups of tea/coffee. Cold drinks, fruit juice, spicy chaat, crispy spring-rolls, delicious idli, vada, dosa, mouth-watering pastries, cakes, burgers, patties, samosas and bread pakoras are among the



various food items on offer. A water harvesting system has been installed in the canteen area. The canteen has been renovated and extended with the construction of an additional food outlet: Happiness Corner!!! A Nescafé kiosk is also posited in the precincts of the cafeteria.

Laboratories - Science/Elementary Education/Psychology

The Botany, Chemistry, Elementary Education, Microbiology, Physics, Psychology and Zoology laboratories are not only spacious and well-ventilated but also very well-equipped with the latest equipment and other academic resources. Working in any of these laboratories is a pleasurable experience. There are separate research laboratories for Botany and Physics Departments where research is being conducted by the faculty members.

Learning Resource Centre

WEBOPAC and facility of UGC INFLIBNET and access to DU Library Catalogue continued during the year. Gargi College Library website http://www.gargicolglibrary.webs.com and online use of e-resources increased during the year for easy understanding and online access to Library resources and facilities. 617 books were added till March, 2018 making total of 74027 accessioned books in all. At present the library has an asset of 217 CDs and subscribes to 51



periodicals and 10 newspapers. Electronic Resource Management package for e-resources: User control provided by NLIST. The library subscribes to a large number of Electronics Resources through UGC-Infosnet which includes e-resources (6,000+ e Journals and 31, 35,000+ e-books) and University of Delhi connectivity which includes Delhi University Library System. It includes the Reference Sources, Bibliographic Sources, Statistical Sources, and Full Text Sources. A brief description of these under given resources including the Subject Coverage, Search Features, Database Services, Document Category, etc. are available through more information for the help of users. Medical Room

The Medical facility is available to students during college hours. There is a medical room with a trained nurse for providing basic first aid to the students. Besides, students can also get their health check-up done. Regular medical and dental check-ups are conducted in the college by qualified medical professionals.



Open Air Theatre

A new open-air stage has been recently constructed behind the office block with sufficient seating provision for the audience in the form of adjoining steps and a lush green lawn at its centre. This would serve as an open-air platform for students for various events and especially for Street Plays and other such open air events.

Seminar Hall

Adjoining the auditorium is a splendiferous seminar hall with a seating capacity of 125. It is equipped with latest audio-visual equipment and is utilised for hosting various academic events.



Students' Common Room: 'Retreat'

Located near the cafeteria, the students' common room, 'Retreat' is a place where students can unwind, chitchat with friends and interact with seniors. It helps them learn about the college life and get familiar with their campus, which is their second home for three years. Students' very own space in college. Retreat always has its doors open for all students.



Students' Union Room

The Students' Council of Gargi College is a step towards instilling the values of democracy among students. The General Body elects a new council each year which is of the students, for the students, by the students. The Students' Union Room is the 'Head Quarters' from where the decisions made by the collective students' body are executed - from weekly cultural events to departmental festivals and the gala college festival: Reverie. The Students' Union Room is not just a space for a selected few; rather it is an open platform for all students to express their views and ideas.



Research Projects for Students

The Gargi Pathfinder Award

The Gargi Pathfinder Award in the streams: Science, Commerce and Humanities has been instituted, to encourage research and innovation among our students. Contestants have to submit an original project guided and certified by a faculty supervisor and supplemented with an audio - visual presentation to a panel of external judges, followed by a viva-voce. This Award is to promote originality and encourage the innovative spirit amongst undergraduate students. The students of the three streams put forward their ideas and after stringent selection are encouraged to research on their topics. The award comes with a cash cum certificate award, one each in Humanities, Commerce and Sciences. As individuals or in teams, contestants can present original research on significant issue, innovative business proposals or new scientific experiments. Details are continuously updated on the college website.

Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility (BIF)

Gargi College is one of the two colleges and the only Women's college in the University of Delhi to have BIF. It is funded by Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India since 2008, with an annual grant for maintenance, manpower, training and other allied expenses. This facility enables undergraduate students from all science courses to do bioinformatics projects beyond their curriculum. These projects often lead to presentation of research work in national and international conferences which is rewarding and very motivating for the students. Implementation of interdisciplinary as well as multidisciplinary projects is especially encouraged. Under the BIF programme, workshops are conducted for students as well as faculty members to keep them updated about the advances made in this field. Besides undergraduate students, the facility also has post graduate students, trainees and Research Associates who contribute towards research publications. Gargi College BIF was adjudged amongst the top five BIFs of undergraduate colleges, based on research publications.

Awards of Excellence

Gargi College provides innumerable opportunities to students to excel both in academic as well as extracurricular activities. It is our constant endeavour to help students acquire various skills, confidence, and the experience that will be on their side as they embark upon their varied careers after graduating from our college. On Annual Day each year, we acknowledge the achievements of students through prizes and scholarships.

The following are the prestigious awards and scholarships that students compete and aspire for:

The Best All Rounder Awards

The most prestigious awards, the Best All Rounder Awards, are conferred in each of the three streams namely, Dr. Chhaya Biswas Best All Rounder Award – Science; Dr. Meera Ramachandran Best All Rounder Award – Humanities; and Smt. Lajwanti Malik Memorial Best All Rounder Award – Commerce. These are highly coveted awards for the students that acknowledge and recognise academic excellence, aptitude for research, active participation in sports/extra-curricular activities, and significant contribution to college life as a whole. All final year students of the college are eligible to apply for this award through their respective departments. There is screening at various levels to select the most deserving candidates. The final decision is taken by a duly constituted committee for the same.

- The Best All Rounder Award (Science) is presented to a final year under-graduate student who is adjudged the best all-rounder among the departments of Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Microbiology, Physics, Zoology, B.Sc. Life Science, and B.Sc. Physical Science.
- The Best All Rounder Award (Humanities) is presented to a final year under-graduate student who is adjudged the best all-rounder among the departments of BA Programme, Business Economics, Economics, Elementary Education, English, Hindi, History, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, and Sanskrit.
- The Best All Rounder Award (Commerce) is presented to a final year under-graduate student who is adjudged the best all-rounder among all students of B.Com Honours and B.Com Programme.

The Long Strider Award

Dr. Hema V. Raghavan Long Strider Award is given to illustrious alumnae of this college who have displayed commendable excellence in their respective fields within ten years following their graduation from Gargi College. The award recognises the meaningful social commitment and potential for invigorating research that the candidate has achieved in this period, along with academic/research excellence.

The Gargi Pathfinder Award

The Gargi Pathfinder Award, instituted by the college, incentivises original research carried out by students under the mentorship of faculty members of the college. As individuals or in teams, contestants present original research projects that then go through an intensive screening process with the

involvement of external judges. The students carry out research on significant social issues, innovative business proposals, or new scientific experiments. These are supplemented with presentations in other media, such as Power Point, film, or artistic production before a panel of judges. This is followed by viva voce and the declaration of the results. This award is given in each of the three streams namely, Humanities, Commerce and Science. This award is open to all under-graduate students of the college.

Awards for Academics

Students who secure the highest aggregate in each class are given certificates and prizes for their academic excellence. There are several disciplines where academic cash awards and scholarships for meritorious students have been instituted by illustrious donors. In other cases, they receive Gargi College Award for Excellence and a cash award.


