
#### UPSTAGE – The Dramatics Society


Gandhi Study Circle of Gargi College is a prominent cell not only among all the societies of the college but also of the entire University of Delhi. The circle's activities commemorated with Gandhi Jayanti celebration on September, 2016 by a talk by **Dr. Satish Misra**, Senior Fellow, Observer Research Foundation, on "Relevance of Gandhi Today". Dr. Misra drew upon the current social, political and economic trends that are reflecting increasing disharmony, exploitation and oppression of the poor and marginalised sections of society. He cited several instances from his field experiences as well as his long journalistic career to highlight that at the present historical juncture our society has more divisions than ever before. As our stratified society has overlapping rather than crosscutting social differentials the Gandhian values of truth, simplicity, Swaraj, economic self-reliance, cottage industry and non-violence provide an economic philosophy that can strive to build an inclusive nation. This makes Gandhian teachings more relevant than ever before.

The study circle had its Annual Fest on 6<sup>th</sup> March, 2018. The Fest comprised of a talk on "Gandhi and Social Peace" which was delivered by **Prof. P.K. Dutta**, Centre for Political Theory and Comparative Politics, JNU. With his vast study of Gandhian life, ideology and teachings he regaled the audience with several inspiring nuggets from the Mahatma's life. He discussed how several symbols associated with Gandhi ji were politically appropriated and mis-appropriated by various political dispensations. Satyagraha is Gandhi ji's lasting legacy, an art he had perfected. This can provide a potent tool to today's youth adding to their inner strength in a world that is torn apart by conflict, violence and injustice.

UNMUKTI, the Women's Development Centre, Gargi College, imagines a world free of discrimination and violence for our students.

This year, we introduced a weekly open-house discussion, called Feminist Fridays, a forum for students to consider themes of relevance to them: students intensively research subjects under the guidance of teachers, and then lead the house through an intensive discussion.

We screen and discuss Indian-made documentary films from our specially developed collection, this year's screenings including "Nirnay," and "Morality TV and the Loving Jehad". In addition, we conducted a film festival with Kashish Forward, of specially curated films in the theme of sexuality from all over the world, with Ms. Tanvi Talwar, young documentary film-maker and designer helping students understand the politics of representation.



Creative art inspires us. To this end, we invited Sukhmanch Theatre's "A Woman Alone" and "Seven Steps around the Fire", which played to packed houses, with the discussion with Director and company founder **Ms. Shilpi Marwaha** including questions about the social constructed nature of femininity and masculinity and about the importance of adapting materials from other cultures into Hindi to deal with issues intersectionally.

This Women's Day our annual fest on "safety" examined how discourses of the digital era are changing the fraught relationship with safety, and by extension, autonomy for persons/bodies marked as feminine. We talked of how to delink discourses of morality from discourses of safety in our panel discussion which noted that gender-based

violence and discrimination can end if India's adolescent population of 250mn+ has more say in three questions: what to wear, who to love, and what to do with their lives. 



महाप्रबंधक हैं, परन्तु अध्ययन अध्यापन की मुख्य धारा में न होकर भी साहित्य में इनका योगदान यह प्रदर्शित करता है कि यदि व्यक्ति साहित्य प्रेमी हैं तो वह साहित्य को अपने जीवन का आभूषण बना सकता है। साथ ही दूसरे वक्ता रहे çkûs j i jupa Valu t ḥ जो दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय हिंदी विभाग में कार्यरत हैं।

व्याख्यान के उपरांत दो अंतर महाविद्यालयीय प्रतियोगिताओं का आयोजन भी किया गया जिसमें प्रथम प्रतियोगिता थी –

काव्याभिव्यक्ति (स्वरचित कविता पाठ प्रतियोगिता) तथा दूसरी प्रतियोगिता थी सामूहिक चर्चा। विभिन्न महाविद्यालयों से छात्रों ने भारी संख्या में भाग लिया तथा दोनों प्रतियोगिताओं में सर्वश्रेष्ठ तीन प्रतिभागी को विजेता घोषित किया गया तथा उन्हें प्रशस्ति पत्र एवं धन राशि देकर पुरस्कृत किया गया।

यूनेस्को ने 21 फरवरी को अंतरराष्ट्रीय मातृभाषा दिवस घोषित किया है जिसका मुख्य उद्देश्य विश्व में आपसी भाईचारे को बढ़ाने व संस्कृति के आदान प्रदान में भाषाओं के योगदान तथा उनके विकास की ओर कदम बढ़ाना है। इसी उद्देश्य को ध्यान में रखते हुए परिषद् द्वारा 'कार्यशाला' का आयोजन कराया गया जिसका विषय था— "नागरी लिपि तथा हिन्दी प्रशिक्षण।" इस विषय को चुनने के पीछे मकसद था कि आज के इस वैज्ञानिक युग में जहाँ सभी भाषाएँ तथा उनकी लिपियाँ तकनीकी रूप से भी समृद्ध हो रहीं हैं वहीं हमारी राजभाषा हिंदी तथा उसकी लिपि देवनागरी भी किसी से पीछे नहीं है। कंप्यूटर, मोबाइल इत्यादि जैसे उपकरणों में भी देवनागरी लिपि से संबंधित नए सॉफ्टवेयर विकसित किए जा चुकें हैं और वह आसानी से प्रयोग किए जा सकते हैं परंतु इन जानकारियों से बहुत कम लोग ही अवगत हो सकें हैं जिससे यह भाषा अब भी तकनीक के स्तर से दुरुह बनी हुई है जिससे कहीं न कहीं इस भाषा के विकास का पथ बाधित हो रहा है तथा यह कार्यशाला इसी बाधा के निवारण हेतु आयोजित की गई।

कार्यशाला के प्रशिक्षक थे— Jh'; ke l thi d Fkly, kth, जो वर्तमान में कर्मचारी राज्य बीमा निगम श्रम और रोजगार मंत्रालय (भारत सरकार) में उपनिदेशक राजभाषा के पद पर प्रतिष्ठित हैं तथा नागरी लिप परिषद् (रिज०) हिंदी सेवी गैर सरकारी संस्थान के egkeæhl/- gfj fl g i ky और eæhvkpk, Zvks çdkkthभी इस कार्यशाला में मौजूद थे। श्री कथूरिया ने पी.पी.टी पॉवर प्वाइंट प्रेजेंटेशन के माध्यम से छात्राओं को विभिन्न ई—टूल्स अर्थात इलेक्ट्रॉनिक टूल्स से अवगत कराया जो राजभाषा विभाग के वेबसाइट पर आसानी से उपलब्ध हैं तथा हिंदी टाइपिंग में सहायक है और साथ ही बताया कि किस प्रकार से व्याकरणिक त्रुटियों से भी बचा जा सकता है परन्तु सचेत किया कि कोई भी तकनीक पूर्ण रुप से विश्वसनीय नहीं है। इस प्रकार से देवनागरी लिपि भी तकनीकी सहयोगी है, दूसरे शब्दों में कहें तो हिंदी भी 'टेक्नो फ्रेंडली' भाषा है।



## Alumnae Association: Manaswani



Enactus is an international non-profit organization dedicated to inspiring students to improve the world through entrepreneurial action. Our work transforms both the lives of the people we serve, and in turn, the lives of our students as they develop into more effective, value-driven leaders. We believe investing in students who take entrepreneurial action for others and create a better world for us all.

Since the beginning of the year 2017-18, Enactus Gargi has been working on giving shape to two projects: Rachna and Udayachal. In order to diversify these projects students did extensive research,

communities from July to December. During this time **project Rachna** was initiated in a new community at Jharsa, Haryana. At Jharsa, we have collaborated with an NGO named Eco Lib and adopted a group of 15 underprivileged women. Under this project, we train the women to design and create hand-made utility products and help them earn a sustainable livelihood from it. They train and help the women to market the products as well. Members displayed these products at various events such as Zistatva, Reverie, Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies fest, Ernst and Young-Gurgaon etc.

The second project Udayachal deals with the production and marketing of low cost sanitary napkins. It was incepted to provide another group of women a source of livelihood and work towards eliminating the problems of ill menstrual hygiene and health hazards. From July till December, we surveyed around 300 households each in various communities like Bandhwari, Kaushambi, Jharsa, Hapur etc., and organized awareness workshops on mensural hygiene and distributed free sanitary napkins to the women in these communities. Apart from our members a group of 50 students volunteered from college helped us in this campaign.

A two-day Wash Conclave on Water, Sanitation and Hygiene organised by Sulabh International in collaboration with UNICEF was held on 18<sup>th</sup> -19<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. Our members were selected to perform a flash mob and help them as volunteers in the coordination of the conclave. The students were appreciated and awarded certificates by **Dr. Bindeshwar Pathak**, founder of Sulabh International. During the same event, our faculty advisors **Ms. Shikha Mahajan**, **Ms. Tanjot Singh** and **Ms. Gunjan Fialok** attended as well as judged two events at the Wash Conclave on 19<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 at the Mavalankar Hall, New Delhi.



# The Butterflies of Personality

#### "Personality is to a man what perfume is to a flower." - Charles M. Schwab

Every day, on an average, 33,500 babies are born all over the world. An estimated 7.6 billion people currently make up the global population. Each growing child, every person on the planet has a unique personality defined by a plethora of varying traits: some recurrent, some rare. It is commonly believed that the upbringing of children in their immediate surroundings is what nurtures their personalities. If we dig a little deeper to satiate our curiosity regarding the same, we come across some interesting factors which are equal parts ridiculous and inconceivable. They are, however, scientifically proven and carry truth.

Psychologically, personality of a person is determined by four major determinants which affect an individual throughout his/her life span, namely-biological, cultural, family and situational. These are the factors which come to mind while thinking logically about personality development. There are, however, some seemingly insignificant factors which cause a butterfly effect and influence a greater scheme of things.

One such factor is 'birth order', a rather strange component of personality development which received coverage even from The Huffington Post. Researchers say that the firstborn of a family is the most enigmatic and intelligent. The personality of a firstborn is characteristically considered confident and dominant, with a nurturing attitude due to the presence of a younger sibling. The second child is considered to be adjusting and flexible, with qualities of an introvert and a third sibling is usually frivolous and full of excitement, with a love for dynamism. The third one believes in living life to the fullest. Contrary to these, a single child is considered more understanding as well as more sharp in terms of intelligence.

Age is another factor which dynamically affects the personality of an individual throughout life. As one grows, one loses the chirpiness and innocence of childhood and ages into someone who cherishes little movement and indoor life, contrary to kids who loved the outdoors. It is a gradual process based on the changes people undergo between the ages of 10 and 65. In 1961, Ernest Tupes and Raymond Christal introduced the idea of The Big Five- a research-based theory which incorporated factor analysis to define personalities based on openness to experience, conscientiousness, extraversion, agreeableness and neuroticism. It is the changes in these five components which lead our personalities as we grow.

Another factor is astrology's claim that the date of birth affects the personality of a child. This bears truth as well, though not astrologically. Nursery admissions in schools consider children of over 3 years of age born up till August. This gives the children born in September, October, November and December the advantage of almost one year. Due to a higher level of brain growth, these children often do comparatively better in school, which boosts their morale and fuels the motivation to do better throughout life.

Diet is another factor considered highly relevant, affects personality through physical health. This mostly has to do with hormones. Higher testosterone levels make a person quick-tempered and irritated. Serotonin, on the other hand, is a happiness hormone secreted by the brain which is believed to even cure cancer. These hormonal levels are mainly affected by what we eat. A healthy and hygienic diet, along with a good fitness regime increases the levels of dopamine and serotonin and makes the person feel positive. It is worth mentioning that the effects of testosterone answer several mysteries of the differences between the attitudes of different genders.

All the factors mentioned above seem rather bizarre in relation to their effects on personality and they might as well be a Jim Carrey speculation. But the fact that the 'name' of a person or the 'sound' of a word affects someone's personality has to be the showstopper. This happens due to hearing synesthesia. Certain arrangements of letters and the sounds they produce generate involuntary feelings for that word, even if we don't know it's meaning. Consider the words "vitriolic" and "splenetic". Good for you if you know their meanings but if you don't, read them again and try to guess what they might be related to.

Our personality, now it seems, is a lot more out of our control than we would like it to be, though it is worth mentioning that these factors are not rigid at all. Exceptions are everywhere, but more relations can be found in accordance with how they truly affect our personality than in discordance with them. However, these factors are in no way a basis for judging someone, for these are not the only factors which make up a person's essence. 'To judge' anyone is an invitation to negativity that one should run in the opposite direction of. It is a malice which makes you, as well as those around you, vitriolic and splenetic. As has been repeatedly mentioned, personality development is highly dynamic. We are a different person every day and so is everyone else. Instead, we all should focus on increasing the dopamine and serotonin levels of our body and make the most of the little things which make us who we are. At an age where we girls should have eaten much and should have provided our bodies with the required nutrition, we starved ourselves to be the ideal beauty.

At an age when we girls should have only been concerned about our studies, our greatest fear or anxiety was to look good, look good and desirable before the male gaze.

Looking good was now equivalent to being desirable and being desirable was equivalent to our self-worth.

Advertising promotes that we as women need to look beautiful and we indeed have become slaves to it. We buy cosmetics as we feel the need to hide our imperfections. Kamla Bhasin points out how men don't feel the need to wear makeup but women do. And this I believe is a concept to ponder over, why is it that most men feel comfortable in their skins while we women are conditioned to look a certain way to be called beautiful.

Naomi Wolf in her book The Beauty Myth argues that "Recent research consistently shows that inside the majority of the West's controlled, attractive, successful working women, there is a secret "underlife" poisoning our freedom; infused with notions of beauty, it is a dark vein of self-hatred, physical obsessions, terror of aging, and dread of lost control."

She further quotes that "In 1962, Betty Friedan quoted a young woman trapped in the Feminine Mystique: "Lately, I look in the mirror, and I'm so afraid I'm going to look like my mother."

And while a lot of women would argue that they wear makeup or go through plastic surgeries to feel good about themselves and not for men. Here's what their statement implies- when a woman goes through plastic surgeries or cosmetic procedures, while she thinks she's doing it to make her feel good about herself; in reality, it's the opposite. She is replacing a part of her which she thinks is imperfect or ugly with the perfect or ideal beauty and in the process, a silent message gets conveyed to her subconsciously that I am not beautiful and hence the need to beautify with makeup or surgeries. This really does more harm to a woman's self-esteem than the little superficial good it does to her.

And while I am not all against makeup as it can also be a creative way of expressing one's own self just as dressing up is. but, I certainly am against makeup that changes a woman's appearance to what her real appearance is not, to be more precise-fairness creams etc.

A woman will only feel good when she embraces her most authentic self when she finds perfection and beauty as she looks at the mirror and does not look for artificial treatments to what the society would like to label as ugliness.

Noami Wolf further states in her book that "women's identity must be premised upon our "beauty" so that we will remain vulnerable to outside approval, carrying the vital sensitive organ of self-esteem exposed to the air."

Recently, our Bollywood actress Sonam Kapoor came up with an article "I didn't wake up like this" where she busts the myth around flawlessness of celebrities. I quote her: "Today, at 31, I like my body because it's healthy. I'm done celebrating thinness or flawlessness... The ball is in the media's court to celebrate fit bodies rather than thin ones, and to know the difference.

I know now that there's nothing wrong with stretch marks, cellulite, or scars. They're markers of our growth. There's beauty in their realness. I've said it before, and I will keep saying it: It takes an army, a lot of money, and an incredible amount of time to make a female celebrity look the way she does when you see her. It isn't realistic, and it isn't anything to aspire to. Aspire to confidence. Aspire to feeling pretty and carefree and happy, without needing to look any specific way."

Kalki Koechlin's woMan-Logue speaks about the female desire to break free from the patriarchal chains of beauty myth as she very beautifully describes how she just wishes to be her authentic self. I quote her: "Sometimes I just want some oversized t-shirts, some boxer shorts, unkempt hair and a uni-brow, you know? I want armpit hair long enough to plait. I want a clean face without a trace of make-up. I wanna look the way I do when I wake up! I want to scratch my hair, dig my nose, lick my fingers, stretch my legs and spread my toes! I want to smile with my gums showing; bare my teeth, contort my pretty little into wrinkles. Yes, I want my wrinkles to look sexy!"

"I want to be George Clooney basically, but with breasts and a muffin"

I believe that the corset in our mind is suffocating us to the extent of not being able to question the irrationality of the 'beauty myth'.

This mental corset has restricted our thinking just as the physical restricts the growth of our bodies.

All these flourishing makeup industries and plastic surgeries I believe are a tricky political weapon to distract women from Performing and participating to their optimum capacities in the professional front. As for patriarchy, such a phenomenon of beauty only intends to benefit it from every angle, men would have 'beautiful' women around them to please themselves or amuse themselves with the barbies they wish to create out of women and on the other hand this insecurity of women occupying the public domain and professional domain also comes to the front here. Because if all women spend half their time dressing up and beautifying themselves they will not be able to give in their full potential to their work and hence the men would be more successful.

However, not every woman wishes to be a pawn in the game, but rather they are players and winners.

Delhi university's girls colleges had barred fairness creams and slimming belts from being their fest sponsors as they wished to promote a healthy body image. We have actresses coming out and speaking their minds and speaking of the reality of this 'beauty myth' which in itself is so ugly.

To all the wonderfully beautiful girls out there I want to tell you how beautiful you look when you shine with confidence as you embrace your most authentic self and shun this whole concept of beauty.

To the teenagers standing in front of the mirror for hours, I understand your concerns, I was there too. But can I tell you, there is no flaw in you, the flaw is in the society which is insistent on having 'rigid definitions of beauty' as Sonam Kapoor calls it.

Let us aspire to be our most authentic self, not Barbies.

## Book Review

## The Vegetarian by Han Kang

The book was written by Ms. Kang in 2007 and the marvelous English translation by Deborah Smith came out in 2015. Ms. Smith took the English translations to publishing houses in Britain and United States in 2015 and the book won the Man Booker International Prize in 2016. The book was inspired by Han Kang's short story 'The Fruit of My Woman', turned it into a three-part novella.

Han Kang explores multiple themes and looks at the society through a critical lens in each part of the book. The very title of the novel seems bland as well as interesting at the same time. The translation is done so beautifully that it resonates with its Korean parent, almost rhythmic and musical to the reader's ears. Yeong-Hye is the subject of the novel and not the protagonist, her story is told through the voices of her three family members and the reader is glued to the novel from the very first monologue by her husband, Mr. Cheong.

Yeong-Hye is a wife who conforms to all of her family and husband's demands, obliges to all her household duties, never questioning the structure. The reader doubts the very institution of marriage the couple are bound in, a mere societal compliance.

One night, Yeong-Hye is transported into a gory, bloody dream which turns her into a vegetarian the next morning. Neither her husband nor her family can stand this defiance. Her failed attempt at suicide and public nudity renders her divorced and at a psychiatric hospital.

The second part of the novel titled 'The Mongolian Mark' is from the voice of Yeong-Hye's brother-in-law who remains nameless throughout the novel. A casual remark by In-Hye, Yeong-Hye's sister, about her sister's Mongolian mark on her buttock leaves her husband obsessed with his sister-in-law, Yeong-Hye. He is a video artist and their relationship develops in this section. Yeong-Hye becomes obsessed about plants, flowers and leaves and becomes ready to have sex with her brother-in-law on tape. The reader cannot decipher whether she was in a sane state of mind or the act was an assault. The reader carries this doubt to the next part.

The third section titled 'Flaming Trees' is a rather slow-paced confession of In-Hye about both the sisters' childhood, her decisions in life and even her envy for her sister's current serene yet mindless situation. In-Hye takes the reader on a steadfast journey of childhood inhibitions, ambitions, abuse, decisions and the ability to distinguish between dreams and reality.

The very definition of turning vegetarian as a lifestyle option alters by this part of the novel in an unanticipated way. It straightforwardly emphasises on the consumption of meat, the violence attached to it and the insanity it can bring to one's mind.

This literary work stays with the reader like an experience, with new perspectives and questions left behind about dreams, reality, sanity and choices. The novella is a gripping tale of dark insights into the minds of two Korean women who do not wish to conform to societal norms any longer. The narrative has a feminist edge to it and the women emerge stronger, with the ability to reclaim their lives, reality, bodies and death.

इसके बाद प्राची बैंक की परीक्षा देती है। पहले प्रयास में सफल तो नहीं हो पाई लेकिन परीक्षा पैटर्न समझ गई। प्राची अपने लक्ष्य की ओर बढ़ती गई और अगली बार प्राची बैंक अधिकारी बनने में सफल हो जाती है। पिता जी की दी शिक्षा और अपने बुलंद हौसलों के कारण प्राची इस मुकाम पर पहुँची।

सोचों 65 की उम्र एक ऐसी उम्र जब लोग रिटायर होकर घर बैठ जाते हैं और दोबारा उठने से हार मान जाते हैं। उस उम्र में उन्होंने अपने चिकन प्रयोग के साथ ऐसा बिजनेस खड़ा कर दिया जो आज 123 देशों में है और लगभग 20,000 से ज्यादा ज्ञथ्ब के रेस्टोरेट्स हैं। इस दुनिया में कुछ भी नामुमकिन नहीं है, लेकिन अधिकतर लोग फिर भी अपने इरादे तोड़ देते हैं।

(ऑनर्स) हिन्दी — तृतीय वर्ष होली वसंत ऋतु में मनाया जाने वाला एक महत्वपूर्ण भारतीय और नेपाली लोगों का त्यौहार है। यह पर्व हिन्दू पंचाग के अनुसार फाल्गुन मास की पूर्णिमा मास की पूर्णिमा को मनाया जाता है। रंगों का त्यौहार कहा जाने वाला यह पर्व पारंपरिक रूप से वो दिन मनाया जाता है। यह पारंपरिक से भारत तथा नेपाल में मनाया जाता है। पहले दिन को होलिका जलायी जाती है, जिसे होलिका दहन भी कहते हैं। दूसरे दिन जिसे प्रमुखतः धुलेंड़ी व धुरड्ड़ी, धुरखेल या धूलिवंदन इसके अन्य नाम हैं। लोग एक—दूसरे पर रंग, अबीर—गुलाल इत्यादि फेंकते हैं, ढ़ोल बजाकर होली के गीत गाये जाते हैं और घर—घर जाकर लोगों को रंग लगाया जाता है।

राग—रंग का यह लोकप्रिय पर्व वसंत का त्यौहार संदेशवाहक भी है। राग अर्थात संगीत और रंग तो इसके प्रमुख अंग हैं ही पर इनको उत्कर्ष तक पहचानने वाली प्रकृति भी इस रंग—बिरंगे यौवन के साथ अपनी चरम अवस्था पर होती है। फाल्गुन माह में मनाये जाने के कारण इसे फाल्गुनी भी कहते हैं। होली का त्यौहार वसंत पंचमी से ही आरम्भ हो जाता है। उसी दिन पहली बार गुलाल उड़ाया जाता है। इस दिन से फाग और धमार का गाना प्रारम्भ हो जाता है। खेतों में सरसों खिल उठती है।

होली भारत का अत्यन्त प्राचीन पर्व है, जो होली, होलिका या होलाका नाम से मनाया जाता है। वसंत की ऋतु में हर्षोल्लास के साथ मनाए जाने के कारण इसे वसंतोत्सव और काम महोत्सव भी कहा गया है। होली के पर्व से अनेक कहानियाँ जुड़ी हुई हैं। इनमें से सबसे प्रसिद्ध कहानी है प्रहलाद की। माना जाता है कि प्राचीन काल में हिरण्यकिशपु नाम का एक अत्यंत बलशाली असुर था। वह स्वंय को ही ईश्वर मानने लगा था। उसने अपने राज्य में ईश्वर का नाम लेने पर ही पाबंदी लगा दी थी। उसका पुत्र प्रहलाद ईश्वर भक्त था। उसकी भित्त देखकर हिरण्यकिशपु ने उसे अनेक दंड दिए, परन्तु उसने ईश्वर की भित्त का मार्ग का मार्ग न छोड़ा। हिरण्यकिशपु की बहन आग में भरम नहीं हो सकती थी। उसने आदेश दिया कि होलिका प्रहलाद को गोद में लेकर आग में बैठे। आग में बैठने पर होलिका तो जल गई, पर प्रहलाद बच गया। ईश्वर भक्त प्रहलाद की याद में इस दिन होली जलाई जाती है।

भारत में होली का उत्सव अलग—अलग प्रदेशों में भिन्नता के साथ मनाया जाता है। ब्रज की होली आज भी सारे देश के आकर्षण का बिन्दु होती हैं। बरसाने की लठमार होली काफी प्रसिद्ध है। इसमें पुरूष महिलाओं पर रंग डालते हैं और महिलाएँ उन्हें लाठियों तथा कपड़े के बनाए गए कोड़ों से मारती हैं। हरियाणा की धुलंड़ी में भाभी द्वारा देवर को सताए जाने की प्रथा है। बंगाल की ढ़ोल यात्रा है। जलूस निकलते हैं और गाना बजाना भी साथ रहता है।

भारतीय शास्त्रीय, उपशास्त्रीय, लोक तथा फिल्मी संगीत की परंपराओं में होली का विशेष महत्व है। भारतीय फिल्मों के गीत प्रस्तुत किये गये हैं, जो काफी लोकप्रिय हैं जैसे – 'सिलसिला' के गीत रंग बरसे।

लोकप्रियता के प्रसार में सोशल मीडिया एक बेहतरीन प्लेटफॉर्म है,जहाँ व्यक्ति स्वयं को अथवा अपने किसी उत्पाद को लोकप्रिय बना सकता है। आज फिल्मों के ट्रेलर, टी.वी. प्रोग्राम का प्रसारण आदि सोशल मीडिया के माध्यम से किया जा सकता है। वीडियो तथा ऑडियो चैट है, जिसमें फेसबुक, व्हॉटसऐप, इंस्टाग्राम कुछ प्रमुख प्लेटफॉर्म हैं। सोशल मीडिया जहाँ सकारात्मक भूमिका अदा करता है वहीं कुछ लोग इसका गलत उपयोग करते हैं। इसके द्वारा गलत अफवाह, दुर्भावनाएँ, भाम्रक और नकारात्मक जानकारी भी साझा की जाती है। जिससे जनमानस पर प्रतिकूल प्रभाव पड़ता है।कई बार तो बात इतनी बढ़ जाती है कि सरकार सोशल मीडिया के गलत इस्तेमाल करने पर सख्त हो जाती है और हमने देखा है कई बार सरकार को जम्मू—कश्मीर जैसे राज्य में सोशल मीडिया पर प्रतिबंध तक लगाना पड़ता है।

जिस प्रकार एक सिक्के के दो पहलू होते हैं ठीक उसी प्रकार सोशल मीडिया के भी दो पक्ष हैं।

एक दिन मेरी दादी उस लड़की से मिलने गई तो उसकी सास ने मिलने से मना कर दिया, परन्तु फिर भी मेरी दादी उससे मिली। जब मेरी दादी ने देखा तो उनके होश उड़ गए। उस लड़की की हालत इतनी खराब थी कि उसके शरीर पर रस्सी के निशान बने हुए थे और उसे डॉक्टर के पास भी लेकर नहीं गए। उस लड़की से न कुछ खाया जा रहा था और न ही बोला जा रहा था।

एक घंटे पश्चात बस में कुछ हलचल महसूस हुई न जाने कैसी परेशानी थी। मेरी आँख खुली तो मेरे सामने मेरे अपनों की लाल, गुस्से वाला डरता हुआ और परेशान चेहरा था। यह सब देख कर मेरी नींद जैसे आँखों से ओझल हो गई। मैंने देखा बस एक पहाड़ी पर, सड़क के बीचोंबीच खड़ी थी। रात के करीब 2 बजे हमारी बस पहाड़ी रास्ते के बीच में खराब हो गई थी। जिसके कारण सब परेशान थे। यह सब देखने के पश्चात मेरी हालत भी कुछ वैसी ही हो गई थी जैसी बाकियों की थी। सबसे पूछने पर पता चला कि बड़ों (पापा, चाचा, भाई) ने बस से उतर कर मदद माँगने की कोशिश की। परन्तु कोई रूका ही नहीं। एक रूका तो उसने कहा — साहब जी यह इलाका बहुत खतरनाक है। आय दिन यहाँ नकसलियों की लूट होती है। जितना जल्दी हो सकता है, यहाँ से निकल जाओ। परन्तु 32 लोगों को जिनमें मेरी दादी, नानी भी थी जो चलने में असमर्थ थी। उनको लेकर पैदल कितना चलते हम। रात के 2 बज गये थे। खिड़की से बाहर देखने का साहस तक न होता था। लगता था जैसे कोई वहाँ से मुझे देख रहा है। डर के मारे सभी की हालत खराब थी। मुझे तो एहसास हो रहा था कि जैसे आज मेरा अंत हो जाएगा। कहते हैं ना जीवन की अंतिम घड़ी में अपने सारे पाप याद आ जाते हैं। उस समय मेरी हालत कुछ ऐसी ही थी। एक तरफ नकसलियों का डर तथा दूसरी तरफ अन्य गाड़ियों का सड़क पर से यूँ सनसनाते हुए जाना, मानो हमारी दिल की घड़कने बढ़ती जा रही थी।

संगीत भी यहाँ की संस्कृति का एक अंग है। मंगलगीत, बसन्ती खुदेड़ आदि यहाँ लोकप्रिय गीत हैं। ''बेडू पाको'' राज्य का अंतरराष्ट्रीय ख्याति प्राप्त एक प्राचीन लोक गीत है।

उत्तराखण्ड में एक मिली—जुली संस्कृति बसती है। जिसको यहाँ के निवासियों ने सर्वधर्म समभाव सिद्धान्तों को अपनाते हुए गलबद्ध किया है और अपनी लोक संस्कृति को इन्होंने लोकगीतों, लोककथाओं और लोकगाथाओं के माध्यम से संजोए रखा है।


